Ted,

Linda Tello forwarded on your message below. Since this is only opportunity for me to get a sense of the cultural resources that may be impacted by construction and operation activities, it would be ideal to visit Ellen's Furnace only because it appears to be the one archaeological site that might be impacted. Is there anyway to notify the owner in advance in order to get access? I will also want to look at the Ninety-Nine Islands Hydroelectric Plant which I will get to see during the general tour and should not need to go inside.

Since I do not have maps showing locations of the archaeological sites or have a sense of the cultural resources that have been identified on the Lee Site including cemeteries located on the Lee site, I am not absolutely sure that I do not need to see them. According to the ER, there are several sites (6) that are located on the Lee site but outside of the on-site APE that have not been disturbed by 1977-1982 construction (some of which contain both pre contact and historic components) and are identified on Table 2.5-21. Additionally there are four historic cemeteries located on the Lee Site. I might like to take a look at these depending upon additional information I get from the site audit. It would be helpful to me if we could leave an opportunity open to allow time for such a visit if necessary.

I just spoke with our archaeologist. He asked that I clarify what the cultural resource folks want to see. There are no NRHP eligible sites on the 2000 acre Lee site. There are some archaeological sites (as I mentioned on the phone these are lithic scatter variety) but they are not NRHP eligible. The Ninety-Nine Islands Hydro is an eligible site but they will get to see that on the general tour. If they want to get inside the hydro, I will have to make arrangements for that AND they will have to go back up to I-85 to cross the river and come down the other side to get into the hydro station. We can't go to the furnace site on the rail ROW because that would involve trespassing on someone's property to get there.

Let me know what the cultural resource folks want to see and we will make sure we arrange for it.
