## NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET FEBRUARY 5-8

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) has scheduled a technical meeting February 5-8 in Rockville, Maryland.

Although meetings of the ACRS are open, they are not part of the NRC's public hearing process.
