Subject: MEDIA INTEREST IN HIGH TRITIUM CONCENTRATIONS IN GROUNDWATER FROM A DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY BURIAL SITE

The Department of Energy (DOE) informed Energy Northwest of high tritium readings from a well located near the WNP-2 meteorological tower. The tower is located on the west end of the owner-controlled area. The WNP-2 site is approximately 10 miles northwest of Richland, Washington. Today, a news story in the Tri-City Herald similarly reported that this ground water sample contained 400 times the drinking water standard of 20,000 pico-curies per liter. The tritium is believed to come from a DOE burial site adjacent to the Energy Northwest owner-controlled area, which is approximately 3 1/2 miles from the Columbia River. DOE is working with Energy Northwest to develop a sample plan to determine the extent of the plume and any necessary adjustments to the site remediation schedule. DOE plans a press conference at 1 p.m. today in the Richland, Washington, Federal Building.

The state of Washington was informed.

Region IV received notification of the press interest from Doug Coleman, Manager, Regulatory Affairs, WNP-2, at 6:30 a.m. PST. Region IV has informed EDO/NRR/PA.
