Here is some clarification from the requester on what she is seeking. I hope this helps.

1. Any non-published information about reactor status gleaned from inspections at the nuclear plants I mentioned.  
If this is too broad, remember my focus is knowing whether plants are safe in the event of a quake. Look at the engineers' and inspectors' reports that show what the peak Gal level or ground motion level the plants are designed for.
2. Engineers/Scientists/Nuclear Physicists/NRC Inspector data - anything that shows me what level earthquake - measured in both magnitude and Gal - that San Onoefre, Clinton and Diablo have been designed for. I would imagine by records I am talking about inspections of the seismic enhancements done at San Onoefre and Diablo Canyon. Anything that occurred very recently is of use.

If all of this is still too broad, whittle everything down to reports done in the past 3 yrs.

As a follow-up to our meeting last Friday, we have come up with a tentative plan for processing the FOIA and wanted to run it by you.

For FOIA-2011-139, 140 (includes 8 NSIR employees), 141, 148 (duplicates MSNBC request), and 149 we will separate out the non-Japan records and provide them to these requesters. We will inform them that the Japan related records will be addressed under FOIA-2011-0147 (Greenpeace – the largest Japan related request).

For FOIA-2011-118, 119, 120, and 166 we will send letters to these requesters informing them that the records will be addressed under FOIA-2011-0147 (Greenpeace – the largest Japan related requester). Letters for FOIA-2011-118, 119, and 120 will state that since they were granted expedited processing first, that they will be notified before other FOIA requesters of release.

The other FOIAs that are more specific will be addressed with only the records that are responsive to them.

NSIR can request that OIS (ICOD – Bob Randall) capture and send for printing those e-mails in the NSIR box (Mar 11-24) The FOIA/Privacy Section (FPS) will check those e-mails along with the e-mails received from other offices/regions for duplicates. Once those records are ready for review a team should be formed (NSIR and subject matter experts from the offices/regions) to ensure information is handled consistently throughout the records. The FPS will provide guidance to the team regarding marking information that requires referrals to other agencies and companies.

**WORK SCHEDULES AND PREMIUM PAY
FOR NRC'S RESPONSE TO EVENTS IN JAPAN**

Frequently Asked Questions

The following Q&As supplement previously published guidance on work schedules and premium pay during a pay period in which an employee serves in and supports the NRC Operations Center or works in Japan, in response to the current, serious nuclear power plant issues in that country.

COVERAGE

Q1. I understand that the agency has waived its work schedule rules, and has waived the biweekly cap on combined salary plus premium pay in favor of an annual cap, for pay periods during which an employee serves in and supports the NRC Operations Center or works in Japan, in response to the current, serious nuclear power plant issues in that country. Do the waivers apply only to employees who physically work in the Operations Center or in Japan?

A.1. No, the waivers also apply to employees whose Offices/Regions determine that the employees directly support response efforts in the Operations Center and Japan even if the employees do not physically work in either location.

WORK SCHEDULE RULES

(As mentioned in Q&A 1 of the "COVERAGE" section above, the agency's work schedule rules have been waived for the Japan support effort.)

Q1. Which work schedule rules have been waived?

A1. The requirement for a meal/rest break, and restrictions on permissible nonovertime work clock hours, credit hour work clock hours, and weekend nonovertime workdays and credit hours, have been waived, as explained at Q&As 2 – 5 below.

Q2. How has the meal/rest break requirement changed?

A.2. Normally, if your work schedule includes more than six hours of nonovertime work on a day, you must take a minimum 45 minute unpaid meal break or rest period after working no

more than six continuous hours. This requirement has been lifted for Japan support work, and no meal/rest break is required.

Q3. For NEWFlex work schedules, what restrictions have been lifted on nonovertime work clock hours, credit hour work clock hours, and weekend nonovertime workdays and credit hours?

A.3. Normally, a NEWFlex work schedule may not include:

Nonovertime work clock hours earlier than 5:00 a.m. or later than 8:00 p.m., except that an Office or Region may permit nonovertime work clock hours as late as 11:00 p.m. These restrictions have been lifted, and as a result, a NEWFlex work schedule for the Japan support effort may include nonovertime work clock hours, as well as credit hours, earlier than 5:00 a.m. and later than 11:00 p.m.

Saturday or Sunday nonovertime workdays or credit hours, except that an Office or Region may permit Saturday workdays and credit hours. These restrictions have been lifted, and as a result, a NEWFlex work schedule for the Japan support effort may include Saturday and Sunday nonovertime workdays as well as credit hours.

Additionally, there has been a change to the "core hour" requirement (core hours are the workdays/work clock hours that the NEWFlex program requires full-time employees to either work or officially account for if not worked, for example by taking leave, by taking compensatory time off, or by using credit hours). Normally, core hours:

At headquarters are from 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. each Wednesday, except that Offices may reduce the core hour(s) to as little as one hour per pay period (the core hour(s), however, must be established on at least one Wednesday of the pay period and must be between 10:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.).

In each regional office are negotiated locally and may differ from core hours at headquarters.

For the Japan exercise, supervisors may designate any hour(s) of an employee's workweek as a core hour(s).

Q.4. Have any NEWFlex work schedule restrictions not been lifted?

A.4. Yes, some restrictions have not been lifted. As a matter of Human Resources Management System (HRMS) programming, employees on NEWFlex work schedules [but not on Expanded-Compressed Work Schedules (E-CWS)] continue to be subject to an 11.25 daily limit (for further information on this limit, see A.1. and E.3. of the NEWFlex Frequently Asked Questions document). Any excess work on a single workday must be recorded to another

Time Reporting Code (TRC), for example to the TRC for overtime pay (TRC "OT") or regular compensatory time off (TRC "COMPE").

Additionally, the following requirements have not been waived because they are a matter of law and/or Federal-wide regulation which agencies do not have the discretion to waive:

Credit hours may be earned only for hours that an employee elects to work – i.e., the date/time of the hours are of the employee's choosing – versus hours that the employee is required to work.

Full-time employees may carry over no more than 24 credit hours from one pay period to the next (the amount is prorated for part-time employees).

Senior Executive Service (SES) employees may not participate in the Credit Hour Program.

Q.5. For 5-4/9 Compressed Work Schedules (CWS), what restrictions have been lifted on nonovertime work clock hours and on weekend nonovertime workdays?

A.5. Normally, a 5-4/9 compressed work schedule (CWS) may not include:

Nonovertime work clock hours earlier than 6:45 a.m., later than 6:00 p.m. on 9-hour workdays, or later than 5:00 p.m. on the 8-hour workday. These nonovertime work clock hours restrictions have been lifted and, as a result, a 5-4/9 CWS for the Japan support effort may include nonovertime work clock hours earlier than 6:45 a.m. and later than 6:00 p.m.

Saturday or Sunday nonovertime workdays. The weekend workday restriction has been lifted, and as a result, a 5-4/9 CWS for the Japan support effort may include Saturday and Sunday nonovertime workdays.

Q6. Are work schedules other than NEWFlex and 5-4/9 CWS permitted?

A.6. An Expanded-Compressed Work Schedule may be appropriate. This is a fixed work schedule that permits you to compress more than eight or nine nonovertime hours into a workday and fewer than nine workdays into a pay period (part-time employees may participate as well). For further information, see Yellow Announcement No. 032, entitled "EXPANDED-COMPRESSED WORK SCHEDULE (E-CWS)," dated May 7, 2003 and Article 6.10.3 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Alternatively, a First-40 work schedule may be appropriate if it is impracticable to prescribe a regular schedule of definite hours of duty for each workday of the workweek. Based on work situations of which we have been made aware thus far, it does not appear that a First-40 work schedule is appropriate for the Japan response.

Q.7. Based on my workdays and work clock hours, it appears that either a NEWFlex work schedule or an E-CWS might be appropriate. Are there any differences between these two types of work schedules?

A.7. Yes. The primary difference relates to the employee's discretion to select nonovertime workdays and/or nonovertime work clock hours:

A NEWFlex work schedule is appropriate if, during at least a portion of your 80-hour nonovertime pay period (fewer hours for part-time employees), you have at least some discretion to select your nonovertime workdays and/or nonovertime work clock hours (for example, if/when performing regular duties outside of the Operations Center or outside of Japan).

An E-CWS is appropriate if, during your entire 80-hour nonovertime pay period (fewer hours for part-time employees), you have no discretion to select your nonovertime workdays or nonovertime work clock hours, and you compress more than eight or nine nonovertime hours into a workday(s) and/or fewer than nine workdays into a pay period. [Note that on a NEWFlex work schedule, an employee might also compress more than eight or nine nonovertime hours into a workday(s) as well as fewer than nine workdays into a pay period, however, the employee has at least some discretion to select his/her nonovertime workdays and/or nonovertime work clock hours.]

Q8. How do I change the type of schedule I work, e.g., if I normally work a 5-4/9 CWS and I need to change to a NEWFlex work schedule during a pay period in which I perform Japan support work?

A.8. You must ask your T&L coordinator to change your HRMS workgroup. (Note that, as a matter of Federal-wide rule, if you switch from NEWFlex to another type of work schedule, you will lose and be paid for any accumulated credit hours.)

PREMIUM PAY

(As mentioned in Q&A 1 of the "COVERAGE" section above, the biweekly cap on combined salary plus premium has been waived for the Japan support effort.)

Q.1. What is "premium pay?"

A.1. Premium pay includes the following categories: night premium pay; Sunday premium pay; holiday premium pay; OT; and COMPE (not religious compensatory time off or Special Compensatory Time Off for Travel).

Q.2. Who is subject to a cap on combined salary plus premium pay?

Q.2. You are subject to the cap if you are exempt from the hours of work and premium pay provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act, i.e., if you are "FLSA exempt" (most NRC employees are FLSA exempt). You are not subject to the cap if you are covered by the hours of work and premium pay provisions of the FLSA, i.e., if you are "FLSA non-exempt" (covered). You can determine if you are FLSA exempt or non-exempt by checking:

The "FLSA Class" field, "Basic Information" block, on your Earnings and Leave Statement, which is available through "Employee Express." That block will indicate either "Exempt," meaning not covered, or "Non-Exempt," meaning covered.

Block #35 of your most recent Notification of Personnel Action, SF-50. That block will indicate either "E," meaning exempt or not covered, or "N," meaning non-exempt or covered.

Q.3. I understand that for pay periods in which I do not perform Japan support work, I am subject to a biweekly cap on combined salary plus premium pay. How is the biweekly cap rate calculated?

A.3. The higher of the salary rate for GG-15 step 10 or EX-V (this year, the salary rate for GG-15 step 10 is higher) is divided by 2087 (the number of work hours in a year), the quotient is rounded to the nearest cent, and the rounded amount is multiplied by 80 (the number of full-time nonovertime hours in a pay period).

Q.4. How does the biweekly cap impact my compensation for a pay period?

A.4. If, for example, you would reach the biweekly cap after being paid for only two hours of overtime work during the pay period, any additional premium pay work that you perform during that pay period could not be compensated.

Q.5. I understand that for pay periods in which I do perform Japan support work, I am subject to an annual cap on combined salary plus premium pay. How is the annual cap rate calculated?

A.5. The biweekly cap rate (see Q&A 3 of this section) is multiplied by the number of salary payments in the year (26 in 2011).

Q.6. How does the annual cap impact my annual compensation?

A.6. Your annual combined salary plus premium may not exceed the amount of the biweekly cap rate times the number of biweekly payments in the year (26 payments in 2011). So, for example, if you could be paid only 3 hours of OT in a pay period if you were subject to the

biweekly cap, and if the biweekly cap was waived in favor of the annual cap, you could be paid 78 hours (3 x 26 = 78) of overtime pay in 2011, with no limitation on the portion of those 78 hours that are payable in a pay period.

Q.7 Does waiver of the biweekly cap in favor of the annual cap benefit me if my salary is at or above the cap rate, for example if I am a GG-15 step 10 employee, or if I am a Senior Level employee paid a salary above the GG15 step 10 salary rate?

A.7. No. As explained in Q&A 6 of this section, when you are subject to an annual cap, you may earn premium pay in a year equal to the amount of premium pay you could earn in a biweekly pay period times the number of pay periods in the year (26 pay periods in 2011). If your salary is at or above the cap and you are subject to an annual cap, you cannot earn any premium pay because \$0/biweekly x 26 pay periods = \$0 in 2011.

Q.8. Has the agency considered waiving the annual cap on combined salary plus premium pay?

A.8. The annual cap is a matter of law and may not be waived.

Q.9. SES employees cannot be paid any form of premium pay regardless of their salary rate. Has the agency considered waiving this prohibition?

A.9. The prohibition is a matter of law and may not be waived.

Q.10. If I am not eligible for any form of premium pay, for example because I am an SES employee, or I am a non-SES employee who is paid a salary at or above the GG-15 step 10 salary rate, how should I record my premium work?

A.10. Record your premium work to TRC "ADDLT."

If, on the other hand, you were a lower grade/step employee who was eligible for premium pay, but your premium pay might be reduced because of the cap on combined salary plus premium pay, you should record your time to the appropriate TRCs without regard to the cap, and permit the system to automatically reduce your premium pay when it would exceed the cap.

Q.11. If I perform Japan support work, will the agency automatically lift the biweekly cap and apply the annual cap?

A.11. No, your organization must advise Jackie Jones, Financial Services Branch, Office of the Chief Financial Officer, of your name and the pay period(s) in which you perform Japan support work. This information is to be submitted to Ms. Jones as soon as practicable after the work begins, to avoid difficulties processing the appropriate payments, as the annual cap will be made effective at the beginning of the pay period in which you performed the work.

Q.12. Where can I find further information about the biweekly and annual cap?

A.12. See the February 3, 2011, NRC Announcement entitled, "Employee Resources: 2011 Cap on Combined Salary Plus Premium Pay."

Q.13. During a pay period in which I perform Japan support work, must my approving official and I use the NRC Form 145 to document requests/approvals/disapprovals of irregular or occasional overtime or compensatory time, or must we use some other written format?

A.13. The requirement to use NRC Form 145 has been waived, and you are not required to use any other written format in its place. Instead, you are required to obtain only verbal approval to work overtime and earn OT or COMPE, and as always, you are to record, and your approving official is to review and approve/disapprove, actual OT or COMPE in HRMS.

Q.14. If I am entitled to overtime pay, may I choose to be compensated via regular compensatory time off instead?

A.14. It depends. With one exception, COMPE may be substituted for OT only for "irregular or occasional" overtime work, i.e., overtime work that was not scheduled in advance of the week in which it was actually performed, and that was not required to be so scheduled (the term "scheduled" means that the approving official determined the specific date, amount of, and clock hours during which the overtime work was to be performed, and identified the particular employee who would perform that overtime work). The one exception concerns employees who work "flexible work schedules," referred to as NEWFlex at NRC. These employees may earn COMPE regardless of when the overtime work was or should have been scheduled. Please note that these rules are a matter of law and Federal-wide regulation, which agencies do not have the discretion to waive.

Q.15. Normally, employees may not carry over more than 40 hours of regular compensatory time off from one pay period to the next. Has this cap been waived?

A.15. No, this cap is programmed in HRMS and has been retained.

Q.16. Under what circumstances am I entitled to night premium pay?

A.16. You are entitled to night premium pay (TRC "NDIFF") for nonovertime hours that you work, and for "regularly scheduled" overtime hours that you work, between 6:00 p.m. of one day and 6:00 a.m. of the following day. "Regularly scheduled" means that the overtime work was scheduled in advance of the week in which it was actually performed, or should have been so scheduled (the term "scheduled" means that the approving official determined the specific date, amount of, and clock hours during which the overtime work was to be performed, and identified the particular employee who would perform that overtime work).

Additionally, you are entitled to NDIFF for periods of paid leave during a night shift if, in the pay period in question, you have fewer than eight hours of total paid leave inclusive of both night and day work.

Please note that the above are Federal-wide rules, which agencies do not have the discretion to waive.

Last, please note that hours reported to TRC NDIFF must also be recorded to another TRC, for example to TRC "REG" or "OT."

Q.16. Under what circumstances am I entitled to Sunday premium pay?

A.16. You are entitled to Sunday premium pay (TRC "SUNP") for work on a nonovertime shift(s), any part(s) of which falls on a Sunday. For example, if you work a nonovertime shift from Saturday at 6:00 p.m. to Sunday at 6:00 a.m., you are entitled to SUNP for the entire shift because part of that shift falls on a Sunday. SUNP may be paid only for work, not for periods of nonwork including leave, holidays not worked, and excused absence.

Note that TRC SUNP must also be recorded to another TRC (TRC "REG").

Last, note that if you are on a NEWFlex work schedule:

Federal-wide rule limits SUNP to 8 hours per shift.

SUNP may not be recorded in HRMS because of system programming. Instead, your organization must record the SUNP via a corrected timecard. Your T&L Coordinator may contact Jackie Jones of CFO for any additional information needed.

Q.17. On a particular day, I worked 8 nonovertime hours from 3:00 p.m. – 11:00 p.m. and recorded 8 REG as well as 5 NDIFF (for my nonovertime work from 6:00 p.m. – 11:00 p.m.). HRMS reported that I worked 13 hours that day (8 + 5 = 13), but in reality I worked only 8 hours, 5 of which were at night. Did I record my time correctly?

Q17. Yes, you recorded your time correctly. HRMS knows that you worked only 8 hours and that the 5 NDIFF overlaps with the 8 REG.

All –

NRC has received, and will most likely continue to receive, increased attention as the events in Japan evolve over the coming months. OIS is sensitive to the workload impact that the many requests for information and, in particular, the FOIA requests place on your staff. In response to feedback from any offices, OIS is working to do whatever is practical to address this burden.

