SUBJECT: PROPOSED IMPORT OF CLASS A RADIOACTIVE WASTE FROM  
GERMANY (IW 009)

Your memorandum of December 21, 1999, requested our review of the subject waste import license application from Siemens Power Corporation. We have reviewed the information you provided against the technical criteria in 10 CFR 110 and find the information provided to be complete and acceptable, with one exception that you have already noted. The 10 CFR 110 Statement of Considerations indicates that NRC will consult with interested States and LLW compacts prior to issuing an import license for low-level radioactive waste. Although the incoming application contained a letter from the State of Washington Department of Ecology addressing the proposed import, we agree with your plan to obtain formal comments on the application from both the Northwest Compact, and Utah (if the waste from Siemens is to be disposed of at Envirocare).
