





The licensee was authorized to collect radioactive waste (any byproduct material atomic number 3-83 inclusive, and source material) from licensed users prepare it for storage in concrete filled drums until disposal at sea became available or the storage facility became overburdened. The waste was transferred from customer's containers to disposal drums. In a letter dated October 13, 1955, solid waste was compacted and liquid waste, in all probability, would be concentrated using an appropriate method before being added to concrete-lined drums.

An inspection or closeout survey seems appropriate since the potential for contamination exists during the transferring and preparation of the waste for storage and final disposal. There is no information in the file to verify that all waste was disposed.



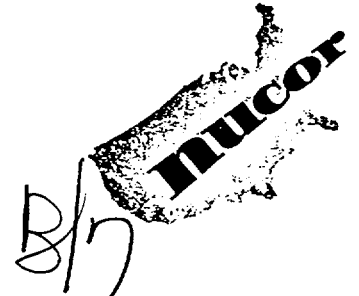

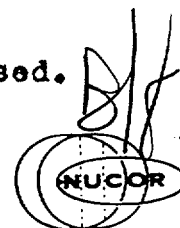

Answering questions brought up during my recent
visit to your office:

1. Regarding LSS3 cameras:
 - (a) Visibility of indicator lights is 17 feet in bright sun with difficulty or approximately 12 feet in bright sun easily.
 - (b) Regarding removal of source in the field, bolts (No. 14, our Dwg. A1024) will in all cameras of this type delivered in the future be tack welded in place. Two cameras of this type delivered prior to this time are so constructed that bolts can be removed by a field man with ordinary tools and source can then be withdrawn to the edge of the shield but not beyond the rim-edge due to a restriction in the tube. Withdrawal of the source to this point, however, will create a beam out of the rear end of the camera. Source cannot, however, be detached from the camera with ordinary tools.
 - (c) Regarding cable length, standard cable length of this camera is 25 feet for the source extension tube and 25 feet for the gear box.
2. Basis for radiation profile about LSS shield (our ISC Dwg. A-1026, our ltr. 1-24-58) is 20 curies of Ir-192 in LSS3A as noted. Profile for LSS3B loaded with 5 curies Co-60 was not included as stated in the letter since radiation has been computed only and such a shield has not yet been built.
3. Regarding your request for a wiring diagram of the light system of ISC LSS3 shields, this will be forthcoming shortly.

I believe that this covers all the questions raised.

Dear Dr. Goldstein:

Thank you for your letter dated September 21, 1958, providing additional information on your Series LSS3 Radiography Cameras.

As discussed with you during a recent visit, we have begun compiling information on sealed sources and devices on "Summary Sheets". We have thoroughly checked our files and attempted to compile all of the pertinent information regarding your Series LSS3 cameras on the summary sheets. We are enclosing copies of these sheets, and request that you look them over and determine if the information which we have so far compiled is correct.

In making this compilation we find that there are a number of necessary questions for which we do not have sufficiently definitive answers to make a complete evaluation of these devices. They are as follows:

1. Are the model numbers intended to be LSS3A etc., rather than LSS-3A or LSS-3-A as indicated in previous correspondence?
2. Are the only models presently involved in this series LSS3A, LSS3B, and LSS3BML?
3. What is the minimum shielding for each model? Item 6 of your letter of January 24, 1958 indicates that minimum shielding for the Model LSS3A is 5.8" of lead; however, from Drawing No. A-1026, it appears that the minimum shielding could not be more than 5-3/8" of lead. Since the drawing is not to scale and is not adequately dimensioned it is not possible to determine that even this is the minimum shielding.

4. Are Models LSS3A and LSS3B always mounted on a hand cart? If they are not, it will be necessary to assign separate model numbers to each

type of mounting. In either case, a complete description of the mounting should be provided.

