SUBJECT: TURKEY POINT PLANT UNITS 3 AND 4 - REQUEST FOR DOCUMENTS
RE: HOMESTEAD AIR FORCE BASE

Dear Ms. Lange:

Your letter dated December 2, 1999, expressed concern over continuing operation of the Turkey Point Nuclear Power Plant in light of plans to redevelop Homestead Air Force Base into a major commercial airport. You requested several documents which I have enclosed.

1. Enclosure 1 is the Florida Power and Light Company (FPL) response, dated June 15, 1998, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) letter dated April 14, 1998.
2. There has been no update to the Turkey Point Final Safety Analysis Report or other related documents because the airport issues are still under examination and development.
3. As mentioned in our May 4, 1998, letter to Ms. Joette Lorion, Enclosure 2 is the NRC response, dated August 5, 1999, to FPL's submittal of June 15, 1998.
- 4.& 5. NRC letter of December 20, 1996, stated that your December 2, 1996, letter was forwarded to the State of Florida and the Federal Emergency Management Agency for their information. No responses were requested from these agencies and none was received.
6. Enclosure 3 is FPL's submittal dated November 17, 1999, in response to our letter dated September 16, 1999 (Enclosure 4).
