Florida Power Corporation (FPC) hereby submits the six-month Fitness-for-Duty program performance data for the period July 1, 1999, through December 31, 1999, in accordance with 10 CFR 26.71(d) in Attachment A.

On January 18, 2000, FPC was notified by the NRC that Attachment - Page 1 of 6 from the August 26, 1999, Fitness-for-Duty Program Performance Data submittal could not be located. #### **EFFECTIVENESS EVALUATION:**

Random testing is performed at an annual rate of at least 50% of the workforce in accordance with 10 CFR 26.24(a)(2). There were 429 random tests conducted with 1677 workers eligible for testing. The current six month reporting period random testing rate was approximately 25.6%.

There were 25 positive results out of 1577 tests. The positive test results were comprised of 24 pre-access, 0 for-cause, 1 random, 0 follow-up, and 0 other. The total rate of positive test results for this reporting period was approximately 1.59%. Unescorted access for the individuals with confirmed positive tests was denied or revoked, as applicable.

For this reporting period, the positive test rate for employees was approximately 1.58%, with 9 positive results out of 568 tests.

For this reporting period, the positive test rate for contractors was approximately 1.59%, with 16 positive results out of 1009 tests.

There were no unsatisfactory blind performance tests during the reporting period.

There were no identified abuses of over-the-counter or prescription medication during the reporting period.
