SOUTH TEXAS PROJECT NUCLEAR OPERATING COMPANY SEMI-ANNUAL FITNESS FOR DUTY PROGRAM PERFORMANCE REPORT JULY 1, 1999 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 1999

During the second performance period of 1999, STP Nuclear Operating Company (STPNOC) Fitness for Duty (FFD) Program conducted a total of 1391 FFD screening tests that resulted in fourteen positive test results. All fourteen of the positive test results were for short-term contract employees. The increased number of new hire and random tests performed during the performance period is due to the Unit 2, 2RE07 Refueling Outage.

STPNOC Quality Assurance Department audited the FFD Program during this performance period. The audit identified several programmatic deficiencies that were documented through use of the station's Corrective Action Program.

The following deficiencies have been addressed and corrective action(s) taken to prevent recurrence:

Condition Report (CR) 99-11698 documented a program deficiency. There was not a requirement to record actual urine specimen temperatures that met program temperature requirements. Temperatures were, however; documented that did not meet program requirements.

CR 99-11701 documented that no specific FFD program training is required for personnel assigned to work in the FFD program. Training was provided and documentation maintained.

CR 99-11702 documented that the logbook maintained by FFD did not satisfy the definition of permanent bound record book.

STPNOC did not have any 10CFR26.73 reportable events during the performance period.