To that end, we would like to clarify your responsibilities and provide some assistance in addressing these requests. We would ask that you give OIS until the end of this week to develop some additional guidance and, hopefully, some automated tools to aid in how we handle these FOIA requests before you spend many hours of your valuable time trying to collect the information requested. Our intent will be to automate, to some extent, the collection of information in response to the various FOIA requests. At a minimum, we will develop some guidelines for how to most efficiently collect and review e-mails in response to the requests.

Given the volume of requests and the Agency's workload in responding to the Japanese emergency, while at the same time carrying out our normal mission, it is not reasonable to expect we would meet our normal FOIA response metrics. These FOIA requests deserve a best effort response - meaning as time permits - even those marked expedited.

Expedited processing does not mean you need to pull assets off of other critical mission-related work in order to process these requests. The intent of the expedited processing category is to move these requests to the front of the existing FOIA queue. Therefore, using the first-in, first-out theory, they get priority for processing more quickly than would have otherwise occurred. However, the FOIA does not intend that agencies drop everything they are doing to process an expedited request. The FOIA says that expedited requests should be processed "as soon as practicable." In other words, as soon as feasible with the resources you have available, please be aware that these requests cannot be set aside indefinitely with no action being taken on them.

Finally, we hope to bring in some additional resources to assist the OIS FOIA staff, once the offices begin to provide records for our review, in an effort to process what will be provided to us in a timely fashion. We will update you on any additional information we have in addressing these requests by the end of this week, if not sooner.

I have heard concerns from you and/or your staff about responding to the recent FOIA requests for material related to the very crisis to which we are in the midst of addressing. I am currently acting for Joe Holonich while he works with the TABS project. In this role, I have discussed the situation with my staff and wanted to ease your concerns.

The recent FOIA requests met the criteria for and were granted expedited processing. Expedited processing means that these FOIA requests should be processed ahead of other non-expedited FOIA requests and that they must be processed "as soon as practicable." It does not mean that resources should be pulled from other mission critical activities and placed on processing these requests. Your existing FOIA coordinators and staff should apply reasonable efforts to complete these requests considering the constraints of the current situation.

The requester has been contacted and is not willing to narrow the scope or breadth of these requests. We have alerted the requester that our response may be delayed due to the efforts necessary to respond to the event itself.

It is important to keep in mind that records for the three expedited requests cover only the time period of March 11 through March 16 (the date the NRC received the request).

We are drafting a notification for our web site and acknowledgement letter to alert requestors of the likelihood of longer than usual response times from the Agency.

As with any FOIA request, my staff is available to answer any questions and provide guidance. We will be working with your coordinators to determine if partial releases are possible and to look at ways to streamline the collection of material (e.g., special mailboxes or folders in Outlook).

We are committed to working closely with you. If you have any additional concerns, please contact me.






Dear Chairman Jaczko,

I appreciate your hard work on the nuclear accident at the Fukushima power plant, and your efforts to help the public understand its implications for the American nuclear power fleet. I do want to raise concerns about some aspects of your response, with the hope that you can resolve them fully and quickly.

My concerns stem from the confirmation in response to my staff's inquiries that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission has been operating in a state of emergency since the Tohoku Earthquake on March 11, 2011. In particular, I question whether:

- 1) You may not have followed law as it pertains to the delineation of emergency authority as provided in Reorganization Plan #1 of 1980 (PL 98-614); and
- 2) This action may have reduced the contributions of your experienced colleagues in monitoring the event and in decision-making.

Section 3 of the Reorganization Plan #1 states that the functions transferred to the Chairman are those pertaining to an emergency concerning a particular facility or materials licensed or regulated by the NRC. Your Congressional Affairs staff indicated that you invoked these powers when the NRC Operations Center entered "monitoring mode" at 9:46 AM on March 11th in reaction to the Tohoku Earthquake and resulting potential tsunami threat to U.S. plants. At this time, the crisis is unfolding in Japan and I am not aware that you issued any warnings to any U.S. licensee or regulated facility since March 11th. On the contrary, you have repeatedly stated publicly that U.S. nuclear plants are safe and indicated, as has the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, that any radiation resulting from the Fukushima nuclear accident that reaches the U.S. will not be significant enough to impact public health. Given what has transpired, it would be helpful if you could provide the basis for your invocation of emergency authority.

Secondly, if your basis for invoking emergency authority was the potential threat of a tsunami affecting nuclear plants in California, that threat ceased on March 11th. Please provide your rationale for continuing to exercise emergency authority after March 11th and your

expectations for when and under what conditions you anticipate returning the agency to non-emergency status.

Section 3 of Reorganization Plan #1 also states that the functions transferred to the Chairman in an emergency include declaring, responding, issuing orders, etc., relative to the emergency incident. Since March 28th was the first indication my staff received regarding your exercise of emergency authority—and apparently no public declaration was made--I am concerned that any effort by you to declare an emergency has been less than ideal, especially given your commitment to openness and transparency.

Lastly, Section 3 of Reorganization Plan #1 states that the Chairman shall, to the maximum extent possible, inform the Commission of actions taken relative to the emergency. On March 30, my staff queried all four of your fellow commissioners regarding their knowledge of any such declaration. All four offices indicated that none of the commissioners received any communication from you declaring your intent to exercise emergency powers. It would be helpful if you could provide an explanation as to why the commissioners were apparently not informed of your action.

By April 8th, please provide the information requested above and any legal analysis prepared prior to March 30, 2011 that supports the transfer of functions from the Commission to you including the basis for continuing to exercise those powers.

I look forward to working with you as the NRC addresses the Japan nuclear accident, and to ensure the safety of the nation's nuclear fleet.

Over the course of the past week, the task force has been chartered (attached) and begun its work. We have developed a working outline (also attached) that the task force will follow in pursuing this task. During this effort, we will need support from various agency technical experts from many of your offices or regions. We expect this input to largely be in the form of technical advice, informal briefings, and pulled from existing documents which will aid us in formulating our recommendations to the Commission. Please let me know the best way to coordinate support with your office. One method would be to identify a primary point of contact to coordinate support for the task force; however, I'm open to other suggestions to suit your needs. We will try to minimize the impact on your offices and regions resources so that you can continue to go about your normal agency responsibilities and duties.

To date, the task force has had the benefit of interviewing some members of the team dispatched to Japan to gain their insights and seek their feedback on the scope of our efforts (included in the attached outline). In addition, Dan Dorman will be joining the task force upon return from Japan which will further inform our efforts.

I appreciate your continued cooperation to ensure the success of this agency effort. For example, we have already been able to schedule meetings next week with agency seismic and flooding experts. We will keep you informed as the review progresses, particularly on matters that could affect your programs.

**CHARTER FOR THE NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION TASK FORCE
TO CONDUCT A NEAR-TERM EVALUATION OF THE NEED FOR AGENCY ACTIONS
FOLLOWING THE EVENTS IN JAPAN**

Objective

The objective of this task force is to conduct a methodical and systematic review of relevant NRC regulatory requirements, programs, and processes, and their implementation, to recommend whether the agency should make near-term improvements to our regulatory system. This task force will also identify a framework and topics for review and assessment for the longer-term effort.

Scope

The task force review will include the following:

- a. A near-term review to:
 - Evaluate currently available technical and operational information from the events that have occurred at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear complex in Japan to identify potential or preliminary near-term/immediate operational or regulatory actions affecting domestic reactors of all designs, including their spent fuel pools. The task force will evaluate, at a minimum, the following technical issues and determine priority for further examination and potential agency action:
 - External event issues (e.g. seismic, flooding, fires, severe weather)
 - Station blackout
 - Severe accident measures (e.g., combustible gas control, emergency operating procedures, severe accident management guidelines)
 - 10 CFR 50.54 (hh)(2) which states, "Each licensee shall develop and implement guidance and strategies intended to maintain or restore core cooling, containment, and spent fuel pool cooling capabilities under the circumstances associated with loss of large areas of the plant due to explosions or fire, to include strategies in the following areas: (i) Fire fighting; (ii) Operations to mitigate fuel damage; and (iii) Actions to minimize radiological release." Also known as B.5.b.
 - Emergency preparedness (e.g., emergency communications, radiological protection, emergency planning zones, dose projections and modeling, protective actions)
 - Develop recommendations, as appropriate, for potential changes to NRC's regulatory requirements, programs, and processes, and recommend whether generic communications, orders, or other regulatory actions are needed.

- b. Recommendations for the content, structure, and estimated resource impact for the longer-term review.

Coordination and Communications

The near-term task force will:

- Solicit stakeholder input as appropriate, but remain independent of industry efforts.
- Coordinate and cooperate where applicable with other domestic and international efforts reviewing the events in Japan for additional insights.
- Provide recommendations to the Commission for any immediate policy issues identified prior to completion of the near-term review.
- Provide recommendations to program offices for any immediate actions not involving policy issues, prior to completion of the near-term review.
- Identify resource implications of near-term actions.
- Consider information gained from Temporary Instruction 2515/183, "Followup to the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Station Fuel Damage Events."
- Develop a communications plan.
- Update and brief internal stakeholders, as appropriate.

Expected Product and Schedule

The task force will provide its observations, conclusions, and recommendations in the form of a written report to the Deputy Executive Director for Reactor and Preparedness Programs at the completion of the 90-day near-term review.

During the development of its report, the task force will brief the Commission on the status of the review at approximately the 30- and 60-day points.

The report will be transmitted to the Commission via a SECY paper, and the task force will brief the Commission on the results of the near-term effort at approximately the 90-day point. The report will be released to the public via normal Commission processes.

The task force will recommend a framework for a longer-term review as a part of the near-term report. The longer-term review will begin as soon as the NRC has sufficient technical information from the events in Japan (with a goal of beginning by the end of the near-term review).

As you may know, we have been staffing most of our Liaison Team positions since the Japan response began on March 11th. NRC response to the Japan event has not risen to the level where we needed technical advisors in the LT room, as we have a half strength Reactor Safety Team and about a half strength Protective Measures Team to draw on for event expertise.

We are now down to one Liaison Team position which we need to staff on a 24/7 basis. Our OIP staff who man our LT international desk now handle international issues and questions through their office, as does Congressional Affairs and FSME.

I have not asked our Tech Advisors to help with the Japan Event because of the above staffing, and have been anticipating your play in the National level Exercise (NLE-11) scheduled for May. We have now decided that, because of the Japan event, we will not be staffing up any of our teams in response to NLE-11 (except maybe a SIMCELL to keep exercise play going for other federal and state agencies).

Hello Guenther!

I stopped by to see Mats last week and saw you working in your Ops Center but unfortunately our time schedules did not permit us to spend some time together to discuss the response activities we both are involved in. As you are aware, NRC also has stood up its Operations Center in response to the nuclear power plant events at Fukushima Daiichi, and we also have a US government team in Japan who is assisting us with coordination of activities and inquiries during this event.

We received the following inquiry from one of our Sandia National Lab colleagues working with our Japan team and was wondering if you could include it in any future event investigation that IAEA may perform following this event. In particular, the question is with regard to how the initial evacuation was conducted. Understandably, there currently is little information available, but we assumed there was no power within ~10 miles of the plant. Some of the questions raised are:

1. How were people informed that they needed to evacuate?
2. How long did it take them to evacuate?
3. Did they drive, walk, or were they bussed to shelters?

While this is not an official request from NRC for this information, we think it would be helpful in your lessons-learned follow-up to understand how evacuations were (or could be) performed under such adverse conditions. Many countries will be looking to IAEA and Japan for many lesson-learned for future planning in emergency preparedness and response.

Many thanks for your assistance. I look forward to working with you as the new ENAC national contact point for NRC just as I did when working with you for INES.

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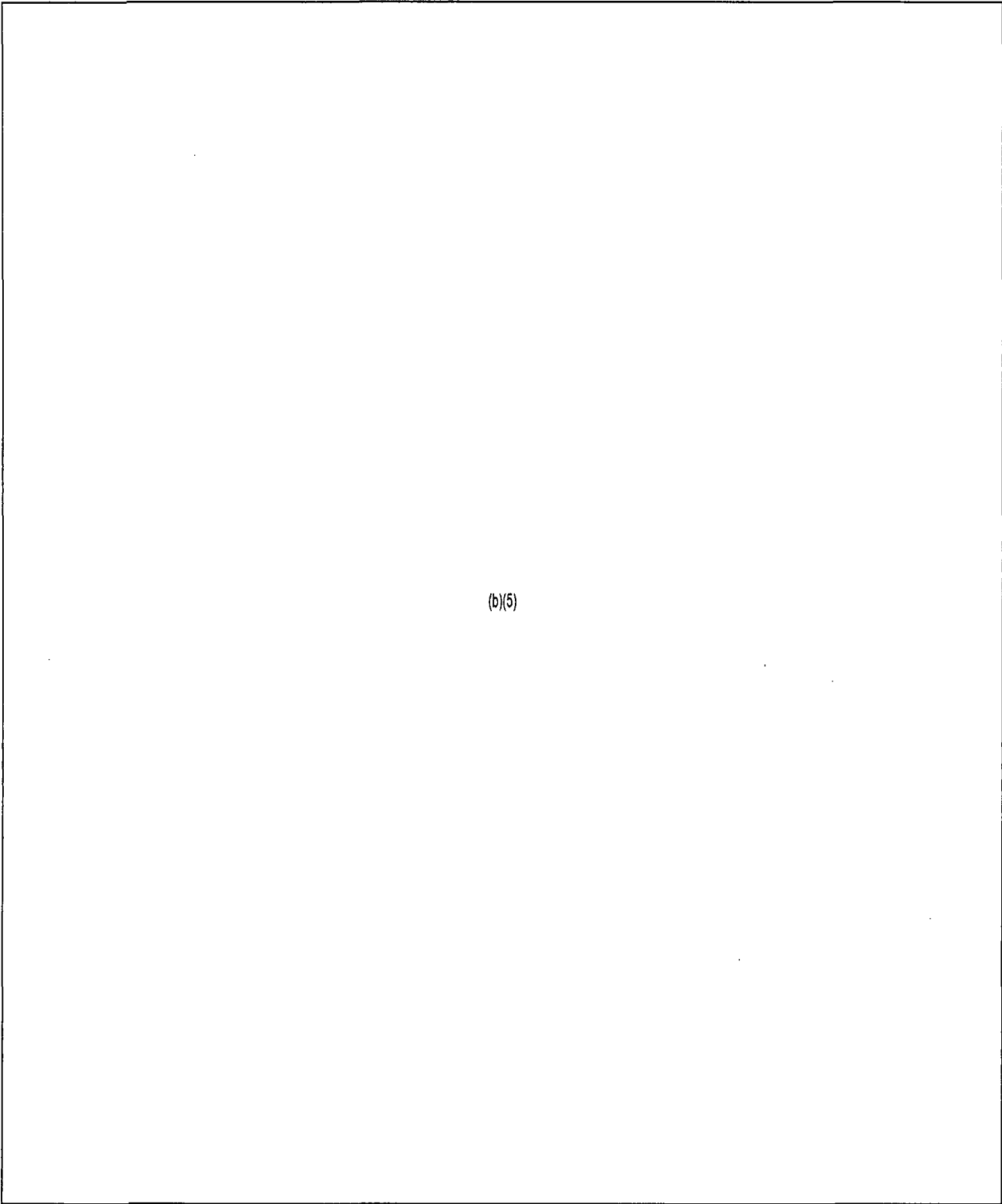

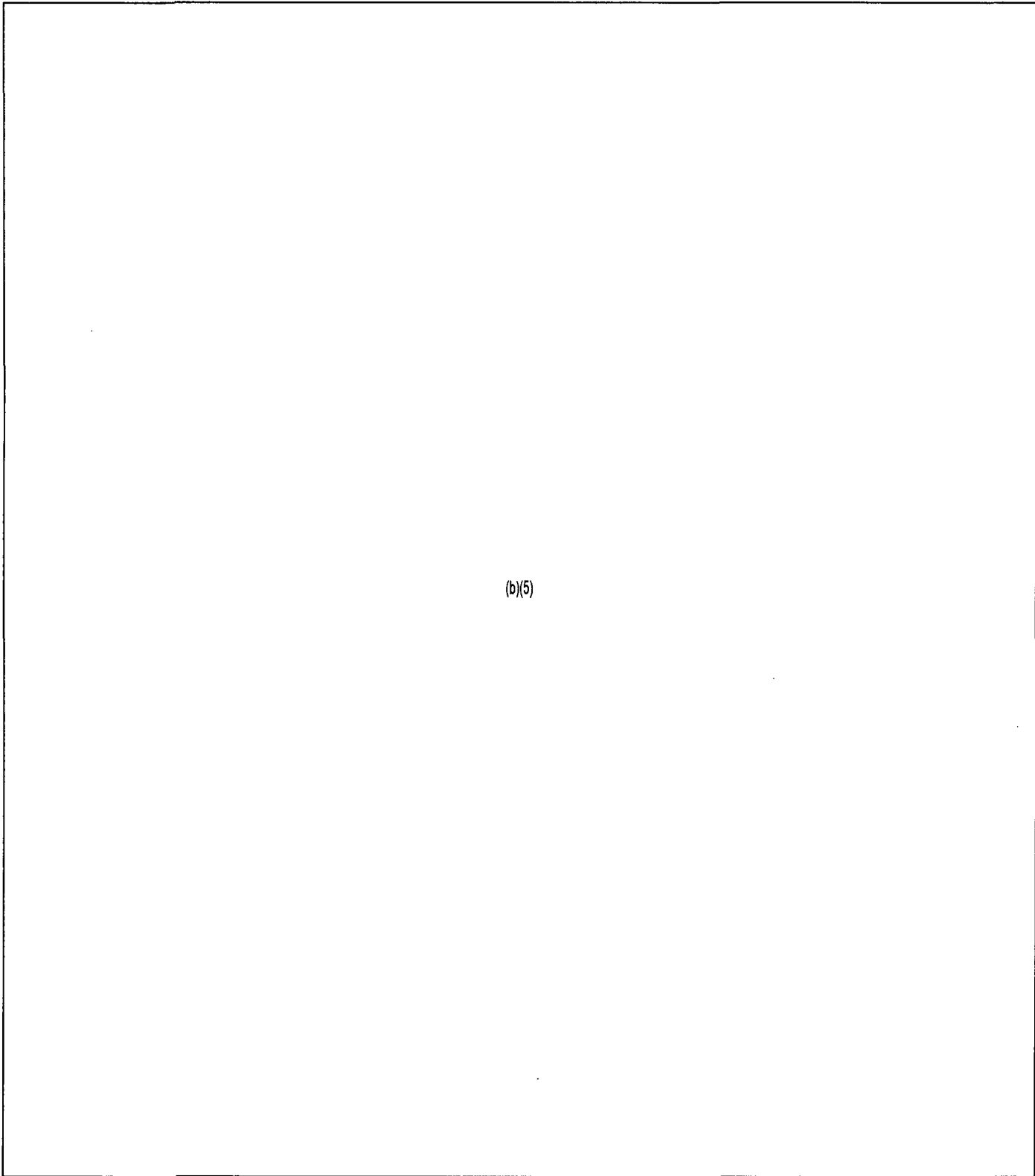

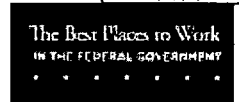

Subject: Tepco's Plan Said to Extend Nuclear-Leak Risk Through June

April 14 (Bloomberg) -- Tokyo Electric Power Co. estimates the fight to stabilize its crippled Fukushima reactors will last through June, leaving them vulnerable to more aftershocks and radiation leaks, a person briefed on the utility's plan said.

