the public interest because it will contribute significantly to public understanding of government operations and activities.

Because this request involves information about governmental activity, and the request is made by a person primarily engaged in disseminating information to the public, I ask that this request be processed on an expedited basis. If it is your position that any portion of the requested records is exempt from disclosure, I request that you provide it with an index of those documents, as required under Vaughn v. Rosen, 484 F.2d 820 (D.C. Cir. 1973), cert. denied, 415 U.S. 977 (1972). As you are aware, a Vaughn index must describe each document claimed as exempt with sufficient specificity "to permit a reasoned judgment as to whether the material is actually exempt under FOIA." Founding Church of Scientology v. Bell, 603 F.2d 945, 959 (D.C. Cir. 1979). Moreover, the Vaughn index must "describe each document or portion thereof withheld, and for each withholding it must discuss the consequences of supplying the sought-after information." King v. U.S. Department of Justice, 830 F.2d 210,223-24 (D.C. Cir. 1987). In the event that some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable, non-exempt portions of the requested records. See 5 U.S.c. §552(b). If it is your position that a document contains non-exempt segments and that those non-exempt segments are so dispersed throughout the documents as to make segregation impossible, please state what portion of the document is non-exempt and how the material is dispersed through the document. Mead Data Central v. U.S. Department of the Air Force, 455 F.2d 242, 261 (D.C. Cir. 1977). Claims ofnonsegregability must be made with the same detail as required for claims of exemption in a Vaughn index. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically that it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.

Again, the documents I requests should be huge volume, please disclose any parts of records as separately as possible to make an reasonable access to the documents. And also, even if those documents I request have been contained in the response to other FOIA requests, please disclose them to my request in your website distinguished form from them. Because the volume responses USNRC has made to FOIA request on Fukushima crisis is so huge. Consequently, to find out where the documents I in former responses is, in my opinion, as hard like a a mazea labyrinth. It should spoils the purport of my FOIA request. For the same reason, Please take off any part of records which is not concerned in my request. Up to now, the responses to former requests have included the records which do not have any relationship to the documents the requesters asked. Therefore, the noises contained in responses blocks the access of the requesters.
