SUBJECT: NRC SPECIAL INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-416/99-19

Dear Mr. Eaton:

This refers to the inspection conducted on November 29 through December 9, 1999, at the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station facility. The purpose of the inspection was to follow up on the September 9, 1999, failure of high pressure core spray diesel generator Bearing B. You described this event in Licensee Event Report 1999-004 dated October 12, 1999. The enclosed report presents the results of this inspection.

Based on the results of this inspection, four apparent violations were identified and are being considered for escalated enforcement action in accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions" (Enforcement Policy), NUREG-1600. The first apparent violation involved exceeding the Technical Specification 3.8.1 limiting condition for operation regarding the emergency diesel generators. The second apparent violation involved the failure to include the diesel generator bearings as a potential cause for the "Generator RTD TEMP HI" alarm in the applicable alarm response instruction. The third apparent violation involved the failure of the maintenance planner to adequately plan a work package to add the required amount of oil and to comply with the procedural requirement to address the scope of the work and effects on the design basis in the work package impact statement. The fourth apparent violation involved two examples of failures to initiate condition reports when nonconformances were discovered. The two examples included the differences in bearing oil level between the controlled drawing and the Division III generator bearing nameplate and the potential for bearing damage due to oil frothing. The circumstances surrounding these apparent violations, the significance of the issues, and the need for lasting and effective corrective action were discussed with members of your staff at the inspection exit meeting on December 10, 1999. As a result, it may not be necessary to conduct a predecisional enforcement conference in order to enable the NRC to make an enforcement decision.

In addition, since your facility has not been the subject of escalated enforcement actions within the last 2 years, and based on our understanding of your corrective action, a civil penalty may not be warranted in accordance with Section VI.B.2 of the Enforcement Policy. The final

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decision will be based on your confirming on the license docket that the corrective actions previously described to the staff have been or are being taken.

Before the NRC makes its enforcement decision, we are providing you an opportunity to either: (1) respond in writing to the apparent violations addressed in this inspection report within 30 days of the date of this letter or (2) request a predecisional enforcement conference. If a conference is held, it will be open for public observation. The NRC will also issue a press release to announce the conference. Please contact Joseph I. Tapia at (817) 860-8243 within 7 days of the date of this letter to notify the NRC of your intended response.

If you choose to respond in writing, your response should be clearly marked as a "Response to Apparent Violations in Inspection Report No. 50-416/99-19" and should include for each apparent violation: (1) the reason for the apparent violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the apparent violation, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Your response should be submitted under oath or affirmation and may reference or include previous docketed correspondence, if the correspondence adequately addresses the required response. If an adequate response is not received within the time specified or an extension of time has not been granted by the NRC, the NRC will proceed with its enforcement decision or schedule a predecisional enforcement conference.

In addition, please be advised that the number and characterization of apparent violations described in the enclosed inspection report may change as a result of further NRC review. You will be advised by separate correspondence of the results of our deliberations on this matter.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter, its enclosure, and your response (if you choose to provide one) will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room (PDR). To the extent possible, your response should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information so that it can be placed in the PDR without redaction.