Engineers at Tokyo Electric rejected a proposal to flood reactors at the damaged plant, which could lower temperatures in days rather than months, according to the person, who asked not to be identified because he isn't authorized to speak to the media. Instead, the utility is pumping in water and venting off steam, a method called "feed and bleed."

Since the magnitude-9 quake and tsunami hit the Fukushima Dai-ichi station on March 11, there have been hundreds of aftershocks, including one this week that disabled the plant's power and cooling systems for almost an hour. As the crisis drags on, there's the risk of new accidents, said Pierre Zaleski, a former member of the French Atomic Energy Commission.

"The major problem is these aftershocks," said Zaleski, executive director at the Center for Geopolitics of Energy and Raw Materials at the University Paris Dauphine. "You never know if there are more aftershocks and containment may fail --maybe not completely -- but these structures have been weakened."

Tokyo Electric is reluctant to flood its reactors because the move might generate bad publicity, the person said. Flooding would increase the amount of contaminated water that gets into the ocean and also raise the possibility of more hydrogen explosions inside the containment, the person said.

Heat Blocks Decommissioning

Workers can't start the process of decommissioning the plant's four crippled reactors until temperatures and pressure have been brought down. Cleaning up the disaster, which has forced the evacuation of hundreds of thousands of people living within 20 kilometers (12 miles) of the plant, could take decades and cost more than 1 trillion yen (\$12 billion).

The primary danger at the plant is reactor No. 1, where temperatures and pressure are still high and the water level is low, the person said. Water levels inside the core of the reactor dropped yesterday, according to data released by Tokyo Electric, leaving 1.65 meters of fuel rods exposed to air, where they can heat up and melt, releasing radiation into the pressure vessel.

While Tokyo Electric's plan for ending the crisis says getting exposed fuel rods covered with water again is one measure of stabilization, according to the person briefed on the document, the utility's data shows pumping efforts have failed to raise the water level more than 20 centimeters in the 35 days since the disaster started.

Low Water Levels

The failure to raise water levels is part of the reason U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Chairman Gregory Jaczko this week called the situation "static," rather than stable. "Significant additional problems" could still occur at the plant, he said at a hearing of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee on April 12.

A make-shift combination of fire hoses and pumps being used to cool the reactor isn't providing enough water, according to the person. Temperatures that measured 204.5 degrees Celsius (400 degrees Fahrenheit) inside the vessel yesterday, or twice boiling point, cause the water to turn into steam, creating a sauna-like cooling system that's less effective, the person said.

Flooding the space between the pressure vessel and the surrounding containment could bring temperatures down in days rather than months, according to the person.

Generators Move Uphill

Tokyo Electric said today it will move backup generators for the plant to higher ground away from the sea to ensure cooling systems aren't disrupted by future tsunamis. They will be placed 20 meters (66 feet) above sea level, double the current height, according to the company.

The utility also said it discovered uranium in soil sampled at the power station. The levels of uranium-234, uranium-235 and uranium-238 are almost identical to those found in nature, and it is unlikely the uranium came from reactor fuel, Junichi Matsumoto, a spokesman for Tokyo Electric, told reporters at a news conference in Tokyo today.

While Tokyo Electric hasn't announced a time line for resolving the crisis, the person said the utility drafted an internal document two weeks ago called the "Tepco Short/Medium/Long Range Recovery Plan" that aims to have the reactors stabilized by the end of June.

Tokyo Electric President Masataka Shimizu, speaking publically this week for only the second time since the disaster started, said a schedule for dealing with the crisis "will be presented soon."

U.S., French Support

Shimizu spoke to reporters a day after a magnitude-6.6 temblor disrupted power at Fukushima for 50 minutes, setting back efforts to cool reactors at a plant already weakened by explosions and last month's quake and tsunami.

"We're studying a variety of ways to resolve the crisis and getting support from the U.S. and France," Naoyuki Matsumoto, a Tokyo-based spokesman for the utility, said yesterday. He declined to comment on specific measures being considered.

Decision-makers at the utility are walking a tightrope between risks, said David Lochbaum, a nuclear safety engineer at the Union of Concerned Scientists in Washington D.C. Although flooding could cause weakened containment structures to break, a slower process also has drawbacks, he said.

"They're getting back to a situation where they have more control," he said, referring to progress that's been made in restoring roads and power to the plant. "The downside is that a surprise or a curveball could cause things to get worse."

At this time we've identified 5 additional technical staff and one manager to support the team in Japan. **The plan is for Steve Garchow (RIV), Carl Moore (RIII), Jeff Mitman (NRR), Heather Gepford (RII), Tony Huffert (RES) and Steve Reynolds (RIII) to leave the USA on Tuesday, April 12.** The intent is that your stay will be three weeks or less.

The Operations Center Liaison Team (LT) will be contacting you later today to handle the logistic for your trip. This includes items such as flights, passports, country clearances, health immunizations, international blackberry service, dosimetry and KI tablets.

In addition, HR has requested that I provide you the information below:

I wanted to follow up on our conversation about coordinating the various activities involved in assisting our employees who are being deployed to Japan. As you probably already know, the latest email that was sent to those employees who have been selected to go includes information from HR:

“Please contact NRC Health Services at your earliest convenience on 301-415-8400 to schedule an appointment with Dr. Cadoux for health screening and counseling. If at all possible, it is important that you meet with Dr. Cadoux face-to-face. However, if you are located in the Region or if you are notified and deployed in a very short time frame so that medical screening is not possible, this screening will be conducted by phone. Please be aware that medical services available in Tokyo are limited at this time. Additionally, working conditions are such that controlling diet, sleep, exercise, and routine may be impossible. All of these factors can impact your health. Please review any medical conditions that you may have with Dr. Cadoux so that he can provide you with advice and counseling on managing your medical condition while deployed.

-Before you deploy we recommend that you speak briefly with the NRC Employee Assistance Program counselor, Sarah Linnerooth. Sarah can be reached on 301-415-7113. While you are deployed, EAP services are available to both you and your family, including extended family members such as Grandparents. The telephone number for EAP service is 1-800-896-0276. More information is available on the EAP on the web at www.eapconsultants.com. To learn more about the EAP and the services provided click on the member services tab. The NRC passcode is "nuclear". Please be sure to share this information with your family.”

When Dr. Cadoux meets with the employee, they can discuss health considerations for travel, issues for working conditions, KI medical issues and providing KI as part of the deployment. He also generally sees the employees upon their return. He has provided telephone consults with regional employees if he cannot see them in person.

Policy

(10.131-01)

It is the policy of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission to maintain occupational radiation doses to NRC employees below the limits established in this directive and as low as reasonably achievable (ALARA). NRC shall provide dosimeters to employees in accordance with the provisions of this directive. NRC shall also provide potassium iodide (KI) and other protective equipment (as appropriate) to employees involved in emergency response activities. Otherwise, when an approved radiation safety program exists at a site, NRC shall rely on the program to protect NRC employees assigned to the site (i.e., resident inspectors) or visiting the site. This requirement applies to normal operations and emergency response activities. NRC employees shall comply with the requirements established by the site radiation safety program.

- Each regional administrator and the Directors of NRR and NMSS shall ensure that an internal audit of the radiation safety program for the office is conducted annually. Individuals performing the audit will have technical expertise in radiation safety but no direct responsibility for the program. (d)
- Each regional administrator and the Directors of NRR and NMSS shall ensure that a local database is maintained, including loading and validating data as well as transmitting validated data to the central database maintained by the EEDS contractor. (e)

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Part I General Provisions

Purpose (A)

The purpose of the guidelines and procedures in this handbook is to control the possession, use, and transfer of sources of radiation by NRC personnel in such a manner that the dose to an individual does not exceed the standards of radiation protection prescribed herein and is maintained as low as reasonably achievable (ALARA). This handbook also provides standards to protect NRC employees from radiation hazards during licensing, inspection, enforcement, and other regulatory activities, including visits to nuclear facilities in other countries.

Training (B)

Each program office and region shall establish provisions for radiation safety training commensurate with the duties of its employees. In general, the training frequency should be at least once every 2 years. Employees requesting power reactor and certain fuel cycle facilities to accept NRC site access training in place of their own training for unescorted access will need training every 12 months. In addition, each office should provide discretionary training to ancillary personnel commensurate with their duties.

Responsibilities of the Radiation

Safety Officers (RSOs) (C)

RSOs shall—

- Ensure that headquarters or regional office procedures implement the provisions of this directive. (1)

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Responsibilities of the Radiation

Safety Officers (RSOs) (C) (continued)

- Review radiation exposure information on monitored employees in their headquarters or regional offices for overexposures and anomalies and distribute information to managers, as appropriate, to allow them to maintain the doses to their staff ALARA. The release of employee exposure information must be conducted with due regard for employee rights under the Privacy Act. (2)
- Maintain a local employee exposure database, including loading electronic files, validating records, and transmitting validated records to the central employee exposure database. (3)
- Furnish radiation exposure information, upon request, to office directors or regional administrators who have a need to know. (4)
- Furnish radiation exposure data to current and former employees as required by this management directive. (5)
- Maintain prior dose records in accordance with Part II(B)(1) of this handbook and prepare records for each planned special exposure in accordance with 10 CFR 20.2105(a). (6)
- Ensure that an annual written internal audit of the radiation safety program is conducted. Internal audits shall be performance based and focused on verification that accurate exposure records are being developed and maintained for each NRC employee in the office or region. Each audit shall include an evaluation of radiological risks in the office or region and verification that the program, as implemented, addresses these risks. Peer reviews of written audit results shall be

performed during the annual RSO counterpart meeting. Individuals performing the audit will have technical expertise in radiation safety but no direct responsibility for that program. (7)

- Furnish reports of overexposures to the appropriate office director or regional administrator. (8)
- Participate in the annual RSO counterpart meeting, providing copies of procedures and records, as requested, and performing peer reviews of written and implemented radiation safety programs. (9)
- Determine, in consultation with an employee's immediate supervisor, when it is necessary or desirable to furnish bioassay services to an employee and assist the employee with obtaining bioassay services, as appropriate. (10)
- Determine and assign appropriate radiation dose to employees who have incomplete dose records as a result of loss of or damage to their dosimeters. (11)

Responsibilities of Employees (D)

Employees shall—

- Comply with the standards and procedures established by the NRC that are applicable to their own actions and conduct. (1)
- Make every reasonable effort to maintain the sum of internal and external radiation exposure and the release of radioactive materials in effluents to unrestricted areas ALARA. (2)

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Responsibilities of Employees (D) (continued)

- Use safety and personal protective equipment and other devices or means necessary for their protection that the employee is provided or instructed to use by the NRC or the radiation protection staff at the licensed site. (3)
- Use correct, safe practices in all official activities and follow the licensee radiation safety procedures during site visits and inspections. (4)
- Report any observed radiation hazards to a supervisor as soon as reasonably possible. (5)
- Inform their RSO of any occupational exposure history in accordance with this management directive and applicable office procedures. (6)
- Make every effort to exchange dosimeters and report lost or damaged dosimeters in a timely manner. (7)
- If female, at their discretion, voluntarily declare in writing to their immediate supervisor that they are pregnant. Supervisors will inform the RSO of all declared pregnancies. Regulatory Guide 8.13 contains a sample letter for declaring pregnancy¹ and information that can help pregnant employees and others make decisions regarding exposure during pregnancy. These employees should discuss any questions regarding the information contained in Regulatory Guide 8.13 with their RSOs or immediate supervisors. (8)

¹This sample letter is designed for use by employees of NRC licensees. It has been revised for use by NRC employees and is attached to this handbook as Exhibit 1.

**Part II
Permissible Doses, Levels, and
Concentrations**

**Occupational Dose Limits
for Adults (A)**

The occupational dose to individual adult employees shall be limited to the following doses:

LDE Lens (eye) dose equivalent measured at a dose depth of 300 mg/cm².

SDE, ME Shallow dose equivalent to the skin of the maximally exposed extremity measured at a dose depth of 7 mg/cm² averaged over 1 cm².

TODE Total organ dose equivalent defined as the sum of the deep dose equivalent and the committed dose equivalent (from internally deposited sources) to the maximally exposed organ other than the lens of the eye.

Determination of Prior Dose (B)

Before authorizing official duties likely to cause an employee to receive an occupational dose requiring monitoring pursuant to Part III of this handbook, the responsible headquarters office director or regional administrator shall ensure that—(1)

- The occupational radiation dose received by the employee during the current year has been determined. (a)
- An attempt has been made to determine the occupational dose that the employee has received over his or her lifetime. (b)

The NRC shall maintain records of prior dose for 75 years from the date of the creation of the record (see NUREG-0910, Schedule 2-22.4.a). (2)

Before allowing an individual to participate in a planned special exposure, the responsible region or headquarters program office shall obtain—(3)

- The individual's signed certificate, NRC Form 4, "Lifetime Occupational Exposure History," showing each period the individual was monitored for occupational exposure to radiation and the results of that monitoring. (a)

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Determination of Prior Dose (B) (continued)

- A letter authorizing the planned special exposure signed by the individual and the individual's immediate supervisor, with organizational concurrence through the level of office director or regional administrator. (b)

In preparing the NRC Form 4, or a clear and legible record containing all the information required in NRC Form 4, NRC shall make a reasonable effort to obtain reports of the individual's previously accumulated occupational dose or a printout from the Radiation Exposure Information Reporting System (REIRS) database. The NRC's Privacy Act System of Records, NRC-27, "REIRS Files," contains additional information regarding records on individuals that are maintained in the system. For each period for which these reports are obtained, the dose shown in the report must be used in preparing NRC Form 4. The provisions of 10 CFR 20.2104(e) shall be observed if records are unavailable. The NRC shall retain and preserve records used in preparing NRC Form 4 and database records for 75 years from the date of the creation of the record or report (see NUREG-0910, Schedule 2-22.4.a and b). (4)

**Exposure of Individuals to Radioactive
Materials in the Air (C)**

It is assumed that an individual inhales radioactivity at the airborne concentration in which he or she is present unless respiratory protective equipment is used. To ascertain if the sum of external and internal dose is as low as reasonably achievable (ALARA), concentrations of radioactive materials in the air will be measured to detect and assess airborne radioactivity in restricted areas and, as appropriate, radioactivity in the body, excreted from the body, or any combination thereof will be measured to detect and assess individual intakes of radioactivity by exposed individuals. (1)

To limit concentrations of radioactive materials in the air, process or other engineering controls will be used at NRC facilities, to the

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Exposure of Individuals to Radioactive
Materials in the Air (C) (continued)

extent practicable. When it is impractical to apply engineering controls (e.g., fume hoods) to limit concentrations of radioactive material in the air, other precautionary procedures, such as increased surveillance, limitation of working times, or the use of respiratory protection equipment, will be used to maintain the sum of internal and external exposures ALARA. The use of respiratory protection equipment shall be consistent with the provisions in 10 CFR 20.1703. (2)

Planned Special Exposures (D)

The need for a planned special exposure is not anticipated, but, if necessary, an office director or a regional administrator may authorize an adult employee to receive a planned special exposure, provided that the conditions specified in 10 CFR 20.1206 are satisfied.

Occupational Dose Limits
for Minors (E)

No individual under 18 shall receive an annual dose in excess of 10 percent of the limits of exposure to sources of radiation or radioactive material under the control of NRC (see Section (A) of this part for limits). Minors may not participate in planned special exposures.