5. Do you wish to register the Model LSS3BM1 as an unmounted unit? If so, it will be necessary for each of your customers to completely describe the mounting which they will provide for the unit.
6. In general, all drawings are not sufficiently detailed to provide the necessary information for evaluating these devices. As previously explained, we require details on materials of construction, dimensions, tolerances, and techniques of assembly. As an example, Drawing A-1026 does not provide information on the method of joining the sections of the shell, the supporting mechanism, or the method of connecting the flexible tubing to the S tube. Also, Drawing No. A-1024 provides essentially no details as to materials, dimensions, or method of joining.
7. We are also interested in the details of the cable drive mechanism and its connection to the rest of the camera. The description of the mechanism can probably best be accomplished by referring to a teleflex catalog number and description. Any custom modification, such as the mounting of the micro-switch, should be described in detail.
8. Please describe the method of connecting the source disconnect and cable stop to the drive cable. We presume these are joined by silver soldering, the same as the source and other half of the disconnect to the source cable. In such cases, we do not consider this method adequate for a steel cable. Some recent information has come to our attention indicating that a carbon steel cable, after having been heated, will not adequately withstand repeated flexing.
9. Complete details are requested on the flexible tubing including; material, method of construction, and results of prototype tests indicating the extent of normal use and abuse which the cable will withstand. Also, details of the method of attaching the cable to the various components of the unit is requested. Again, if this is a standard teleflex product it maybe described by reference to their catalog.
10. Please clarify whether Drawing No. A-1023, and the related explanation sheet entitled "Sources to be Used in All LSS-3 Series of Cameras", has been superseded by the drawings and specification sheets on your Models 150, 151, and 152 sources. If so, please submit a detailed description of the source cable disconnect.
11. Please describe how and where the labels are attached on each of the cameras.

12. A wiring diagram and a complete description of the electrical components.

- 13. Is any method provided for securing the source in the camera during transportation. If so, please describe. If not, please clarify ICC's approval of this unit as a shipping container without a method of securing the source.
- 14. Please describe the emergency crank and its attachment to the camera.
- 15. Please submit a revised copy of your instruction manual which accurately describes the final construction of these cameras. It is strongly suggested that annotated drawings or photographs be included in the manual, and that the description of the various parts be adequately related to such drawings or photographs.
- 16. Please describe your prototype testing and the results of such tests which demonstrate that each component is designed to withstand the type of use and abuse which it will be likely to receive.
- 17. Please describe the quality control procedures which will be followed to assure that each unit meets the minimum standards set for the prototype.

Upon receipt of the above requested information, we shall continue our review of these devices.

SUBJECT: VISIT TO ISOTOPE SPECIALTIES, BURBANK, CALIFORNIA, JUNE 18, 1958

The main report will be prepared by J. R. Mason, R. Brinkman and Nathan Bassin whom the writer accompanied on the visit.

Initial discussion centered around the proposed use of isotopes by Aerojet in studies of burning rate and strain of rocket propellants. There is to be (1) labeling of the surface, (2) placement of discreet sources in a charge to measure burning rate and (3) sources imbedded to measure strain as a quality control to reduce misfire. More environmental studies may be supplied by Aerojet with a meeting in Washington to resolve final details for approval.

Isotopes Specialties wishes to increase possession limit to 1000 curies because they have such an order. Their hot cell, (concrete on 4 sides with plywood top, vented, exhaust filtered with oiled glasswool) is supposed to handle 400 curies but they do not plan to handle more than 100 at one time. A separate (water or concrete) shield would be used for unloading the 1000 curie shipment prior to reloading in discreet sources. Mixed fission plaques are in plans for research.

Polonium beryllium procedures were reviewed. The polonium in platinum gauze is placed in stainless capsule, the capsule filled with beryllium, press fit cap, heliarced and then decontaminated. It then passes from the 1st dry box into the second (10 to 20% maximum mixing at this stage) where it is heated (in electric furnace inside a gallon can full of paraffin), then nickel coated. They use two leak tests; 1st, place in water and draw vacuum and see if it bubbles; 2nd, an alcohol swipe. The swipe is counted on an electro-scope - usually find well below 0.005 uc. However, it may swipe something.

Goldstein again urged that the AEC set some value and express this as acceptable. The present wording on their license he does not consider satisfactory. Customers may have more sensitive equipment, wipe the source and accuse Isotopes Specialties of making a mistake.

