SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF MEETING BETWEEN SNEC, GPUN AND THE NRC STAFF

On January 21, 2000, representatives of the NRC staff met at NRC Headquarters with representatives of the SNEC and GPUN, the licensees for the SNEF. Enclosure one is a list of meeting attendees. Enclosure two is the briefing material provided by the licensees at the meeting.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the organization structure of GPUN, a co-licensee for the SNEF, after the proposed sale of the Oyster Creek nuclear power plant. The sale would result in GPUN being a licensee for only the SNEF and Three Mile Island Unit 2 (TMI-2). With no remaining operating nuclear plants, many organizational functions within GPUN would end, resulting in a much smaller corporation.

The licensees presented the proposed management structure of GPUN after the Oyster Creek sale. The SNEC staff and decommissioning engineering group within GPUN would remain unchanged. The major proposed changes that would occur are that (1) a GPUN Cognizant Officer for TMI-2/SNEC would be the highest position in the GPUN management structure replacing the Office of the President, (2) the General Office Review Board and Radiation Safety Committee would be replaced by TMI-2/SNEC Oversight Group, and (3) auditing and assessment of SNEC activities would be transferred from GPUN (Oyster Creek staff) to a contractor (AmerGen). The contractor has a NRC approved quality assurance program.

The licensees briefly discussed proposed changes to the Saxton technical specifications. The licensees indicated that the license amendment request would be submitted to NRC about February 1, 2000, (the licensees informed NRC by telephone after the meeting that the submission of the license amendment request would be delayed several weeks) with a requested approval date of March 31, 2000. The NRC staff indicated that they would give the licensees' request the highest priority consistent with existing workload and priorities but that the licensees' requested completion date was very aggressive and would be very difficult for the NRC staff to meet.