Dose Limits for Members
of the Public (F)

No member of the public shall receive a dose in excess of 0.1 rem total effective annual dose equivalent from the sum of external and internal exposures from sources of radiation or radioactive

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**Dose Limits for Members
of the Public (F) (continued)**

material under the control of NRC. This restriction excludes the dose contribution from any disposal of radioactive material into sanitary sewerage pursuant to Part IV of this handbook. Also, a dose from external sources in unrestricted areas must be less than 2 millirem in any one hour.

Dose to an Embryo or a Fetus (G)

The dose to the embryo or fetus during the entire pregnancy of a woman who has voluntarily declared in writing to her immediate supervisor that she is pregnant must not exceed 0.5 rem from the sum of exposure to sources external to the mother, intakes of radioactive material deposited in the mother, and intakes of radioactive material deposited in the embryo or fetus. If the dose to the declared pregnant employee has already exceeded 0.45 rem at the time of the declaration, the dose for the remainder of the pregnancy must be limited to 0.05 rem. Every effort should be made to avoid substantial variation above a uniform monthly exposure rate (i.e., about 55 millirem per month). All of the occupational dose limits in Section (A) of this part continue to apply to the declared pregnant employee as long as the limits in this section are not exceeded.

**Compliance With Dose Limits for
Members of the Public (H)**

NRC offices possessing radioactive material shall measure, as appropriate, radiation levels in unrestricted areas to demonstrate compliance with the dose limits for members of the public mentioned in Section (F) above. Compliance shall be demonstrated using methods consistent with those specified in 10 CFR 20.1302.

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Furnishing of Bioassay Services (I)

When the cognizant radiation safety officer, in consultation with an employee's immediate supervisor, determines that bioassay services are necessary or desirable, appropriate bioassay services shall be made available to the employee to aid in determining the extent of the employee's exposure to concentrations of radioactive material. Each office or region shall make provisions for obtaining bioassay services if the need arises.

Part III Precautionary Procedures

Surveys (A)

Surveys shall be made at NRC facilities as necessary to comply with the provisions of this handbook and to determine the extent of any radiation hazard that may be present. (1)

Instruments and equipment used for quantitative radiation measurements by NRC employees and/or at NRC facilities (e.g., dose rate measurements and effluent monitoring) shall be calibrated periodically for the radiation measured. It is recommended that instruments be calibrated at least annually. (2)

Personnel Monitoring (B)

NRC licensees are legally responsible for limiting workers' exposures to radioactive material in their possession in accordance with 10 CFR Part 20. This responsibility includes visitors and other individuals, as well as the licensee's employees. (1)

When NRC issues a dosimeter, it will be the primary dosimeter of record unless there is reason to believe that another dose measurement or estimate is more accurate; in which case, the more accurate dose shall be recorded. NRC office directors and regional administrators shall ensure that personnel monitoring equipment, supplied by NRC or the licensee, is issued to NRC employees and used during visits to facilities at which radioactive material is stored or used if any of the following criteria are met: (2)

- An employee is likely to exceed 10 percent of any of the limits listed in Part II (A) of this handbook. (a)

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Personnel Monitoring (B) (continued)

- Any employee under 18 years of age is likely to exceed the conditions listed in 10 CFR 20.1502 for minors. (b)
- A declared pregnant employee is likely to receive during the entire pregnancy, from radiation sources external to the body, a deep dose equivalent in excess of 0.1 rem.¹ (c)
- An employee is entering a high or a very high radiation area. (d)

All NRC personnel dosimeters used to demonstrate compliance with the dose limits in this handbook shall comply with the provisions in 10 CFR 20.1501, including the use of an accredited dosimetry processor. Supplemental dosimeters, such as pocket ionization chambers and electronic dosimeters, may be used also. (3)

If monitoring is required and licensee monitoring programs are used instead of NRC monitoring programs, the monitoring results should be obtained from the licensee using NRC Form 525, "Request for and Authorization of Release of Dosimetry Records" (see Exhibit 2 of this handbook), (or an equivalent procedure), and provided to the appropriate RSO for review. If the results are acceptable, the RSO shall enter them into the local employee exposure database. (4)

The NRC is not required to make independent radiation measurements or duplicate radiation safety programs at facilities that are not under its direct control. NRC employees who visit facilities at which they may be exposed to radioactive materials may accept the measurements made by the facility personnel and rely on the radiation safety programs established at the facility. (5)

¹All of the occupational doses in Part II(A) of this handbook continue to apply to the declared pregnant employee as long as the embryo/fetus dose limit in Part II(G) is not exceeded.

**Caution Signs, Labels, Signals,
and Controls (C)**

Unless a deviation is authorized by the Director of the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards, caution signs, labels, signals, and controls will be used as specified in 10 CFR 20.1901, 20.1902, 20.1903, 20.1904, and 20.1905. (1)

A current copy of this handbook and any operating procedures applicable to work involving radiation or radioactive material will be conspicuously posted in appropriate locations of NRC facilities to ensure that employees who have the potential to receive an occupational exposure from NRC-controlled radiation sources shall observe these documents. If posting these documents is not practicable, a notice shall be posted that describes the documents and explains where they may be examined. The office director or a designated representative shall keep these documents available for examination upon request. (2)

**Picking Up, Receiving, and
Opening Packages (D)**

Each region shall maintain and follow procedures consistent with the requirements specified in 10 CFR 20.1906 for safely picking up, receiving, and opening packages in which radioactive material is contained. Due consideration shall be given to special instructions for the type of package being opened. The ADM mail room staff shall notify the NRR RSO if they receive any packages that are labeled indicating that they contain radioactive material. The NRR RSO shall assist with the proper handling of the package.

Instructions to Employees (E)

All employees who have the potential for receiving an occupational dose shall be advised and instructed—(1)

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Instructions to Employees (E) (continued)

- About the storage, transfer, and use of radioactive materials and about radiation levels associated with their assigned duties. (a)
- About the health protection problems associated with exposure to radioactive materials and radiation, precautions and procedures to minimize exposure, and the purposes and functions of protective devices employed. (b)
- To observe to the extent within the worker's control the applicable provisions of this handbook for the protection of personnel from exposure to radiation or radioactive materials associated with their assigned duties. (c)
- About their responsibility to promptly report any condition that may lead to or cause a violation of the provisions of this handbook or unnecessary exposure to radiation or to radioactive material. (d)
- About the appropriate response to warnings made in the event of any unusual occurrence or malfunction that may involve exposure to radiation or radioactive material. (e)
- About the results of monitoring for exposure to radiation or radioactive material on an annual basis. (f)

The extent of these instructions will be commensurate with the potential radiological health risk. (2)

Each individual shall receive appropriate training before being issued a dosimeter, unless the individual will be escorted by someone with equivalent training. (3)

**Storage and Control of Radioactive
Materials in Unrestricted Areas (F)**

Radioactive materials stored by NRC staff in an unrestricted area shall be secured to prevent unauthorized removal from the place of storage. (1)

NRC staff shall control and maintain constant surveillance of radioactive material that is in an unrestricted area and not in storage. (2)

Part IV Waste Disposal

General Requirement (A)

No NRC facility shall dispose of radioactive material except under any of the following conditions:

- By transfer to an authorized recipient as defined by 10 CFR 20.2001(a)(1). (1)
- As provided in Sections (B) and (C) of this part or by release in effluents within the limits in Part II(A) of this handbook. (2)
- As otherwise provided in NRC regulations for licensees. (3)

Disposal of Radioactive Material by Release Into Sanitary Sewerage Systems (B)

Radioactive material may be discharged into a sanitary sewer system if the conditions specified in 10 CFR 20.2003 are satisfied. Care should be taken to comply with local and State regulatory requirements concerning the nonradioactive properties of materials discharged into a sanitary sewer system.

Disposal of Specific Wastes (C)

NRC facilities may dispose of wastes specified in 10 CFR 20.2005 as if they are not radioactive.

Mixed Waste (D)

The generation of mixed radiological and hazardous waste at NRC facilities will be avoided if at all possible. Any mixed waste generated will be managed and disposed of in accordance with all applicable Federal and State regulations.

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Records (E)

Records of any waste disposal made pursuant to this part will be maintained in accordance with Part V of this handbook.

**Part V
Records, Reports, and Notifications**

**Records of Surveys, Radiation
Monitoring, and Disposal (A)**

General Provisions (1)

The records required by this handbook will contain the units curie, rad, and rem, including multiples and subdivisions, and the units will be clearly indicated. Units of roentgen and disintegrations per minute (dpm) are acceptable on records of radiation and contamination surveys. The quantities in the records also will be clearly indicated as the total effective dose equivalent, the shallow dose equivalent, the deep dose equivalent, the eye dose equivalent, and the committed effective dose equivalent. The shallow dose equivalent pertains to both the maximum extremity and the skin of the whole body. (a)

The retention requirements of this directive and handbook are not intended to limit or reduce any other NRC record retention requirements. (b)

Records of the NRC Radiation Protection Program (2)

Historical records of the provisions specified in this directive and handbook, including any interpretations or deviations, shall be maintained by the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards (NMSS) for 75 years in accordance with NUREG-0910, Schedule 1-2.2.b. (a)

Audits and other reviews of program content and implementation will be maintained in accordance with standard NRC record retention requirements. (b)

**Records of Surveys, Radiation
Monitoring, and Disposal (A) (continued)**

Records of Surveys (3)

Records showing the results of surveys and calibrations required by Part III(A) of this handbook will be retained for 75 years in accordance with the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) approved records schedule N1-431-00-13, Item 16. (a)

The following records, when applicable to an individual, will be retained for 75 years from the date of the creation of the record (see NUREG-0910, Schedule 2-22.4.a). (b)

- Records of the results of surveys to determine the dose from external sources and used in the absence of or in combination with individual monitoring data in the assessment of individual dose equivalents. (i)
- Records of the results of measurements and calculations used to determine individual intakes of radioactive material and used in the assessment of internal dose. (ii)
- Records of the results of measurements and calculations used to evaluate the release of radioactive effluents to the environment. These records will be retained for 75 years in accordance with the NARA approved records schedule N1-431-00-13, Item 16. (iii)
- Records of pregnant employee declarations. (iv)
- Records of abnormal dose investigation results. (v)
- Records of respiratory protection medical examinations. (vi)

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**Records of Surveys, Radiation
Monitoring, and Disposal (A) (continued)**

Records of Prior Dose (4)

Records of prior dose will be prepared pursuant to Part II(B) of this handbook. (a)

Records of prior dose will be maintained for 75 years from the date of the creation of the record (see NUREG-0910, Schedule 2-22.4.a). (b)

Records of Planned Special Exposures (5)

For each planned special exposure of an NRC employee, the radiation safety officer for that employee shall ensure that the records specified in 10 CFR 20.2105(a) are prepared. (a)

Records of planned special exposures will be maintained for 75 years from the date of the creation of the record (see NUREG-0910, Schedule 2-22.4.a). (b)

Records of Individual Monitoring Results (6)

NRC shall maintain records of doses received by NRC employees for whom monitoring was required and records of doses received during planned special exposures, accidents, and emergency conditions. These records will include the same information required by 10 CFR 20.2106(a). These records will be stored under the NRC's Privacy Act System of Records (NRC-27, "Radiation Exposure Information Reporting System [REIRS] Files"). NRC shall ensure that personnel data, such as social security numbers of individuals, provided to contractors for dosimetry processing are protected from public disclosure pursuant to the Privacy Act of 1974, as amended. (a)

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**Records of Surveys, Radiation
Monitoring, and Disposal (A) (continued)**

Records of Individual Monitoring Results (6) (continued)

Entries on the records specified in paragraph (a) above will cover periods not exceeding 1 calendar year. (b)

The records required by this section will be in a format similar to that of NRC Form 5, "Occupational Exposure Record for a Monitoring Period." (c)

The records required under this section shall be protected from public disclosure pursuant to the Privacy Act of 1974, as amended. (d)

NRC shall maintain records of dose to an embryo or a fetus with the records of dose to the declared pregnant woman. The declaration of pregnancy also will be kept on file but may be maintained separately from the dose records. Both records will be stored under the NRC's Privacy Act System of Records, NRC-27, "REIRS Files." (e)

Records of individual monitoring results will be maintained for 75 years from the date of the creation of the record (see NUREG-0910, Schedule 2-22.4.a). (f)

Dosimeter and film badge processing reports will be maintained for 75 years from the date of the report (see NUREG-0910, Schedule 2-22.4.a). (g)

Records of Dose to Individual Members of the Public (7)

Each headquarters and regional office possessing radioactive material, other than quantities that are exempt from NRC regulations, shall maintain records sufficient to demonstrate compliance with the dose limit for individual members of the public. (a)

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**Records of Surveys, Radiation
Monitoring, and Disposal (A) (continued)**

**Records of Dose to Individual Members of the Public (7)
(continued)**

The records required by paragraph (a) above will be retained for 75 years in accordance with NARA approved records schedule N1-431-00-13, Item 16. (b)

Records of Waste Disposal (8)

Records of waste disposal made pursuant to Part IV of this handbook will be retained for 75 years in accordance with NARA approved records schedule N1-431-00-13, Item 16.

Record Requirements (9)

Each record required by this part shall be accumulated in locations formally designated as "official file stations" and retained in accordance with the applicable NARA approved records disposition schedules contained in NUREG-0910, "NRC Comprehensive Records Disposition Schedule." The file custodian of these records shall maintain an updated "Files Maintenance and Disposition Plan" (NRC Form 306, which is available on InForms) for each respective official file station in accordance with Management Directive 3.53, "NRC Records Management Program," that includes the records schedule number and approved disposition for each record series maintained. These records are to be transferred to the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for storage when they become inactive or when they are 2 to 3 years old, whichever comes first. Any changes in the media used to store these records shall be coordinated with the NRC Records Officer (i.e., Chief of the Records Management Branch, OCIO) to ensure that the records are properly scheduled and that the records are retained accordingly.

**Reports of Theft or Loss of
Radioactive Material (B)**

Headquarters and regional offices shall report by telephone to the NRC Operations Center under either of the following circumstances: (1)

- Immediately after discovering that any radioactive material in a quantity greater than 1000 times the quantity specified in 10 CFR 20.1001-2402, Appendix C, is lost, stolen, or missing under circumstances in which an exposure could result to persons in unrestricted areas. (a)
- Within 30 days after discovering that any lost, stolen, or missing radioactive material in a quantity greater than 10 times the quantity specified in 10 CFR 20.1001-2402, Appendix C, is still missing. (b)

Within 30 days of reporting the lost, stolen, or missing radioactive material, the reporting office shall submit to the Director of NMSS and the appropriate Deputy Executive Director for Operations a written report containing the following information: (2)

- A description of the radioactive material involved, including kind, quantity, chemical form, and physical form. (a)
- A description of the circumstances under which the loss or theft occurred. (b)
- A statement of disposition or probable disposition of the radioactive material involved. (c)
- Radiation exposures to individuals, circumstances under which the exposures occurred, and the possible total effective dose equivalent (TEDE) to persons in unrestricted areas. (d)

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**Reports of Theft or Loss of
Radioactive Material (B) (continued)**

- Actions that were taken or will be taken to recover the material. (e)
- Procedures or measures that were adopted or will be adopted to prevent a recurrence of the loss or theft of radioactive material. (f)

Subsequent to filing the written report, the reporting office also shall report to the Director of NMSS and the appropriate Deputy Executive Director for Operations any substantive additional information on the loss or theft that becomes available within 30 days of learning this information. (3)

Notification of Incidents (C)

Immediate Notification (1)

Headquarters and regional offices shall immediately notify the NRC Operations Center in person or by telephone after discovering any incident involving radioactive material under NRC control that may have caused—

- An individual to receive any of the following: (a)
 - A TEDE of 25 rem or more (i)
 - An eye dose equivalent of 75 rem or more (ii)
 - A shallow dose equivalent to the skin or extremities of 250 rads or more (iii)
- The release of radioactive material inside or outside a restricted area that could cause an individual present for 24 hours to receive an intake five times the annual limit on

Immediate Notification (1) (continued)

intake. **Note:** The provisions of this paragraph do not apply to locations in which personnel are not normally stationed during routine operations, such as hotcells or process enclosures. (b)

Twenty-four Hour Notification (2)

Headquarters and regional offices shall notify the NRC Operations Center in person or by telephone within 24 hours of discovering any of the following events involving radioactive material under NRC control:

- An event that may have caused an individual to receive any of the following in a period of 24 hours: (a)
 - A TEDE of 5 rem or more (i)
 - An eye dose equivalent of 15 rem or more (ii)
 - A shallow dose equivalent to the skin or extremities of 50 rem or more (iii)
- An event that may have caused a release of radioactive material inside or outside a restricted area that could cause an individual present for 24 hours to receive an intake in excess of one annual limit on intake (ALI). **Note:** The provisions of this paragraph do not apply to locations in which personnel are not normally stationed during routine operations, such as hotcells or process enclosures. (b)
- An unplanned contamination event that requires access to the contaminated area, by workers or the public, to be restricted for more than 24 hours by imposing additional radiological controls or prohibiting entry into the area. (c)

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Notification of Incidents (C) (continued)

Twenty-four Hour Notification (2) (continued)

- An event that requires unplanned medical treatment at a medical facility of an individual with spreadable radioactive contamination on the individual's clothing or body. (d)
- An unplanned fire or explosion that damages radioactive material, or any device, container, or equipment containing radioactive material when—(e)
 - The quantity of material involved is greater than five times the lowest ALI specified for the material in 10 CFR 20.1001-2402, Appendix B (i)
 - The damage affects the integrity of the radioactive material or its container (ii)

**Reports of Overexposures and
Excessive Levels and Concentrations
of Radioactivity (D)**

In addition to any notification required by Section (C) of this part, headquarters and regional offices shall submit a written report to the Director of NMSS and the appropriate Deputy Executive Director for Operations within 30 days of discovering any of the following events: (1)

- Each exposure of an individual to radiation or radioactive material in excess of the applicable limits specified in Part II of this handbook (a)
- Any incident for which notification is required by Section (C) of this part (b)

**Reports of Overexposures and
Excessive Levels and Concentrations
of Radioactivity (D) (continued)**

- Levels of radiation or concentrations of radioactive material in—(c)
 - A restricted area in excess of any applicable limit specified in 10 CFR Part 20 (i)
 - An unrestricted area in excess of 10 times any applicable limit specified in 10 CFR Part 20, whether or not these levels cause an overexposure (ii)

Each written report required by this section must describe the extent of exposure of individuals to radiation or to radioactive material, including, as appropriate—(2)

- Estimates of each individual's dose (a)
- The levels of radiation and concentrations of radioactive material involved (b)
- The cause of the event (c)
- The corrective steps taken or planned (d)

Each written report required by this section shall include, in a separate and detachable part, the name, social security number, and date of birth for each individual exposed. If an embryo or a fetus is involved, the identifiers should be those of the declared pregnant woman. (3)

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**Reports of Planned Special
Exposures (E)**

Headquarters and regional offices shall submit a written report to the Director of NMSS and the appropriate Deputy Executive Director for Operations within 30 days of any planned special exposure informing them that a planned special exposure was conducted, indicating the date the planned special exposure occurred, and providing the information required by Section (A)(5)(a) of this part.

