River Bend Station Fitness-For-Duty Six Month Performance Data Report July 1, 1999, to December 31, 1999

FITNESS-FOR-DUTY PROGRAM SUMMARY:

• During this reporting period, July 1, 1999, to December 31, 1999; the River Bend Station random testing rate was approximately 24.4% percent. The River Bend Station annual random testing rate was 51.2%.

POSITIVE RESULTS:

• The rate of positive tests from random testing is 0.00 percent during this reporting period. There were two positive alcohol tests. One individual tested positive for alcohol during Pre-Access screening and one individual who was not badged tested positive for alcohol during a For-Cause test resulting from observed behavior. One individual tested positive for marijuana and cocaine during a For-Cause test resulting from observed behavior.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS:

- The licensee employee who tested positive for marijuana and cocaine was not in
 Operations or in a supervisory capacity. Access was suspended for the individual
 and they were referred to the company employee assistance (EMAX) program.
 Access was denied for the individuals that tested positive for alcohol.
 Management was notified and these individuals' files were annotated to reflect the
 positive results and the actions taken.
- Four employees were in the follow-up program during this reporting period. Seventeen follow-up tests have been administered to these employees.

FITNESS FOR DUTY INITIATIVES TAKEN:

 During the months of September and October, the River Bend Station Fitness-For-Duty staff assisted Arkansas Nuclear One and Grand Gulf Nuclear Station with their outage processing.

EFFECTIVENESS EVALUATION/AUDITS:

 No problems were identified within the River Bend Station Fitness-For-Duty program during this reporting period.
