This letter is written with great concern and distress over the proposed disposition of radioactive waste by recycling it into consumer products, that is using nuclear waste to make new consumer products, such as teeth braces and other medical appliances.

We know radioactive metal is already being sold to scrap metal dealers and that it is being released and manufactured into new products bearing no warning labels!

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission must <u>not</u> legalize the recycling of these contaminated materials!
