Dear Mr. Jaczko:

I understand that you will soon be making decisions on grant awards. Aiken Technical College (Aiken, South Carolina) has submitted a proposal to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's *Nuclear Maintenance Technical Education (NMTEP)* program. I believe this to be a worthy project and I would ask that you give it full consideration under all appropriate guidelines and regulations.

Aiken Technical College proposes to address current documented nuclear workforce needs by designing and implementing a permanent nuclear maintenance certificate program for undergraduate students. Funding from the NMTEP program will provide training for critical workers in the Savannah River area of South Carolina and Georgia, an area whose economy is centered on two power plants currently licensed by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), Plant Vogtle and the V.C. Summer Station. The area also includes the NRC-regulated Mixed Oxide Fuel Fabrication Facility at the Department of Energy's Savannah River Site. Aiken Technical College hopes to design and implement a nuclear maintenance certificate within the college's existing Applied Science/Industrial Technology degree program. The certificate program will consist of a minimum of 18 credits and the college hopes to produce ten to twelve graduates per year starting in 2013.
