SUBJECT: CARDIOVASCULAR SPECIALISTS, INC., REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL
INFORMATION CONCERNING APPLICATION FOR AMENDMENT TO
LICENSE, CONTROL NO. 142334

Dear Dr. Chung:

This is in reference to your letters dated April 15, 2008 requesting to amend Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 45-25377-01. In order to continue our review, we need the following additional information:

1. Please confirm if **ONLY** a name change occurred, or if a possible change of ownership (control) occurred. Licensees must provide full information and obtain NRC's **prior written consent** before transferring control of the license. Control of a license is in the hands of the person or persons who are empowered to decide when and how that license will be used. That control is to be found in the person or persons who, because of ownership or authority explicitly delegated by the owners, possess the power to determine corporate policy and thus the direction of the activities under the license. A transferee is an entity that proposes to purchase or otherwise gain control of an NRC-licensed operation. A transferor is an NRC licensee selling or otherwise giving up control of a licensed operation.

If a transfer of control has occurred, provide the following information concerning changes of control by the applicant (transferor and/or transferee, as appropriate). If not, so state.

- a. Provide a complete description of the transaction (transfer of stocks or assets, or merger).
- b. Describe any changes in personnel or duties that relate to the licensed program. Include training and experience for any new personnel.
- c. Describe any changes in the organization, location, facilities, equipment or procedures that relate to the licensed program.

- d. Describe the status of the surveillance program (surveys, wipe tests, quality control) at the present time and the expected status at the time that control is to be transferred.
 - e. Confirm that all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facility will be transferred to the transferee or to NRC, as appropriate. These records include documentation of surveys of ambient radiation levels and fixed and/or removable contamination, including methods and sensitivity.
 - f. Confirm that the transferee will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements and commitments of the transferor or that the transferee will submit a complete description of the proposed licensed program.
2. In support of your request to authorize Dr. Marc J. Rosenberg as the Radiation Safety Officer, in addition to the information provided (identifying him as a current authorized user on your license), you must also provide:
- a. a brief description of the training in radiation safety, regulatory issues and emergency procedures for the medical uses authorized on your license, using the table in Part I, Item 3.c. of Form 313A (RSO) that is enclosed with this letter. This table also requires that you list the name of the supervising individual, who must be a radiation safety officer, authorized user, authorized nuclear pharmacist, or authorized medical physicist for those medical uses and list the license/permit number of the supervising individual.
 - b. a preceptor attestation, using one of the options in Part II of Form 313A(RSO) enclosed with this letter. The preceptor does not have to be the supervising individual as long as the preceptor provides, directs, or verifies that the above training and experience has been satisfactorily completed and that a level of competency sufficient to function independently as an authorized user for the medical uses authorized has been achieved.
 - c. If applicable, description of recent (within the past 7 years) related continuing education and experience as required by 10 CFR 35.59 if the board certification, or training and experience, was received more than 7 years ago.
