Issuance of Technical Bases Document for Revision 2 to Generic Aging Lessons Learned (GALL) Report

On April 29, 2011, staff issued NUREG-1950, "Disposition of Public Comments and Technical Bases for Changes in the License Renewal Guidance Documents NUREG-1801 and NUREG-1800." NUREG-1950 is a knowledge management/transfer document associated with Revision 2 of NUREG-1801, "Generic Aging Lessons Learned (GALL) Report," and Revision 2 to NUREG-1800, "Standard Review Plan for Review of License Renewal Applications for Nuclear Power Plants." NUREG-1950 responds to public comments received on draft versions of the revisions and provides the technical bases for the changes associated with both documents. NUREG-1950 is available at ADAMS Accession No. ML11116A062.

Performance Management Tool: Internal Control

On April 14, 2011, as a result of a U.S. General Services Administration Federal Supply Schedule competitive solicitation, a labor hour task order (NRC-HQ-11-F-09-0002) was awarded to Kelly, Anderson & Associates of Alexandria, Virginia. The purpose of the task order is to obtain contractor support to ensure that the agency's programmatic internal control program is producing the intended results and is in accordance with the Office of Management and Budget's guidance. The period of performance for the task order is April 14, 2011, through December 30, 2011, with no option periods. The total estimated ceiling for the task order is \$127,937.28.

Interim Enforcement Policy for Minimum Days Off Requirements; Revision (RIN 3150-AI94, NRC-2011-0084)

On April 25, 2011, NRC published an Interim Enforcement Policy statement (76 FR 22802) revising its enforcement policy to include a provision allowing licensees enforcement discretion if they implement an alternative approach to meet the NRC requirements for managing worker fatigue at operating nuclear power plants. This interim policy affects licensees subject to the minimum days off (MDO) requirements of the NRC's fitness for duty regulations and will remain in place until the NRC publishes a revised rule associated with the MDO requirements for managing fatigue. This revision was effective on April 25, 2011.

Alternative to Minimum Days Off Requirements; Proposed Rule (RIN 3150-AI94, NRC-2011-0058)

On April 26, 2011, the NRC published a proposed rule (76 FR 23208) to amend its regulations governing the fitness for duty of workers at nuclear power plants. These amendments would allow holders of nuclear power plant operating licenses the option to use a different method from the one currently prescribed in the NRC regulations for determining when certain nuclear power plant workers must be afforded time off from work to ensure that such workers are not impaired due to cumulative fatigue caused by work schedules. The public comment period closes on May 26, 2011.

Enhanced Weapons, Firearms Background Checks, and Security Event Notifications; Extension of Comment Period (RIN 3150-AI49, NRC-2011-0018, NRC-2011-0014, NRC-2011-0015, NRC-2011-0017)

On April 27, 2011, the NRC published an extension of comment period (76 FR 23515) for a proposed rule [NRC-2011-0018] published on February 3, 2011 (76 FR 6200), that would implement its authority under the new Section 161A of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and revise existing regulations governing security event notifications. These proposed regulations are consistent with the provisions of the Firearms Guidelines the NRC published under Section 161A with the approval of the U.S. Attorney General on September 11, 2009 (74 FR 46800). In addition, the NRC proposed revisions addressing security event

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notifications from different classes of facilities and the transportation of radioactive material and would add new event notification requirements on the theft or loss of enhanced weapons. Concurrent with this proposed rule, the NRC published for comment the draft "Weapons Safety Assessment" (76 FR 6087) [NRC-2011-0017], the draft Regulatory Guide DG-5020, "Applying for Enhanced Weapons Authority, Applying for Preemption Authority, and Accomplishing Firearms Background Checks under 10 CFR Part 73" (76 FR 6086) [NRC-2011-0015], and the revised Regulatory Guide DG-5019, "Reporting and Recording Safeguards Events" (76 FR 6085) [NRC-2011-0014]. A 90-day comment period was provided for the proposed rule, the weapons safety assessment, and the associated regulatory guidance documents that would have expired on May 4, 2011. The NRC extended the comment period submittal deadline by an additional 90 days for the proposed rule, the associated regulatory guidance documents, and the weapons safety assessment from the original May 4, 2011, deadline to August 2, 2011.

The impact of the Japanese earthquake and tsunami disaster on nuclear power plants in the United States.

Entergy filing a suit in federal court challenging Vermont's claim it has the ability to shut the Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant down.

A regulatory conference with Nebraska Public Power District officials for Cooper nuclear power plant (Nebraska).

A special inspection at Perry nuclear power plant (Ohio) associated with increased levels of radiation identified when workers were removing a neutron monitor from a reactor.
