SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-498/99-20; 50-499/99-20

Dear Mr. Cottle:

This refers to the inspection conducted on November 7 through December 25, 1999, at the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station, Units 1 and 2, facility. The enclosed report presents the results of this inspection.

During this inspection period, lack of a procedure and several unidentified steam plant material condition deficiencies contributed to your Unit 2 operators initiating a transient that required a prompt reduction in power during a routine tagout. Operator inexperience and weak procedures caused delays in recognizing the need to start the power reduction. This resulted in a power reduction which was more urgently needed once started. Inappropriate reactivity controls also made the transient more severe than it should have been. Although you are treating these issues with the appropriate level of attention, they represent additional examples of recent plant transients caused or complicated by balance of plant material condition issues and inappropriate reactivity controls during an event.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined that three Severity Level IV violations of NRC requirements occurred. These violations are being treated as noncited violations (NCVs), consistent with Section VII.B.1.a of the Enforcement Policy. These NCVs are described in the subject inspection report. If you contest the violation or severity level of these NCVs, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555-0001, with copies to the Regional Administrator, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Arlington, Texas 76011; the Director, Office of Enforcement, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555-0001; and the NRC Resident Inspector at the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station, Units 1 and 2, facility.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter, its enclosure, and your response, if requested, will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room (PDR).