**Notifications and Reports to
Individuals (F)**

Radiation exposure data for an individual and the results of any measurements, analyses, and calculations of radioactive material deposited or retained in the body of an individual will be reported to the individual on at least an annual basis or as otherwise specified in this part. The information reported will include data and results obtained pursuant to the provisions of this handbook. Each notification and report will be in writing and will include appropriate identifying data, such as the name of the individual, the individual's social security number, and the individual's exposure information: (1)

NRC management shall inform the employee that (a) the report is furnished under the provisions of NRC Management Directive 10.131 and (b) the report should be preserved for further reference.

At the employee's request, the NRC shall advise the employee of any exposure to radiation or radioactive material as shown in records maintained pursuant to this handbook. (2)

At the request of an individual formerly engaged in activities involving exposure to radiation while employed by the NRC, the

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**Notifications and Reports to
Individuals (F) (continued)**

individual will be furnished a report of exposure to radiation or radioactive material. This report—(3)

- Will be furnished within 30 days from the time the request is made or within 30 days after the exposure has been determined, whichever is later (a)
- Will cover, for the period of time specified in the request, each year in which the individual's activities involved exposure to radiation or radioactive material associated with NRC activities (b)
- Will include the dates and office assignments for the individual who participated during this period (c)

When a report of an overexposure to radiation or radioactive material is required under Section (D) of this part, the individual shall be notified. The NRC shall transmit this notice before or at the same time as the report. (4)

At the request of an individual who is terminating NRC employment that involved exposure to radiation or radioactive materials, the NRC shall provide, at termination, a written report regarding the radiation dose received by that individual during his or her employment with the NRC. If the most recent individual monitoring results are not available at that time, a written estimate will be provided, together with a clear indication that it is an estimate. (5)

**Part VI
Guidance for Emergency Exposure Control
During Rescue and Recovery Activities**

Purpose (A)

The emergency action guidance contained in this part provides instructions and background information for use by NRC employees in determining appropriate actions for the rescue and recovery of persons and the protection of health and property during an emergency.

General Considerations (B)

Rescue and recovery operations should always be performed so as to minimize the risk of injury to those persons involved in such operations, to limit radiation exposures consistent with the saving of human life and the recovery of deceased victims, and to protect the health of the public and preserve property. Performing rescue and recovery operations requires the prompt assessment of hazards that may be involved with these operations and the determination of alternate methods of accomplishing them. Sound judgment, flexible plans, and adequate and versatile resources are crucial to the success of rescue and recovery operations. (1)

To avoid undue restrictions on actions that may be necessary during rescue and recovery operations, these instructions include flexibility in the establishment of exposure limits by responsible officials. The determination of exposures appropriate to rescue and recovery operations is the responsibility of the official in charge of these operations. (2)

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General Considerations (B) (continued)

The official in charge of the rescue or recovery activity shall determine the suitability of any proposed action involving radiation exposure by weighing the risks of radiation exposure, actual or potential, against the benefits to be gained by the proposed action. The magnitude of the expected individual and collective doses and the biological consequences related to these doses are the essential elements to be evaluated in making a risk determination. (3)

The following tables list some of the biological effects associated with various radiation doses. (4)

In these instructions, the criteria for accident situations that involve saving lives and valuable property and protecting the health of the public differ from the criteria for recovering deceased victims. In the latter instance, the amount of expected dose received by individual participants should be limited to occupational exposure limits. (5)

The use of potassium iodide will be considered to minimize thyroid doses. Potassium iodide shall be issued (1) in accordance with applicable medical guidelines, including the Food and Drug Administration Guidance, "Potassium Iodide as a Thyroid Blocking Agent in Radiation Emergencies" (see Exhibit 3; available at <http://www.fda.gov/cder/guidance/4825fnl.pdf>) and (2) in accordance with Commission guidance, including the "Questions and Answers on Guidance: Potassium Iodide as a Thyroid Blocking Agent in Radiation Emergencies," July 3, 2002 (see Exhibit 4). This process includes questioning individuals about possible allergic reactions. (6)

Emergency Situations (C)

Specific dose criteria and judgment factors are specified for three categories of actions: saving human life, recovering deceased victims, and protecting health and property. When emergency actions are likely to affect an employee or a facility of an NRC licensee, emergency actions will be coordinated with those specified in the licensee's emergency plans or other existing plans to avoid any appreciable differences between dose criteria and judgment factors used by the NRC and the licensee. These actions will not be limited to the rescue of NRC employees and NRC contractors alone but will also apply to employees of licensees, contractors, and visitors. Guidance on dose limits for workers performing emergency services extracted from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) "Manual of Protective Action Guides and Protective Actions for Nuclear Incidents" is provided in Table VI-3 of this part.

Saving Human Life (1)

When a reasonable expectation exists that an individual is alive within the affected areas during an emergency and is in need of rescue or medical treatment, the course of action to be pursued should be determined by the official on site having responsibility for emergency actions. (a)

The official on site having responsibility for emergency action shall determine the amount of exposure suitable for this type of action. The dose expected in performing the action must be weighed in terms of the effects of acute external whole-body exposure and the entry of radioactive material into the body. In accordance with EPA's protective action guide, the official may permit volunteers to receive a dose up to 25 rem total effective dose equivalent (TEDE) without informed consent for emergency lifesaving activities. Any lifesaving action that may involve a dose greater than 25 rem TEDE, or other substantial personal risk, must be performed by volunteers advised of the known or estimated risk

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Emergency Situations (C) (continued)

Saving Human Life (1) (continued)

before participation. Preference will be given to volunteers who meet the following criteria: (b)

- Over 45 years of age (i)
- Physically fit and in good physical condition as determined by a recent physical examination, for example, no adverse heart condition (ii)

In establishing exposure limits for the rescue operation, the official shall keep in mind that the accuracy of the prediction of radiation injury cannot be any better than the accuracy of the dose estimate. Therefore, consideration will be given to limits of error associated with the specific instruments and techniques used to estimate the dose. This process is especially crucial when the estimated doses are greater than 25 rem. The possibility of reducing estimated doses through appropriate mechanisms, such as the use of protective equipment, remote manipulation equipment, the use of potassium iodide, or similar means, will be considered. (c)

When making a decision to perform the action, the risk to rescue personnel will be weighed against the probability of the success of the rescue action. (d)

Protecting Health and Property (2)

When the risk (probability and severity) of the radiation hazard either bears significantly on the state of health of people or may result in undue loss of property and requires immediate remedial action, the following criteria apply:

- When the official in charge of emergency action on site deems it essential to reduce a potential hazard or to prevent a

substantial loss of property and determines that occupational dose limits applicable to routine operations may be exceeded, an emergency exposure consistent with guidance on dose limits specified in Table VI-3 may be authorized. However, planned special exposures are encouraged if there is time (see Part II of this handbook). (a)

- When the potential risk of radiation hazard following a nuclear incident jeopardizes life or poses severe adverse effects on the public health, the criteria specified in Section (C)(1) of this part for the saving of human life apply. (b)

Recovering Deceased Victims (3)

Accidents that involve recovering deceased victims require criteria different from those for saving lives. Because the element of time is no longer a critical factor, more time may be allowed for the planning of the recovery operation. The amount of radiation exposure received by persons engaged in these recovery operations should be within existing occupational exposure limits. (See Part II of this handbook.) (a)

When bodies are located in areas that are inaccessible because of high radiation fields and the recovery mission would result in exposure in excess of occupational exposure limits, remote recovery devices will be used to the extent practical to retrieve the bodies. (b)

In special circumstances, such as the entry of emergency workers into high radiation fields to recover bodies, the individual in charge of the recovery mission may determine that it is necessary to exceed the occupational exposure limits applicable to routine operations. In this case, a planned special exposure may be

Dose limits for Planned Special Exposures are specified in 10 CFR 20.1206.

Implementation (D)

Each regional office must establish a plan to implement this guidance for emergency response during rescue and recovery activities. This plan will—

- Designate an individual by position or title who has authority to authorize emergency workers to receive doses in excess of limits specified in this handbook. The regional administrator in each region should be designated as the lead person in charge of emergency action for the region. (1)
- Provide for periodic training, including written examinations, to all appropriate regional personnel on the emergency exposure procedures to be followed during rescue and recovery activities. (2)

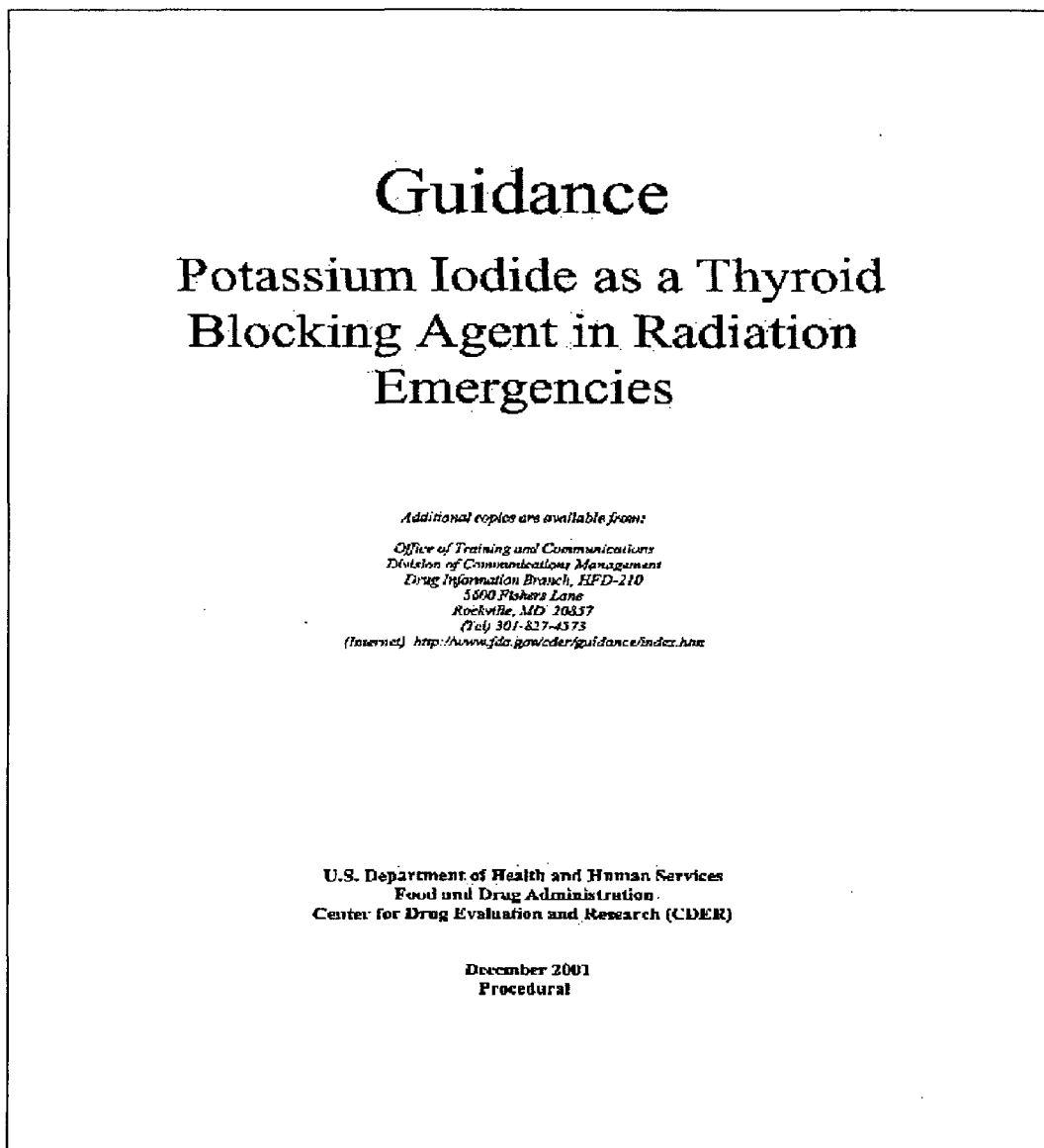
PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

This information may also be disclosed to an appropriate Federal, State, or local agency in the event the information indicates a violation or potential violation of law and in the course of an administrative or judicial proceeding.
4. **WHETHER DISCLOSURE IS MANDATORY OR VOLUNTARY AND EFFECT ON INDIVIDUAL OF NOT PROVIDING INFORMATION:** It is voluntary that you furnish the requested information, including social security number; however, the licensee must provide radiation exposure data upon your request as required under 10 CFR 19.13 and in accordance with the requirements imposed under 10 CFR 20.401 to keep records of radiation exposure of all individuals entering a restricted area. Potassium Iodide as a Thyroid Blocking
Agent in Radiation Emergencies

This guidance represents the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA's) current thinking on this topic. It does not create or confer any rights for or on any person and does not operate to bind FDA or the public. An alternative approach may be used if such approach satisfies the requirements of the applicable statutes and regulations.

I. INTRODUCTION

The objective of this document is to provide guidance to other Federal agencies, including the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), and to state and local governments regarding the safe and effective use of potassium iodide (KI) as an adjunct to other public health protective measures in the event that radioactive iodine is released into the environment. The adoption and implementation of these recommendations are at the discretion of the state and local governments responsible for developing regional emergency-response plans related to radiation emergencies.

This guidance updates the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) 1982 recommendations for the use of KI to reduce the risk of thyroid cancer in radiation emergencies involving the release of radioactive iodine. The recommendations in this guidance address KI dosage and the projected radiation exposure at which the drug should be used.

These recommendations were prepared by the Potassium Iodide Working Group, comprising scientists from the FDA's Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER) and Center for Devices and Radiological Health (CDRH) in collaboration with experts in the field from the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Although they differ in two respects (as discussed in Section IV.B), these revised recommendations are in general accordance with those of the World Health Organization (WHO), as expressed in its *Guidelines for Iodine Prophylaxis Following Nuclear Accidents: Update 1999* (WHO 1999).

II. BACKGROUND

Under 44 CFR 351, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has established roles and responsibilities for Federal agencies in assisting state and local governments in their radiological emergency planning and preparedness activities. The Federal agencies, including the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), are to carry out these roles and responsibilities as members of the Federal Radiological Preparedness Coordinating Committee

(FRPCC). Under 44 CFR 351.23(f), HHS is directed to provide guidance to state and local governments on the use of radioprotective substances and the prophylactic use of drugs (e.g., KI) to reduce the radiation dose to specific organs. This guidance includes information about dosage and projected radiation exposures at which such drugs should be used.

The FDA has provided guidance previously on the use of KI as a thyroid blocking agent. In the *Federal Register* of December 15, 1978, FDA announced its conclusion that KI is a safe and effective means by which to block uptake of radioiodines by the thyroid gland in a radiation emergency under certain specified conditions of use. In the *Federal Register* of June 29, 1982, FDA announced final recommendations on the administration of KI to the general public in a radiation emergency. Those recommendations were formulated after reviewing studies relating radiation dose to thyroid disease risk that relied on estimates of *external* thyroid irradiation after the nuclear detonations at Hiroshima and Nagasaki and analogous studies among children who received therapeutic radiation to the head and neck. Those recommendations concluded that at a projected dose to the thyroid gland of 25 cGy or greater from ingested or inhaled radioiodines, the risks of short-term use of small quantities of KI were outweighed by the benefits of suppressing radioiodine-induced thyroid cancer.¹ The amount of KI recommended at that time was 130 mg per day for adults and children above 1 year of age and 65 mg per day for children below 1 year of age. The guidance that follows revises our 1982 recommendations on the use of KI for thyroid cancer prophylaxis based on a comprehensive review of the data relating radioiodine exposure to thyroid cancer risk accumulated in the aftermath of the 1986 Chernobyl reactor accident.

III. DATA SOURCES

A. Reliance on Data from Chernobyl

In epidemiological studies investigating the relationship between thyroidal radioiodine exposure and risk of thyroid cancer, the estimation of thyroid radiation doses is a critical and complex aspect of the analyses. Estimates of exposure, both for individuals and across populations, have been reached in different studies by the variable combination of (1) direct thyroid measurements in a segment of the exposed population; (2) measurements of ¹³¹I (iodine isotope) concentrations in the milk consumed by different groups (e.g., communities) and of the quantity of milk consumed; (3) inference from ground deposition of long-lived radioisotopes released coincidentally and presumably in fixed ratios with radioiodines; and (4) reconstruction of the nature and extent of the actual radiation release.

