1. MANAGEMENT SUMMARY

A. RANDOM TESTING

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During this reporting period, Consumers Energy conducted a total of 345 random tests with the following results:

B. PRE-ACCESS TESTING

A total of 645 pre-access tests were conducted resulting in eleven (11) positive results. All individuals were denied access.

C. FOR CAUSE TESTING

A total of four (4) For Cause tests were conducted during this reporting period. All results were negative and did not require disciplinary action.

D. APPEALS

The appeals process was not initiated during this reporting period.

2. LESSONS LEARNED/INITIATIVES TAKEN

An alcohol testing error occurred while conducting a For Cause test during back shift operation. At approximately 1800 hours a contract employee was detained from entering the protected area by a security officer who detected the odor of alcohol. Following procedure protocol, the individual was sent to the local hospital for a Fitness For Duty test. Alcohol readings were reported as .008% to the accompanying supervisor who sent the individual home awaiting results of the drug test. Upon receiving the readings at the plant site, the site Human Resource Administrator discovered the collector only administered one breath test per machine (both readings were .008%). Immediate action was initiated to 1) correctly administer the required alcohol tests and 2) retrain the hospital staff placing emphasis on reading the procedure prior to administering a test and explaining the necessity of proper completion of the alcohol test form. The individual's drug test was reported as negative and no disciplinary action was taken.

The on-site collection staff became Certified Professional Collectors, under the Drug and Alcohol Testing Industry Association's examination program.

3. **REPORTABLE EVENTS UNDER 10CFR26, SECTION 26.73**

During this six-month interval, Consumers Energy did not encounter any FFD event that required reporting under 10 CFR 26.73.
