FITNESS-FOR-DUTY SUMMARY AND MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

This report identifies Fitness-for-Duty activities at the Indian Point Station, Units 1 and 2, from July 1, 1999 to December 31, 1999. A total of 637 drug and alcohol tests were conducted during the reporting period; 311 initial or pre-access tests, 325 random tests and 1 for-cause test.

The plant population was monitored and tracked to ensure that on an annual basis random drug testing was being conducted at a rate equal to at least 50% of the total unescorted work force. The 325 random tests conducted during the reporting period, together with the 296 random tests previous reported for the first half of 1999, brought the yearly total to 621 tests. This represents a random testing rate of 51.83%, based on an annual average population of 1198 individuals with unescorted access. During this period there was an unscheduled maintenance outage from August 31, to October 16 1999.

During the July-December 1999 reporting period, a total of four (4) positive tests were recorded. Three (3) contractor employees tested positive to initial drug testing and a fourth contractor employee tested positive to alcohol as a result of a for-cause test. There were no Con Edison employees that tested positive and no random positive tests were recorded. The forcause test resulted from security search personnel intercepting the individual prior to plant entry. All positive tests were properly recorded in the security FFD log book.

There were no instances requiring NRC notification relative to supervisors or licensed personnel testing positive to either drugs or alcohol. All three (3) contractors who tested positive to drugs, as well as the contractor who tested positive to alcohol were denied access and barred from the site.