All estimates of individual and population exposure contain some degree of uncertainty. The uncertainty is least for estimates of individual exposure based on direct thyroid measurements.

¹ For the radiation emitted by ¹³¹I (electrons and photons), the radiation-weighting factor is equal to one, so that the absorbed dose to the thyroid gland expressed in centigrays (cGy) is numerically equal to the thyroid equivalent dose expressed in rem (1 cGy = 1 rem).

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Uncertainty increases with reliance on milk consumption estimates; is still greater with estimates derived from ground deposition of long-lived radioisotopes, and is highest for estimates that rely heavily on release reconstruction.

Direct measurements of thyroid radioactivity are unavailable from the Hanford, Nevada Test Site, and Marshall Islands exposures. Indeed, the estimates of thyroid radiation doses related to these releases rely heavily on release reconstructions and, in the former two cases, on recall of the extent of milk consumption 40 to 50 years after the fact. In the Marshall Islands cohort, urinary radioiodine excretion data were obtained and used in calculating exposure estimates.

Because of the great uncertainty in the dose estimates from the Hanford and Nevada Test Site exposures and due to the small numbers of thyroid cancers occurring in the populations potentially exposed, the epidemiological studies of the excess thyroid cancer risk related to these radioiodine releases are, at best, inconclusive. As explained below, the dosimetric data derived in the studies of individual and population exposures following the Chernobyl accident, although not perfect, are unquestionably superior to data from previous releases. In addition, the results of the earlier studies are inadequate to refute cogent case control study evidence from Chernobyl of a cause-effect relationship between thyroid radioiodine deposition and thyroid cancer risk.²

The Chernobyl reactor accident of April 1986 provides the best-documented example of a massive radionuclide release in which large numbers of people across a broad geographical area were exposed acutely to radioiodines released into the atmosphere. Therefore, the recommendations contained in this guidance are derived from our review of the Chernobyl data as they pertain to the large number of thyroid cancers that occurred. These are the most comprehensive and reliable data available describing the relationship between thyroid radiation dose and risk for thyroid cancer following an environmental release of ¹³¹I. In contrast, the exposures resulting from radiation releases at the Hanford Site in Washington State in the mid-1940s and in association with the nuclear detonations at the Nevada Test Site in the 1950s were extended over years, rather than days to weeks, contributing to the difficulty in estimating radioactive dose in those potentially exposed (Davis et al., 1999; Gilbert et al., 1998). The exposure of Marshall Islanders to fallout from the nuclear detonation on Bikini in 1954 involved relatively few people, and although the high rate of subsequent thyroid nodules and cancers in the exposed population was likely caused in large part by radioiodines, the Marshall Islands data provide little insight into the dose-response relationship between radioactive iodine exposure and thyroid cancer risk (Robbins and Adams 1989).

Beginning within a week after the Chernobyl accident, direct measurements of thyroid exposure were made in hundreds of thousands of individuals, across three republics of the former Soviet Union (Robbins and Schneider 2000, Gavrilin et al., 1999, Likhitsky et al., 1993, Zvonova and Balonov 1993). These thyroid measurements were used to derive, in a direct manner, the thyroid doses received by the individuals from whom the measurements were taken. The thyroid measurements were also used as a guide to estimate the thyroid doses received by other people, taking into account differences in age, milk consumption rates, and ground deposition densities, among other things. The thyroid doses derived from thyroid measurements have a large degree

of uncertainty, especially in Belarus, where most of the measurements were made by inexperienced people with detectors that were not ideally suited to the task at hand (Gavrilin et al., 1999 and UNSCEAR 2000). However, as indicated above, the uncertainties attached to thyroid dose estimates derived from thyroid measurements are, as a rule, lower than those obtained without recourse to those measurements.

It is also notable that the thyroid radiation exposures after Chernobyl were virtually all *internal*, from radioiodines. Despite some degree of uncertainty in the doses received, it is reasonable to conclude that the contribution of external radiation was negligible for most individuals. This distinguishes the Chernobyl exposures from those of the Marshall Islanders. Thus, the increase in thyroid cancer seen after Chernobyl is attributable to ingested or inhaled radioiodines. A comparable burden of excess thyroid cancers could conceivably accrue should U.S. populations be similarly exposed in the event of a nuclear accident. This potential hazard highlights the value of averting such risk by using KI as an adjunct to evacuation, sheltering, and control of contaminated foodstuffs.

B. Thyroid Cancers in the Aftermath of Chernobyl

The Chernobyl reactor accident resulted in massive releases of ¹³¹I and other radioiodines. Beginning approximately 4 years after the accident, a sharp increase in the incidence of thyroid cancer among children and adolescents in Belarus and Ukraine (areas covered by the radioactive plume) was observed. In some regions, for the first 4 years of this striking increase, observed cases of thyroid cancer among children aged 0 through 4 years at the time of the accident exceeded expected number of cases by 30- to 60-fold. During the ensuing years, in the most heavily affected areas, incidence is as much as 100-fold compared to pre-Chernobyl rates (Robbins and Schneider 2000; Gavrilin et al., 1999; Likhitav et al., 1993; Zvonova and Belonov 1993). The majority of cases occurred in children who apparently received less than 30 cGy to the thyroid (Astakhova et al., 1998). A few cases occurred in children exposed to estimated doses of < 1 cGy; however, the uncertainty of these estimates confounded by medical radiation exposures leaves doubt as to the causal role of these doses of radioiodine (Souchevitch and Tsyb 1996).

The evidence, though indirect, that the increased incidence of thyroid cancer observed among persons exposed during childhood in the most heavily contaminated regions in Belarus, Ukraine, and the Russian Federation is related to exposure to iodine isotopes is, nevertheless, very strong (IARC 2001). We have concluded that the best dose-response information from Chernobyl shows a marked increase in risk of thyroid cancer in children with exposures of 5 cGy or greater (Astakhova et al., 1998; Ivanov et al., 1999; Kazakov et al., 1992). Among children born more than nine months after the accident in areas traversed by the radioactive plume, the incidence of thyroid cancer has not exceeded preaccident rates, consistent with the short half-life of ¹³¹I.

The use of KI in Poland after the Chernobyl accident provides us with useful information regarding its safety and tolerability in the general population. Approximately 10.5 million children under age 16 and 7 million adults received at least one dose of KI. Of note, among newborns receiving single doses of 15 mg KI, 0.37 percent (12 of 3214) showed transient increases in TSH (thyroid stimulating hormone) and decreases in FT4 (free thyroxine). The side

effects among adults and children were generally mild and not clinically significant. Side effects included gastrointestinal distress, which was reported more frequently in children (up to 2 percent, felt to be due to bad taste of SSKI solution) and rash (~1 percent in children and adults). Two allergic reactions were observed in adults with known iodine sensitivity (Nauclon and Wolff 1993).

Thus, the studies following the Chernobyl accident support the etiologic role of relatively small doses of radioiodine in the dramatic increase in thyroid cancer among exposed children. Furthermore, it appears that the increased risk occurs with a relatively short latency. Finally, the Polish experience supports the use of KI as a safe and effective means by which to protect against thyroid cancer caused by internal thyroid irradiation from inhalation of contaminated air or ingestion of contaminated food and drink when exposure cannot be prevented by evacuation, sheltering, or food and milk control.

IV. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A. Use of KI in Radiation Emergencies: Rationale, Effectiveness, Safety

For the reasons discussed above, the Chernobyl data provide the most reliable information available to date on the relationship between internal thyroid radioactive dose and cancer risk. They suggest that the risk of thyroid cancer is inversely related to age, and that, especially in young children, it may accrue at very low levels of radioiodine exposure. We have relied on the Chernobyl data to formulate our specific recommendations below.

The effectiveness of KI as a specific blocker of thyroid radioiodine uptake is well established (H' in LA, et al., 1972) as are the doses necessary for blocking uptake. As such, it is reasonable to conclude that KI will likewise be effective in reducing the risk of thyroid cancer in individuals or populations at risk for inhalation or ingestion of radioiodines.

Short-term administration of KI at thyroid blocking doses is safe and, in general, more so in children than adults. The risks of stable iodine administration include sialadenitis (an inflammation of the salivary gland, of which no cases were reported in Poland among users after the Chernobyl accident), gastrointestinal disturbances, allergic reactions and minor rashes. In addition, persons with known iodine sensitivity should avoid KI, as should individuals with dermatitis herpetiformis and hypocomplementemic vasculitis, extremely rare conditions associated with an increased risk of iodine hypersensitivity.

Thyroidal side effects of stable iodine include iodine-induced thyrotoxicosis, which is more common in older people and in iodine deficient areas but usually requires repeated doses of stable iodine. In addition, iodide goiter and hypothyroidism are potential side effects more common in iodine sufficient areas, but they require chronic high doses of stable iodine (Rubery 1990). In light of the preceding, individuals with multinodular goiter, Graves' disease, and autoimmune thyroiditis should be treated with caution, especially if dosing extends beyond a few days. The vast majority of such individuals will be adults.

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The transient hypothyroidism observed in 0.37 percent (12 of 3214) of neonates treated with KI in Poland after Chernobyl has been without reported sequelae to date. There is no question that the benefits of KI treatment to reduce the risk of thyroid cancer outweigh the risks of such treatment in neonates. Nevertheless, in light of the potential consequences of even transient hypothyroidism for intellectual development, we recommend that neonates (within the first month of life) treated with KI be monitored for this effect by measurement of TSH (and FT4, if indicated) and that thyroid hormone therapy be instituted in cases in which hypothyroidism develops (Bongers-Schokking 2000; Fisher 2000; Calaciura 1995).

B. KI Use in Radiation Emergencies: Treatment Recommendations

After careful review of the data from Chernobyl relating estimated thyroid radiation dose and cancer risk in exposed children, FDA is revising its recommendation for administration of KI based on age, predicted thyroid exposure, and pregnancy and lactation status (see Table).

The protective effect of KI lasts approximately 24 hours. For optimal prophylaxis, KI should therefore be dosed daily, until a risk of significant exposure to radioiodines by either inhalation or ingestion no longer exists. Individuals intolerant of KI at protective doses, and neonates, pregnant and lactating women (in whom repeat administration of KI raises particular safety issues, see below) should be given priority with regard to other protective measures (i.e., sheltering, evacuation, and control of the food supply).

Note that adults over 40 need take KI only in the case of a projected large internal radiation dose to the thyroid (>500 cGy) to prevent hypothyroidism.

These recommendations are meant to provide states and local authorities as well as other agencies with the best current guidance on safe and effective use of KI to reduce thyroidal radioiodine exposure and thus the risk of thyroid cancer. FDA recognizes that, in the event of an emergency, some or all of the specific dosing recommendations may be very difficult to carry

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out given their complexity and the logistics of implementation of a program of KI distribution. The recommendations should therefore be interpreted with flexibility as necessary to allow optimally effective and safe dosing given the exigencies of any particular emergency situation. In this context, we offer the following critical general guidance: *across populations at risk for radioiodine exposure, the overall benefits of KI far exceed the risks of overdosing, especially in children, though we continue to emphasize particular attention to dose in infants.*

These FDA recommendations differ from those put forward in the World Health Organization (WHO) 1999 guidelines for iodine prophylaxis in two ways. WHO recommends a 130-mg dose of KI for adults and adolescents (over 12 years). For the sake of logistical simplicity in the dispensing and administration of KI to children, FDA recommends a 65-mg dose as standard for all school-age children while allowing for the adult dose (130 mg, 2 X 65 mg tablets) in adolescents approaching adult size. The other difference lies in the threshold for predicted exposure of those up to 18 years of age and of pregnant or lactating women that should trigger KI prophylaxis. WHO recommends a threshold of 1 cGy for these two groups. As stated earlier, FDA has concluded from the Chernobyl data that the most reliable evidence supports a significant increase in the risk of childhood thyroid cancer at exposures of 5 cGy or greater.

The downward KI dose adjustment by age group, based on body size considerations, adheres to the principle of minimum effective dose. The recommended standard dose of KI for all school-age children is the same (65 mg). However, adolescents approaching adult size (i.e., >70 kg) should receive the full adult dose (130 mg) for maximal block of thyroid radioiodine uptake. Neonates ideally should receive the lowest dose (16 mg) of KI. Repeat dosing of KI should be avoided in the neonate to minimize the risk of hypothyroidism during that critical phase of brain development (Bongers-Schokking 2000; Cataliura et al., 1995). KI from tablets (either whole or fractions) or as fresh saturated KI solution may be diluted in milk, formula, or water and the appropriate volume administered to babies. As stated above, we recommend that neonates (within the first month of life) treated with KI be monitored for the potential development of hypothyroidism by measurement of TSH (and FT4, if indicated) and that thyroid hormone therapy be instituted in cases in which hypothyroidism develops (Bongers-Schokking 2000; Fisher 2000; Cataliura et al., 1995).

Pregnant women should be given KI for their own protection and for that of the fetus, as iodine (whether stable or radioactive) readily crosses the placenta. However, because of the risk of blocking fetal thyroid function with excess stable iodine, repeat dosing with KI of pregnant women should be avoided. Lactating females should be administered KI for their own protection, as for other young adults, and potentially to reduce the radioiodine content of the breast milk, but not as a means to deliver KI to infants, who should get their KI directly. As for direct administration of KI, stable iodine as a component of breast milk may also pose a risk of hypothyroidism in nursing neonates. Therefore, repeat dosing with KI should be avoided in the lactating mother, except during continuing severe contamination. If repeat dosing of the mother is necessary, the nursing neonate should be monitored as recommended above.

**V. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN PROPHYLAXIS AGAINST THYROID
RADIOIODINE EXPOSURE**

Certain principles should guide emergency planning and implementation of KI prophylaxis in the event of a radiation emergency. After the Chernobyl accident, across the affected populations, thyroid radiation exposures occurred largely due to consumption of contaminated fresh cow's milk (this contamination was the result of milk cows grazing on fields affected by radioactive fallout) and to a much lesser extent by consumption of contaminated vegetables. In this or similar accidents, for those residing in the immediate area of the accident or otherwise directly exposed to the radioactive plume, inhalation of radioiodines may be a significant contributor to individual and population exposures. As a practical matter, it may not be possible to assess the risk of thyroid exposure from inhaled radioiodines at the time of the emergency. The risk depends on factors such as the magnitude and rate of the radioiodine release, wind direction and other atmospheric conditions, and thus may affect people both near to and far from the accident site.

For optimal protection against inhaled radioiodines, KI should be administered before or immediately coincident with passage of the radioactive cloud, though KI may still have a substantial protective effect even if taken 3 or 4 hours after exposure. Furthermore, if the release of radioiodines into the atmosphere is protracted, then, of course, even delayed administration may reap benefits by reducing, if incompletely, the total radiation dose to the thyroid.

Prevention of thyroid uptake of ingested radioiodines, once the plume has passed and radiation protection measures (including KI) are in place, is best accomplished by food control measures and not by repeated administration of KI. Because of radioactive decay, grain products and canned milk or vegetables from sources affected by radioactive fallout, if stored for weeks to months after production, pose no radiation risk. Thus, late KI prophylaxis at the time of consumption is not required.

As time is of the essence in optimal prophylaxis with KI, timely administration to the public is a critical consideration in planning the emergency response to a radiation accident and requires a ready supply of KI. State and local governments choosing to incorporate KI into their emergency response plans may consider the option of redistribution of KI to those individuals who do not have a medical condition precluding its use.

VI. SUMMARY

FDA maintains that KI is a safe and effective means by which to prevent radioiodine uptake by the thyroid gland, under certain specified conditions of use, and thereby obviate the risk of thyroid cancer in the event of a radiation emergency. Based upon review of the literature, we have proposed lower radioactive exposure thresholds for KI prophylaxis as well as lower doses of KI for neonates, infants, and children than we recommended in 1982. As in our 1982 notice in the *Federal Register*, FDA continues to recommend that radiation emergency response plans include provisions, in the event of a radiation emergency, for informing the public about the magnitude of the radiation hazard, about the manner of use of KI and its potential benefits and

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risks, and for medical contact, reporting, and assistance systems. FDA also emphasizes that emergency response plans and any systems for ensuring availability of KI to the public should recognize the critical importance of KI administration in advance of exposure to radioiodine. As in the past, FDA continues to work in an ongoing fashion with manufacturers of KI to ensure that high-quality, safe, and effective KI products are available for purchase by consumers as well as by state and local governments wishing to establish stores for emergency distribution.

KI provides protection only for the thyroid from radioiodines. It has no impact on the uptake by the body of other radioactive materials and provides no protection against external irradiation of any kind. FDA emphasizes that the use of KI should be as an adjunct to evacuation (if not always feasible), sheltering, and control of foodstuffs.

**Exhibit 4
Questions and Answers on Guidance:
Potassium Iodide as a Thyroid Blocking
Agent in Radiation Emergencies**

Why would I be offered KI?

As a resident inspector, a regional inspector, or a site team member, you may be offered potassium iodide (KI) while responding to an emergency. It will be offered only when exposure to radioactive iodine is possible. The purpose of KI is to saturate your thyroid gland with stable iodine to prevent absorption of radioactive iodine you may inhale or ingest.

When is KI use recommended?

