# PERFORMANCE DATA AND SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

### Medical Review Officer (MRO) Six Month Report

From July 1, 1999 through December 31, 1999, our records indicate the following results:

In the licensee pool Follow-up Program category, one (1) confirmed positive occurred. There were no other positive results in the remaining program categories for the licensee, as well as the short-term and long-term contractor pools.

#### Follow-up Program

On May 24, 1999, a licensee employee experienced a confirmed intoxilyzer positive test result. The employee was placed on indefinite suspension, denied unescorted access and referred to the Employee Assistance Program (EAP) for evaluation and treatment recommendations. On June 23, 1999, the employee was returned to work and participated in recommended EAP treatment. On July 2, 1999, the employee successfully completed recommended rehabilitation and unescorted access was reinstated on July 13, 1999. The employee was placed in the licensee follow-up program.

On November 15, 1999, the employee experienced a confirmed intoxilyzer positive test result in the follow-up program. The employee participated in a face-to-face interview with the MRO, and was provided the opportunity for a confirmatory blood test, which was declined. Based on the interview and test results, the MRO adjudicated the employee as confirmed positive. The employee was denied unescorted access and placed on indefinite suspension. Subsequently, the employee requested and was approved for early retirement, which occurred on December 1, 1999.
