INSPECTION (RVII) AND REACTOR VESSEL INTERNALS AGING

MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS (RVIAMP)

On January 4, 2000, representatives of Duke (led by Robert Gill) had a call with the NRC staff (Allen Hiser and William Burton) in Rockville, Maryland, to discuss the Oconee license renewal application. The purpose of the phone call was to clarify items in Duke's submittal of December 17, 1999, regarding the RVII and RVIAMP. The call was a continuation of a meeting that occurred on December 9, 1999, and two followup e-mail messages that were sent on December 23 and 28, 1999, on the same issue.

During the call on January 4, 2000, Duke clarified that the December 17, 1999, submittal placed additional emphasis on the inspection of the reactor vessel internals and clarified that the aging management program emphasized the preparatory work (inspection scope, locations to be inspected, sample size, etc.) supporting the inspection. This clarification adequately resolved the staff's questions and does not require Duke to submit additional information.

Enclosures 1 and 2 contain the two e-mail messages which include the staff's questions and Duke's initial response to the questions.

- 1. There was a question regarding how to format the latest revision to the FSAR Supplement. My management would prefer that you provide the latest FSAR Supplement revision in its entirety, without redline/strikeout.
- 2. Two questions arose from your 12/17 letter, regarding the RVIAMP:
- a. Page 8 of the submittal on "Additional Oconee Commitments..." refers to the Oconee RVIAMP. Should the reference be changed to the RVII?
- b. Item 2 on the same page refers to "data will be developed..." Through what program or process will that data be developed? Initially we believed that the Oconee RVIAMP was responsible for this.

I'd like to discuss item number 1 further to make sure I understand clearly the changes from my last discussion with Joe.

With respect to item number 2, the reference on page 8 should be changed to RVII or could even be deleted as the sentence is unnecessary. With respect to the second part of this comment, the Oconee RVIAMP will be developing the data. However, the actual commitment is to do the required analysis with the appropriate data without committing to how the data may be obtained in the future.

As result of the discussions with the staff in December, the focus of the RVI aging management commitment shifted from the describing the near-term developmental program to describing the inspections to be performed during the period of extended operation. As a result, the Oconee commitment has less details about the developmental program (RVIAMP) and more on the inspections (RVII).

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