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is responsible for guidance on the use of KI. The attached guidance was recently issued by FDA based on lessons learned from the 1986 Chernobyl reactor accident. The guidance is summarized in the following table:

In children and young adults (18 - 40 years old), the primary concern is the prevention of thyroid cancer. In adults over 40 years old, the primary concern is the prevention of hypothyroidism (deficient activity in the thyroid gland). It takes a very large radiation dose to impact thyroid function (≥ 500 cGy³).

FDA recommends that pregnant women be given KI to protect themselves and their fetuses; however, repeated dosing should be avoided because excess iodine could block fetal thyroid function. Nursing mothers should take KI for their own protection, but not their infants who should get their KI directly. As with fetuses, repeated dosing of newborn infants (0 - 1 month) should be avoided.

Why isn't thyroid cancer the primary concern for older adults?

According to experts at the FDA Center for Drug Evaluation and Research, the thyroid gland in children is more sensitive to radioactive iodine. The marked increase in thyroid cancer after the Chernobyl accident occurred in children less than 4 years of age at the time of the accident. Adults are relatively insensitive to the cancer risks of low doses of radioactive iodine. Also, on a population basis, the risk of adverse reactions to KI increases with age. Therefore, KI is not recommended for older adults unless the potential radiation dose is so high (500 cGy or more) that it could damage the thyroid gland, which would result in a lifelong requirement for thyroid hormone replacement.

Who will provide the KI?

NRC will provide KI to each resident inspector office. In addition, each regional office maintains a supply of KI for site teams dispatched during an emergency. KI is typically provided as tablets and instructions will be included similar to other medications. We do not plan to stock KI at Headquarters. The Site Team typically includes regional staff only. If Headquarters staff are requested, they will obtain their KI from the region leading the Site Team.

Who at NRC determines when KI is recommended?

The NRC Regional Administrator, in consultation with the Headquarters Executive Team, will determine when to recommend KI to resident inspectors and site team members. In

determining whether to recommend KI, managers will utilize the best available information from licensees and other response organizations to assess the total projected exposure to the individuals consistent with maintaining exposures as low as reasonably achievable and commensurate with the importance of the particular activity to the NRC mission. In doing this, overall exposure control such as available engineering controls, respiratory protection, stay times and evacuation of the area will be considered along with use of KI. In the absence of a recommendation to use KI, employee requests for KI during an emergency will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

How effective is KI?

The effectiveness of KI in blocking the uptake of radioactive iodine by the thyroid is well established. The protective effect of KI lasts for 24 hours. For optimal protection against inhaled radioactive iodine, KI should be used before or immediately coincident with exposure to a radioactive cloud, though KI may still have a substantial protective effect even if taken 3 or 4 hours after exposure. If a release is protracted, even a delayed use may help reduce the radiation dose to the thyroid. KI should be taken daily until the risk of significant exposure to radioactive iodine no longer exists. Once radioactive iodine is concentrated in your thyroid, KI is not effective at removing it.

Are there any side effects?

Adverse reactions are uncommon, but they are possible. The risks of stable iodine include sialadenitis (an inflammation of the salivary gland), gastrointestinal disturbances, allergic reactions, and minor rashes. Thyroidal side effects of stable iodine include iodine-induced thyrotoxicosis, which is more common in older people but usually requires repeated doses of stable iodine. In addition, iodide goiter and hypothyroidism are potential side effects, but they require chronic high doses of stable iodine also.

The use of KI is voluntary and you have the right to decline it. You are encouraged to consult with your personal physician or the NRC Health Center (301-415-8400) if you have questions about your personal situation.

You should decline the KI if any of the following statements apply to you:

1. Your thyroid gland has been removed.
2. You are sensitive to iodine, or allergic to iodine [for example, you have experienced an adverse reaction after eating seafood, shellfish, or iodized salt; after applying topical iodine (e.g., tincture of iodine, povidone-iodine, betadine, and iodophore solutions) to a cut or injury; or after a medical diagnostic procedure involving the use of iodinated contrast material that you were told was likely a reaction to iodine].
3. You have dermatitis herpetiformis, or hypocomplementemic vasculitis.⁴

You should use caution in taking KI if you have any of the following conditions, especially if dosing extends beyond a few days:

1. You have multinodular goiter.
2. You have Graves' disease.
3. You have autoimmune thyroiditis.

Proper Use Memorandum (PUM)

What is Domestic Imagery?

Domestic Imagery is defined as any imagery to include ONIR collected from classified national reconnaissance platforms covering the 50 United States, the District of Columbia, and territories and possessions of the United States to a 12-nautical-mile seaward limit of the land areas.

What is a Proper Use Memorandum and when must it be used?

A Proper Use Memorandum (PUM) is a memorandum signed annually by an organization's Certifying Government Official. The Imagery user organization will submit this Proper Use Memorandum (PUM) annually that defines their requirements, intended use, and contains a proper use statement which acknowledges their awareness of the legal and policy restrictions regarding domestic imagery.

Are PUMs classified or unclassified?

At a minimum, a PUM is classified as UNCLASSIFIED//FOUO. However, a domestic image or imagery product derived from classified national assets are classified as SECRET//NOFORN.

Who is authorized to initiate a PUM?

Any DoD/IC agency, command, or service may initiate a PUM. For civilian agency use, the Civil Application Committee (CAC) is the focal point for the submission of a PUM. Law Enforcement agencies must submit a PUM for imagery support to National Special Security Events (NSSE).

How is a PUM initiated?

Submit a PUM to the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) Office of International Affairs & Policy (OIP) outlining the specific collection, processing, dissemination, exploitation, briefing, or publication requirement for the domestic imagery.

What should a PUM include?

An agency or organization must insure the PUM includes:

- A paragraph which identifies the intended use of the imagery/data, requestors' mission to include the end-user if the request is being placed by one organization on behalf of another, and the intended application of the requested imagery.
- A paragraph that defines the area of collection (including the type of property ownership—federal, state, local or private). Additionally, the requestor needs to identify whether their requirement can be satisfied by historical imagery or requires a new collection. * It is the responsibility of the requestor—not OIP—to determine if the request is for old or new imagery.
- A paragraph that outlines the planned distribution of the domestic imagery—i.e., the organizations that will receive, exploit, and distribute the domestic imagery.
- A paragraph that certifies that the collection and use of any requested information, materials, and imagery derived from classified overhead systems is in support of Congressionally-approved programs and not in violation of applicable laws. Additionally, the request must certify that the imagery is not for the purpose of targeting any specific US person nor is it inconsistent with Constitutional and other legal rights of US persons.
- Most importantly, a PUM must be signed by a certified government official from the requesting organization.

Proper Use Memorandum (PUM)

What is the PUM process for approval?

PUMs are simultaneously received by NGA Office of International Affairs & Policy (OIP). OIP conducts a policy review and coordinates with the NGA Office of General Counsel (OGC) for the legal review prior to approval of all PUMs. Once OGC reviews and approves, OIP will provide final approval and forward a scanned copy of the approved PUM to NGA/Source Operations and Management Directorate (S) and the requesting organization.

Who approves PUMs?

The Director of National Intelligence (DNI) has delegated authority to the Director of NGA (D/NGA) for the administration of Intelligence Oversight as applied to domestic imagery, commonly referred to as the PUM process. NGA/OIP on behalf of the D/NGA is the program manager for all federal government requests for classified domestic imagery. NGA/OIP in coordination with NGA/OGC will conduct a policy and legal review of the PUM, upon concurrence with OGC, OIP will provide the final approval.

How long does the PUM approval process take under normal conditions? Under crisis conditions?

Normal time-frame PUM 3 - 5 days once formally submitted

Crisis time-frame PUM 3 - 4 hours

How do I know if a PUM has been approved?

NGA OIP will notify requestors of PUM status via email.

With whom can I share a PUM approved image?

Domestic images can be shared with cleared personnel with a valid need to know. The PUM must specify with whom the images or products are to be shared. If they are not identified in the original PUM, then an amendment must be submitted to add recipients of the image to the PUM.

Who cannot see or receive a PUM product?

Domestic images cannot be shared with foreign nationals, and non-cleared or non-approved individuals. Any exception to this must be coordinated through NGA/OIP.

Are PUMs required for unclassified commercial domestic imagery?

All NGA components must have a valid PUM to collect or exploit domestic imagery from any source (e.g. commercial, airborne, etc.). All archived commercial satellite imagery posted in the WARP-UNIL is accessible to any Federal/DoD user. Each organization is responsible for ensuring the use of that archived imagery is in accordance with intelligence oversight, release policy, and licensing. With regard to new tasking for commercial domestic imagery, if NGA funds are used to acquire the imagery a PUM is required. If NGA funds are not required for new tasking, a PUM is not required. For further guidance contact NGA/OIP.

Who do I contact for assistance with PUMs?

How to Submit a Proper Use Memorandum (PUM) for Unclassified Domestic Imagery

Consistent with E.O. 12333, all intelligence agencies are subject to a Proper Use Memorandum (PUM), if tasking collection of the United States is required.

Mandatory use of PUM applies to imagery collected over the U.S, to include:

- new commercial imagery collection
- imagery ordered from commercial vendor archives
- imagery ordered/retrieved from an NGA commercial imagery library (e.g., Commercial Satellite Imagery Library (CSIL), Unclassified National Information Library (UNIL) and National Information Library (NIL)).

1) Create the PUM by using the “**NGA Instruction for Requesting Unclassified Domestic Imagery**” (NI 89404r3.pdf): <http://org.nga.ic.gov/crs/policy/index.html>

Minimally, the PUM must contain the following three items:

- **Requesting Organization and Requesting POC**
- **Statement of “Intended Use of Data”** (category of use—Natural Disasters; Counter Intelligence and Security and related vulnerability assessments; Environmental Studies; Exercise, Training, Testing, or navigational purposes; Systems Testing, Engineering, Research and Development)
- **Proper Use Statement** (include the following paragraph verbatim):

“I certify that the intended collection and use of the requested information, materials, and imagery derived from classified/unclassified overhead systems is in support of congressionally approved programs of (the agency) and not in violation of applicable laws, including statutory authority of (the agency). The request for imagery is not for the purpose of targeting any specific United States (U.S.) person, nor is it inconsistent with the constitutional and other legal rights of U.S. persons. Applicable security regulations and guidelines and other restrictions will be followed.”

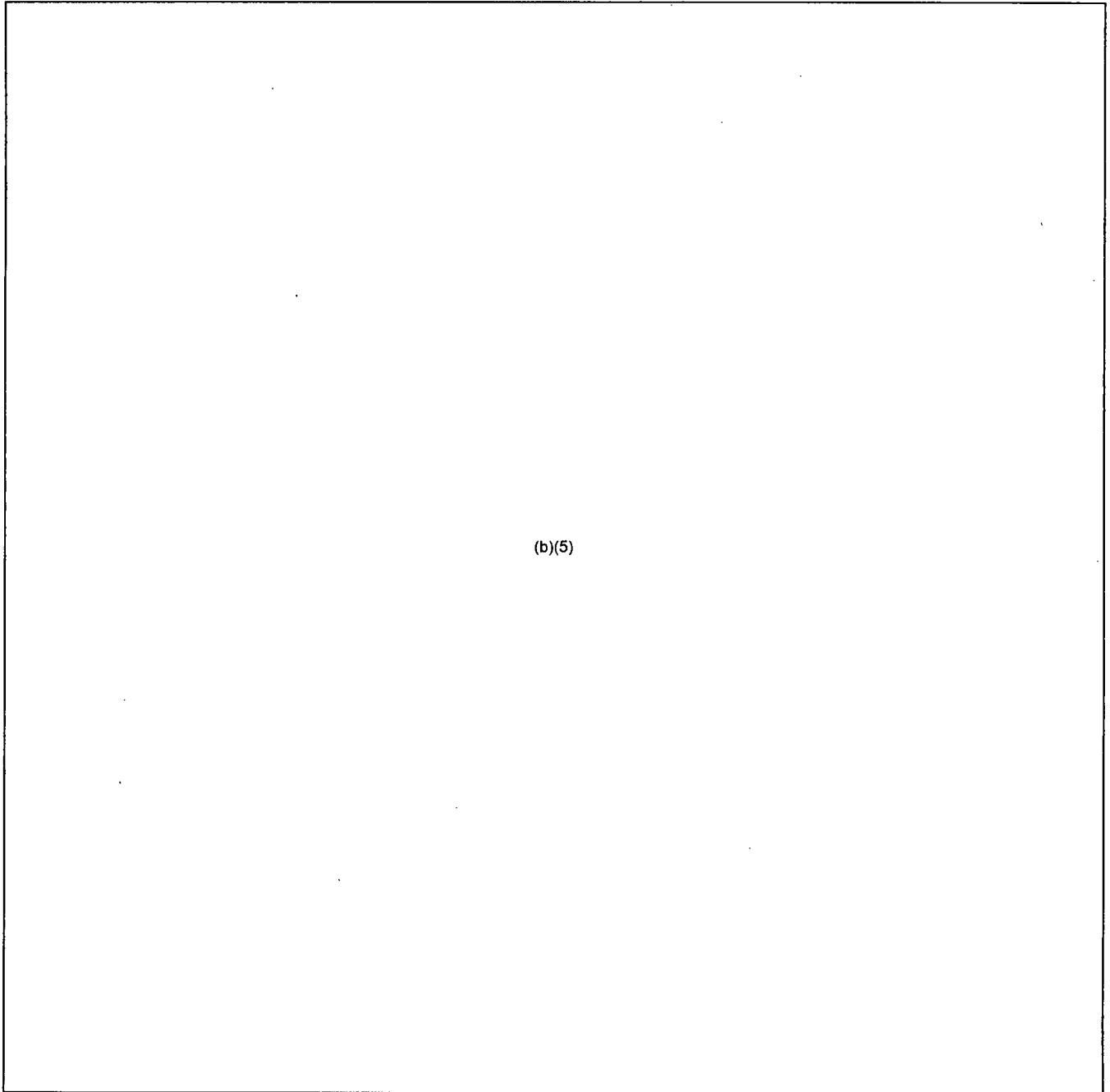

Public health fears were raised after traces of radioactive iodine were found in Tokyo's tap water Saturday and Japanese authorities stopped food sales in areas around the Fukushima nuclear plant. Government sources told Kyodo News that radioactive iodine reached the water supply of the country's capital home to 36 million people -- in the wake of the emergency at the quake-hit Fukushima No. 1 power plant. Abnormal levels of radioactive iodine were found in the water supply in the central prefectures of Gunma, Tochigi, Saitama, Chiba and Niigata, an official at Japan's science ministry told AFP. But levels were far below Japan's legal limit, added the official, who did not want to be named. A 5.9 magnitude earthquake rattled Japan's Ibaraki Prefecture south of the stricken Fukushima No 1 nuclear plant late last night, the US Geological Survey said, but no tsunami warning was issued.

Tokyo Electric Power Company is battling to cool a reactor to prevent another explosion at its nuclear power plant in quake-hit Fukushima Prefecture. The utility firm said on Monday afternoon that fuel rods are exposed at the Number Two reactor of its Fukushima Number One plant after the level of coolant water dropped. At around 6pm, the power company began pumping in seawater. But it says all fuel rods in the reactor could be exposed. The firm says a core meltdown might have occurred.

Earlier in the day, the firm told the government that the reactor had lost all cooling capability due to a failure of the emergency power system. Since then, the company has tried to circulate the coolant by steam instead of electricity. But attempts to lower the temperature inside the reactor chamber have not worked well. The company is also considering opening a hole in the reactor housing building to release hydrogen generated by the exposed fuel rods. Accumulated hydrogen has caused blasts at two other reactors at the plant.

FEMA AND FEDERAL PARTNERS SUPPORT STATES, TERRITORIES IN TSUNAMI RESPONSE

WASHINGTON -The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and its federal partners are closely monitoring the effects of the earthquake and subsequent tsunami that struck Japan early this morning and stand ready to support state and local response operations if needed. The Pacific Tsunami Warning Center has issued Tsunami Warnings and Watches for a number of countries, including parts of U.S. territories in the Pacific as well as coastal areas along California, Oregon, Washington and Alaska.

"At the President's direction, FEMA is leaning forward to assist our state and territory partners," said FEMA Administrator Craig Fugate. "As I often say, FEMA is not the team, FEMA is just part of the team, a team that includes the entire federal family, state, local and tribal officials, the faith-based and non-profit communities, the private sector and most importantly the public. Right now, individuals living in the affected areas need to take precautions and to continue to heed the information and warnings coming from their state and local officials."

Earlier this morning, Department of Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano and FEMA Administrator Craig Fugate briefed President Obama on the Department's ongoing coordination activities with potentially affected states and territories.

Under the direction of the President, FEMA is in close coordination with state and local officials, through regional offices in Oakland, California and Bothell, Washington, and the pacific area office in Honolulu, Hawaii. In addition, FEMA has commodities, such as water, meals, blankets and cots, prepositioned in Hawaii, Guam, and the Bay area of California should a request be made.

There have been no requests for federal assistance from U.S. states or territories at this time, however, FEMA and federal partners stand ready to provide support if a request is made by a Governor. The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) remains the lead federal agency when it comes to responding to international disasters.

