
This letter provides notification that AES has completed mitigation activities of historical Site MW004 (10BV246 / the John Leopard Homestead). This action now permits the removal of restrictions placed within and around Site MW004 to permit future construction activities.

AES has complied with the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)¹ stipulation to mitigate adverse effects at Site MW004 and has determined that no further mitigation actions are necessary. Mitigation of Site MW004 was performed in accordance with the approved Treatment Plan (Ringhoff and Stoner 2010), as documented in the AES letter report dated November 17, 2010 and the detailed Data Recovery Report (Mehls et al. 2011).

Future site activities will comply with the provisions of the MOA as noted in License Condition 26 of our NRC license to construct and operate the EREF issued on October 12, 2011 (License Number SNM-2015).
