As stated in question 42, South Carolina does not have definitions for the terms: waste; disposal; effluent; transfer; or release limits. The definition of byproduct material is stated in our regulations as "(1) any radioactive material (except special nuclear material) yielded in or made radioactive by exposure to the radiation incident to the process of producing or utilizing special nuclear material, and (2) the tailings or waste produced by the extraction or concentration of uranium or thorium from any one ore processed primarily for its source material content."

Regarding question 43, we have no State standards for the unrestricted release of solid materials other than the reliance on US NRC guidance documents.
