Dear Chairman Meserve:

This letter is to request the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to stop the recycling of radioactive waste into consumer products and to isolate these materials and anything they contaminate. We, the public, should not be exposed to the dangers that such a recycling plan would allow.

Naturally occurring radiation cannot be avoided, but its presence in no way justifies the additional radiation exposures that the NRC plans to allow in products we use every day.
