The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission's (TNRCC) Underground Injection Control and Radioactive Waste Section, Waste Permits Division, has reviewed the abovereferenced request. Our understanding is the purpose of the request is to assist you in obtaining OMB clearance for recurring information collections. TNRCC offers the following information to assist you in compiling budget estimates.

### 1. Estimating Information Collection Burden Under OMB Clearance 3150-0183:

This information includes estimates of the paperwork burden for both implementing the Integrated Materials Performance Evaluation Program (IMPEP) and for total Maintenance of the State Program.

IMPEP Questionnaire: TNRCC spends about 70 hours, rather than your estimated 45 hours.

<u>IMPEP Review</u>: TNRCC spends about 500 hours on this, rather than your estimated180.The time includes the on-site review, time to respond to questions (there were two rounds of questions from the last IMPEP), and time to participate in the Management Review Board meeting. Our paperwork burden is more nearly 40%, rather than your estimated 20%.

<u>Maintenance of Program</u>: TNRCC spends about 18,700 hours annually, excluding time spent on IMPEP. This is near the 18,300 hours you estimated as an average for each of the 31 agreement states; however, our paperwork burden is more nearly 50%, rather than your estimated 40%. The paperwork burden includes "documentation of issuance of licenses, preparation of inspection reports and correspondence, preparation of regulations, documentation of training, preparation and documentation of procedures, and general responses to the public;" but does not include inspecting, training, review of technical and regulatory information, and attending meetings.
