

# Comments on the Draft Policy Statement on West Valley Clean up.

- 1 Drouting tanks + cement rubble is a poor substitute for total clean up. should erosion start in the near future the tanks + grout would shift break apart, there is no way this could be retrieved. Fly ash cement is a very weak material. it would pulverize in a very short period of time.
  - 2 The N.D.A. with damaged fuel assemblies entrenched in cement with other wastes over them also in cement would be very costly to remove. these wastes are in a highly erodable site they must be removed off site.
  - 3 The S.D.A. trenches have already migrated downward + sideways, how do you propose to prevent future + further migration?
  - 4 The true wastes stored in the Drum Cell Bldg. are in containers that have exceeded the 10 yr. life span. How can we not allow you to remove this Hazard.
  - 5 With erosion on three sides of the site it is only a matter of time before the wastes shift and move on to Lake Erie, the Niagara River and the St. Lawrence sea way these wastes must be removed to a more isolated area.
