Response to Question 43:

Our release standards for solid material is taken from the regulation definition in Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 459.085 for "release for unrestricted use" and as implied in NRC Reg. Guide 1.86.

- a. Yes, we reserve the right to adopt standards that are more restrictive than NRC's.
- b. Control of something for restricted radiation use is applicable if radiation control standards would expose the general public or radiation workers in excess of applicable radiation exposure limits in NAC 459.
- c. "Jeopardize an orderly pattern" - a rather subjective concept. Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 439 (public health authority) and NRS 459 (radiation control authority) provide for comprehensive radiation control concepts within the state public health agency. We do not interpret that conflicts, duplications, gaps, etc." can occur in that the Nevada State Health Division is the only public health/radiation control authority within the State of Nevada. As long as our criteria is the same as NRC or more restrictive than NRC, this is not an issue.
