I am writing to strongly urge the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to isolate all radioactive wastes and materials, and anything they contaminate, no matter what the level of contamination. Nuclear weapon and nuclear power wastes must be isolated from people and the biospherse. We strongly object to the proposal to send radioactive wastes to landfills, incinerators or into the recycling loop in the US or abroad.

Ohio passed a bill a number of years ago to respond to the NRC's below regulatory concern proposal. We still do not want nuclear power and weapons wastes released, cleared, deregulated, exempted, generally licensed, designated de minimis, unimportant, trivial" or called -- BRC-below regulatory concern.

We want the NRC to track and recapture the already released radioactive wastes in our environment. Earth Day Coalition, neighborhood residents and elected officials worked for over a decade to help remediate a SDMP site in Newburgh Heights, Ohio. The presence of depleted uranium from an industrial processes was, and still is, of great concern to our communities. Even wastes from our sewage treatment plant were contaminated with cobalt 60, demonstrating that de minimus releases can re-concentrate (due to incineration) and be of great community concern. We feel the NRC has not done an adequate job in protecting our health and quality of life in our community. The NRC must more efficiently identify, track and recapture radioactive wastes.

We take great objection to the idea of acceptable risk associated with the release of contaminated materials into the marketplace. It is the NRC's duty to protect the public, and prevent avoidable involuntary and uniformed risks. There is no way to justify releasing contaminated materials and thereby putting workers and others who handle consumer recycled products at risk.

Finally, I request that the NRC extend the comment period for at least six more months to adequately give members of the public and others who are most likely impacted a chance to comment.

Thank you for this opportunity to comment on this most important issue.