For waste disposal they use 55 gallon drums, most of them with 30 gallon liners, the annulus filled with concrete. Clamp on lids, looks like the I.C.C. specification container. The waste is brought

in by I.S. on their truck - a pick up with signs (lettering 3 inches high) on the side and a small hoist on the rear. A load, just in, included several loose pieces of (type HM21) magnesium-thorium alloy. Several barrels in storage were marked Mg-Th. Their storage is an open, earthen fill, concrete lined pit about 10 feet deep, 6 feet of the wall is above the ground. It is inside a fenced area and also has 3 strand barbed wire on top of the walls. The door is kept locked and is equipped with an interlock with a buzzer, a light and a second light inside the plant all 3 of which come on when door is opened. A switch beside the door de-energizes the interlock during the time the operator is unloading. In storage the barrels have not been labelled, usually. Also, since the storage is out of doors, wooden and cardboard containers are subject to considerable weathering. A fire in the pit would spread some contamination around although the storage pit itself is fire proof. For final packaging, they mix the solids and loose material with concrete right in the drum.

They do radon breath samples for radium dial workers, regularly. Consultation, analysis and interpretation, all for \$25 per sample. In some cases they have found evidence of mesothorium being present, not pure Radon 226 in the bone. The discussion of the basis for the present radium value indicates the daughters were included in setting the limit. Some scholars disagree.

I.S. is using both locations listed on their licenses at present. The previous building on Main St. is used for storage, some waste is down there, and they will have to do some cleaning to vacate. Information on the move was requested.

1. The radiation level in the storage yard, where radioactive waste was stored, was such that individuals could receive a radiation dose in excess of 2 mrem in any one hour or 100 mrem in any one week. This is in violation of Section 20.122(D), "Radiation Levels in unrestricted areas."

2. Several containers of radioactive waste were not labeled as required by Section 20.203(F)(1), (F)(2) and (F)(4), "Container signs, labels and signals."

3. Records of the results of surveys conducted at the 703 S. Main location were not maintained as required by Section 20.401, "Records of surveys, radiation monitoring, and disposal."

Reference to the provisions of Section 2.201(a), "Notice of violation," of the Air Hygiene Act, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, you are requested to notify this office, within thirty days of your receipt of this notice, of the steps taken or to be undertaken to achieve correction of the alleged violations, and the date when such correction has been or will be achieved.

In your letter dated March 11 you referred to an inspection conducted on October 14, 1959 of our facilities. In answer to the three specific situations calling for corrective action we submit the following information:

Your first condition indicates that the radiation level in our storage yard was such that individuals could receive a radiation dose in excess of 2 mrem in any one hour or 100 mrem in any one week. The week immediately following the date of the inspection we required film badges to be worn by all personnel operating in this area. This film badge check has been maintained to date, and at no time have the exposures been up to the limits indicated as a possibility in your first paragraph.

However, our main effort in regard to the storage yard is to reduce the activity by removing it in accordance with our waste disposal license. At the particular time of your Inspector's visit we had definite plans to utilize the services of Coastwise Marine Transport Company. As you know, there have been a number of complications which have rather hampered the operation of this organization. It now appears as though this is in the process of being straightened out. Accordingly, a conference was held with Mr. Robert Boswell, of Coastwise Marine Transport, on this date. He stated that he is in a position to continue his ocean dumping operations, and therefore we have set the date of April 25 as the date to have ready for his pickup a minimum of 100 drums for transport for ultimate ocean disposal. We feel that this minimum

lot of 300 drums will reduce the level accordingly in our backyard.

Also, in connection with this is the status of our waste disposal license. The original application for a transfer of license was made to your office on September 10, 1959. This was subsequently amended to include several packages in addition to those originally requested. To this date we have not had approval of these packages. It would be our hope that we can request expeditious handling of this in order to utilize these packages in our waste disposal timetable. We specifically refer to the large drums covered by written and graphic descriptions.

1. The containers of radioactive waste described in this paragraph of your letter were properly labeled within one week of the visit by your inspectors.
2. Results of the surveys conducted at 708 South Main Street have been gathered in centralized form as evidenced by the data provided your office dated October 20, 1959, November 2, 1959, and March 9, 1960.

In summary, situations covered by your paragraphs 2 and 3 have been taken care of. The situation described in your paragraph 1 has a timetable calling for removal of a substantial amount of activity by April 30. The final level of the level, of course, will be determined by the activity package to be disposed. We are not able at this time to pinpoint the level reduction except to say that it will be significant to the extent of reducing the level four during the visit of your inspectors.
