NRC to Hold Mandatory Hearing on Kairos Construction Permit Application

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission will conduct a <u>mandatory hearing</u> Oct. 19 on Kairos Power LLC's application for a construction permit to build a Hermes non-power test reactor in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. This hearing marks the final step in the agency's review of the application.

The Commission's hearing will include testimony and exhibits from the applicant, as well as NRC staff, on the question of whether the staff's review adequately supports the findings necessary to issue the permit. The hearing will begin at 9 a.m. Eastern time in the Commission Hearing Room at NRC Headquarters, 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville, Maryland. The hearing will be open to public observation and will be webcast. A detailed agenda and presentation slides will be available in advance on the NRC's website.

Kairos submitted its application to build the Hermes reactor in two parts in September and October 2021. Kairos is seeking a permit to build a 35-megawatt thermal reactor that would use molten salt to cool the reactor core. The test reactor, which will not generate electricity, is intended to provide operational data to support the development of a larger version for commercial power. The NRC would need to review and approve a future application from Kairos before an operating license for Hermes could be issued. The NRC issued its <u>final</u> environmental impact statement for the site on Aug. 17, 2023, and the <u>final safety evaluation</u> report for the permit on June 14, 2023.
