NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON NUCLEAR WASTE TO MEET JULY 23-25 IN SAN ANTONIO, TX

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Nuclear Waste (ACNW) has scheduled a technical meeting July 23-25 in San Antonio, Tx.

The meeting, which is open to the public, will begin at 8:30 a.m. each day in the auditorium of Building 189 of the Southwest Research Institute, Center for Nuclear Waste Regulatory Analyses (CNWRA), 6220 Culebra Road, San Antonio.

Although meetings of the ACNW are open, they are not part of the NRC's public hearing process. The ACNW was established in 1988 to advise the Commission on all aspects of nuclear waste management. While anyone may attend, the committee will consider only oral or written statements, arranged in advance and limited to specific matters set forth in a Notice of Meeting published in the June 6 edition of the Federal Register.

A full day's session will be devoted to reviewing the performance assessment capability of the NRC and CNWRA staffs. Another full-day session will be devoted to reviewing the use of probabilistic performance assessment approaches for waste management. Other items scheduled for discussion include a description of science and engineering experiments currently underway at the CNWRA, preparation of ACNW reports, topics for future consideration and miscellaneous matters.