Additional information on the coordination efforts can be found below:

- The **U.S. Coast Guard** rescue crews are making preparations throughout the main Hawaiian Islands to provide post-tsunami support following any potential impacts. In addition, crews in California are conducting assessment operations, and monitoring shorelines for potential impacts.
- The **Department of Defense** has positioned National Guard personnel in county emergency operation centers in Hawaii, additional aircraft and personnel have been placed on standby if needed.
- The **U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)** is deploying a Disaster Medical Assistance Team of more than 35 healthcare professionals and an Incident Response Coordination Team to Travis Air Force Base in California, as well as caches of medical equipment and supplies. From the Air Force base, the teams and equipment can deploy quickly wherever they are needed if requested by states or territories in the region or by the government of Japan.
- The **HHS Administration on Aging** is monitoring the situation through its state, tribal and local Agencies on Aging, in impacted areas, to ensure safety of older adults in potentially impacted areas.
- The **U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC)** is closely monitoring conditions near the Diablo Canyon Power Plant, located near San Luis Obispo, CA. The NRC is working closely with its resident inspectors who are on site to ensure safe operating.
- The **National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration** and its Pacific Tsunami Warning Center are monitoring conditions and issuing warnings and advisory updates as available.
- The **U.S. Department of State** has a call center established for Americans seeking information about family members in Japan. The number is 1-888-407-4747.

While tsunami watches and warning remain in effect, we urge the public to listen to the instructions of state and local officials, and if told to evacuate - evacuate. We urge everyone in the regions who could be impacted to listen to a NOAA Weather Radio and their local news to monitor for updates and directions provided by their local officials.

FEMA's mission is to support our citizens and first responders to ensure that as a nation we work together to build, sustain, and improve our capability to prepare for, protect against, respond to, recover from, and mitigate all hazards.

Dear George, Julio, Ray, and Mike,

As I discussed by phone with each of you today, due to the events in Japan, DIRS intends to issue a TI for follow-up on domestic plants. It is based (heavily based) on the INPO Event Report – Level 1 that was issued on Tuesday. Here are the highlights:

- It reviews licensee verification of INPO recommendations
- The main focus of the inspection is to assess the licensee's verification, not perform an independent inspection.
- It references applicable NRC inspection guidance when possible (please add on as necessary).
- We have forwarded a copy to INPO to see if they have any objections with us following up on their recommendations.
- It recommends 40 hours per site and allows the regions to take credit for the baseline inspections if possible (I do expect a lot of feedback on the level of effort).
- The information gathered from this TI will be used to evaluate industry's readiness for a similar event and to aid in evaluating whether additional NRC regulatory actions are warranted.

Please coordinate the regional review and comment on it by COB Friday (March 18) and I will update the TI accordingly over the weekend. Washington (CNN) -- The State Department announced late Wednesday that it has approved the departure of family members of U.S. government personnel from certain areas of Japan in the aftermath of the earthquake, the tsunami and the nuclear power plant crisis.

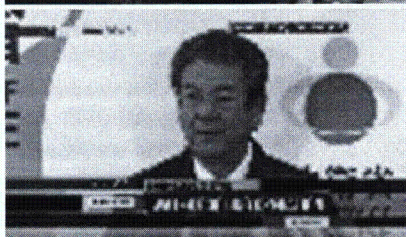
Americans are urged to postpone all travel to the affected areas, the U.S. said, hours after expanding the recommended evacuation zone around the nuclear plants to a radius of 50-miles.

The Japanese government has told people to evacuate to at least 20 kilometers (12 miles) away from the damaged reactors.

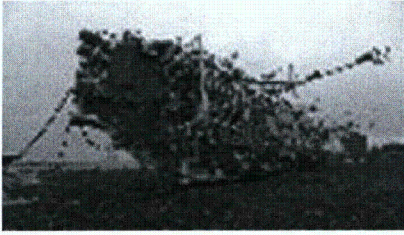
"The State Department has authorized the voluntary departure from Japan of eligible family members of U.S. government personnel assigned to the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo, the U.S. Consulate in Nagoya, and the Foreign Service Institute Field School in Yokohama," the announcement said.

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"U.S. citizens should defer all travel to the evacuation zone around Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant, areas affected by the earthquake and tsunami, and tourism and nonessential travel to the rest of Japan at this time," the announcement said.

The State Department said it's exploring ways to assist with the departure of American citizens, including the possibility of chartering aircraft.


And the Pentagon announced late Wednesday that it also would assist in the departure of dependents of its military and Defense Department personnel from crisis areas in Japan.

"U.S. forces remain in Japan and the U.S. has full capability to fulfill our alliance commitments to defend Japan and maintain peace and security in the region," a statement from Pentagon spokesman, Col. Dave Lapan said.

"The Department of Defense will implement the Dept of State-approved voluntary departure for eligible DoD dependents."

The U.S. military has about 43,000 family members in Japan, but it is unclear how many are in the affected areas, Lapan said.

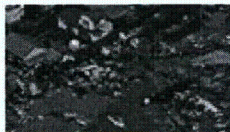

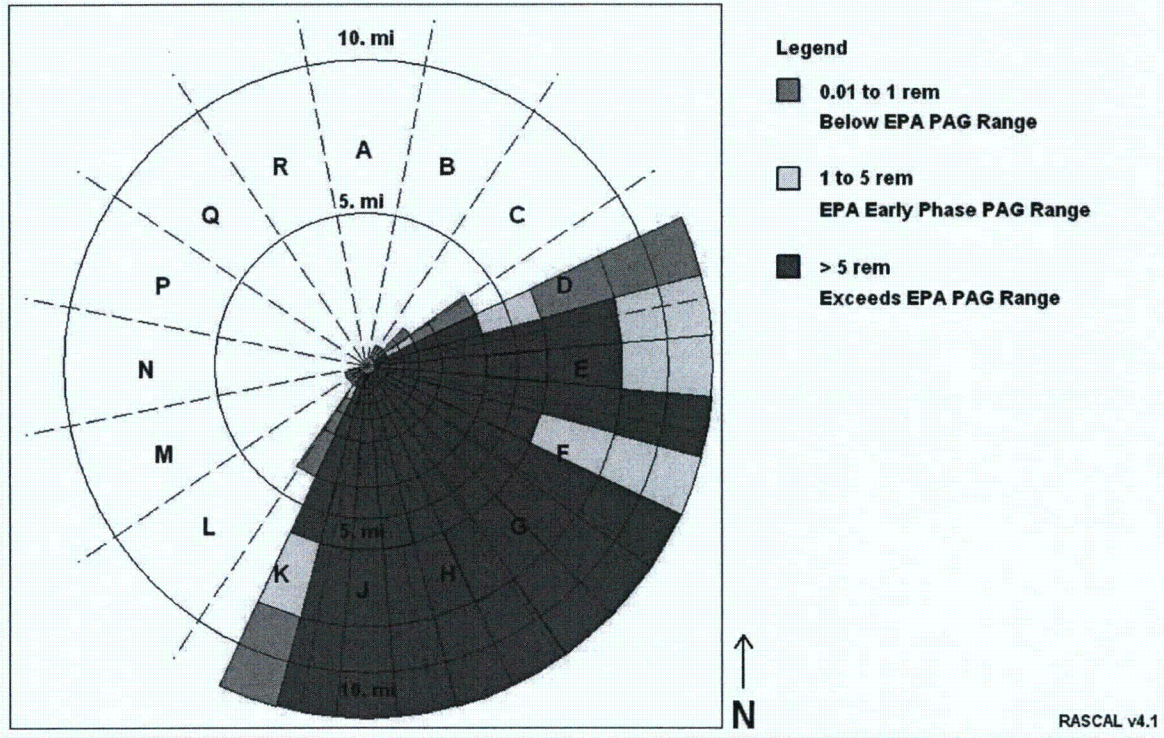

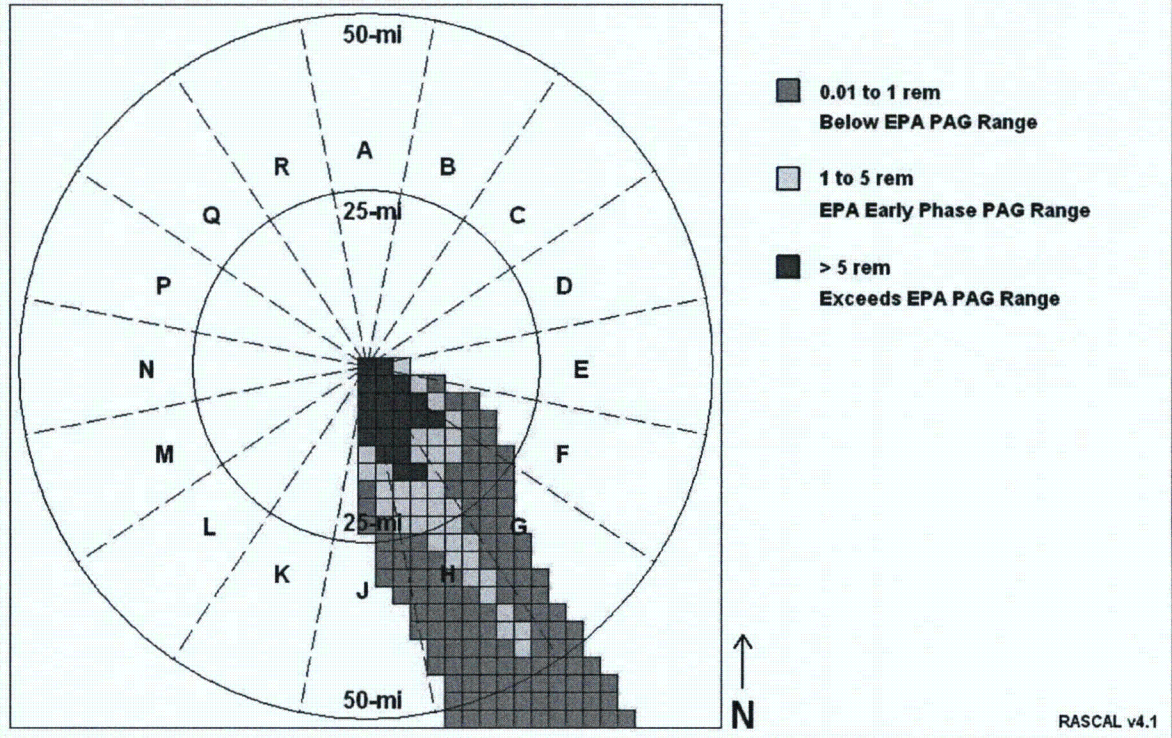

Not much new to report wrt Fukushima Daiichi as info flow is still patchy. Unit 1 status is same as at 3:30 call. Unit 2 seems ok but may need to vent containment at some point due to slowly increasing pressure as no containment cooling.

Unit 3 has had reports of possible core uncover since Pressure has dropped below high pressure injection setpoints and no low pressure cooling yet. But these are sketchy details at best.

There is a concurrent call at deputies level as different govt agencies are misconstruing the situation or getting conflicting info, so a need to get our govt aligned.

The german govt gave direction to its embassy to evacuate its citizens (with no basis it admitted) creating excitement with all the embassies including our own. In fact, Jim Trapp is en route to Japan to likely serve as nuclear expert to the embassy. Tony Ulses of RES is there now as part of a USAID team that we sent.

Talking points are being developed for RSLO use tomorrow for outreach to States. Also, Q and A associated with a US focus are currently with Chmn to be released tomorrow.

Chmn has encouraged white house to take a role in providing official govt spokesperson(s) so that the current ilk on

networks like CNN, etc, who are tossing out a lot of disinformation, can be negated.

Next call is at 0730 tomorrow which Sam Hansell as RDO will cover.

Borchardt provided update

- Still operating on limited information.
- Deputies Meeting at the White House with significant focus on the nuclear event.
- Two NRC staff dispatched: one USAID and other on commercial flight
- NRC is minding its role and allow the White House to carry the messages
- NRC has for objectives
 1. Continue monitoring to the situation best that we can, given limited information.
 2. Outreach to IAEA and proposing IAEA as the point of contact for Japan.
 3. Further development of NRC questions and answers (one set is associated with what we know about Japan – will need to be very factual and not speculate; second set of questions and answers will focus will be on the domestic industry. Expect the public/media focus to turn toward domestic in the next day or so.
 4. Interaction with DHS and federal agencies, including plume plot, possible exposure models, and monitoring on the west coast.
- FEMA has stood down and operating under normal weekend staffing.

New plant updates

- Most attention is on Unit 1
- Unit 2 appears to be shut down safely
- Tsunami interrupted diesel fuel flow or diesel cooling flow which was above ground.
- For some time, the core was uncovered and some fuel damage occurred.
- Believed that the explosion was either a steam explosion or hydrogen explosion.
- Seawater is being used in two ways. Borated seawater to inject into the reactor vessel and seawater to fill basement to cool the torus.
- Not getting indications of a degrading situation.

Noon today, the Executive Team held a conference call with the Office Directors and the Regional Administrators. Bill, Neil Sheehan and I participated in the call. (Bill/Neil, please add anything I missed or correct/clarify as needed). There will be a TA call at 3:30 pm.

- Limited information from our Japanese counterparts (need to be respectful of ongoing event response)
- Much information is second hand via IAEA, industry (via INPO/WANO), TEPCO website information

- NRC external communications will be via the HQs Liaison Team and OPA. Filter requests through the HOO.
- NRC remains in the monitoring mode.
- Chairman attended a meeting with White House. Marty Virgilio participated by VTC.
- Assistance offer to Japanese regulators, but do not currently need NRC support.
- US team deployed consisting of 60-70 people to assess the disaster (not limited to nuclear). NRC has supplied one team member who will be a technical consultant. A second staffed is trying to get on a flight to Japan to support the team and the US embassy.
- Parts of the industry mustering to offer industry support.
- GE is working with Exelon to run some simulator scenarios, Dresden unit most similar to the site.

Unconfirmed information about plants

- Eleven (11) reactor units in the area, but Fukushima Daiichi was hit the hardest. That site has six units. The concerns are currently focused on Units 1 and 2 (Unit 3 is in cold shutdown and the other three were in refueling).
- The Tsunami result is an extended loss of AC. Generators have been delivered to the site but no information that it is connected. Additional DC power has been to support operation of various valves and instruments.
- Fukushima Unit 1 explosion in the reactor building (metal siding taken off the of the reactor building).
- RCS and primary containment are both intact.
- Possible hydrogen detonation but no confirmation.
- Prior to this, venting of the primary containment which was successful in reducing pressure by half.
- Reactor water level was below top of active fuel
- Cs and Iodine detected outside facility indicating that core damage was likely
- Rad levels at the site boundary had been at 100 mrem/hr but now has decreased to 7 mrem per hour
- The licensee was filling containment with borated seawater
- Some workers injured at Unit 1 at the time of the video
- Unit 2 continuing to work through SBO, suppression pool at saturation temperature

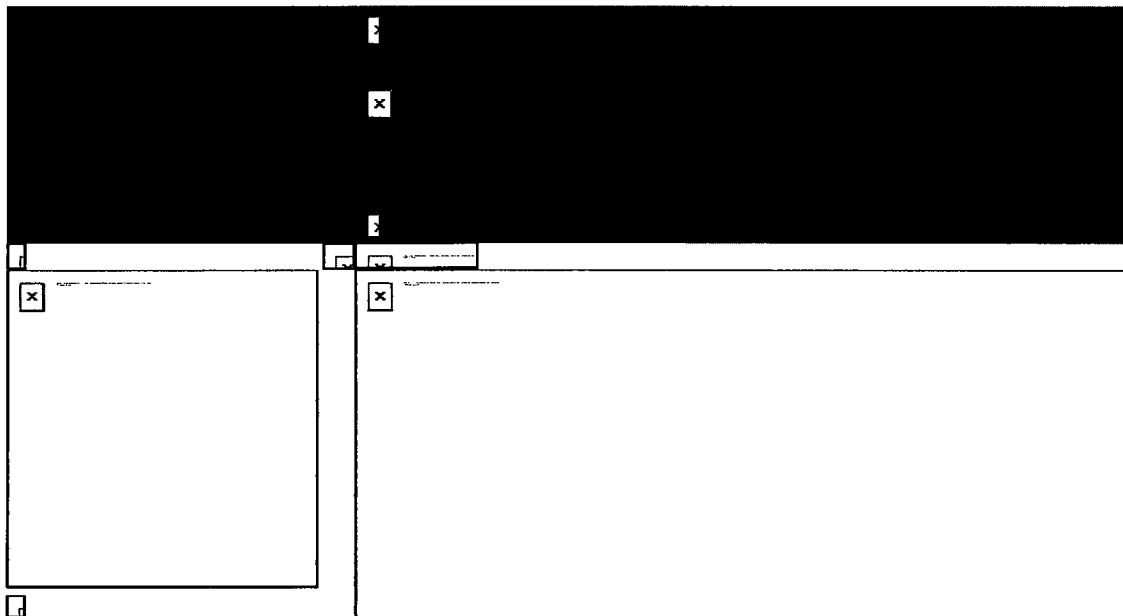

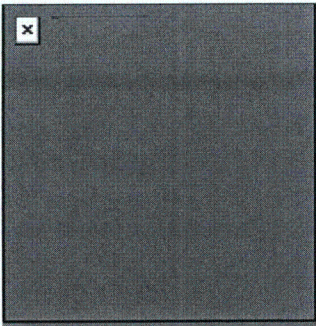

Washington (CNN) -- The State Department announced late Wednesday that it has approved the departure of family members of U.S. government personnel from certain areas of Japan in the aftermath of the earthquake, the tsunami and the nuclear power plant crisis.

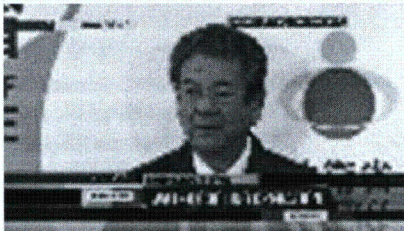
Americans are urged to postpone all travel to the affected areas, the U.S. said, hours after expanding the recommended evacuation zone around the nuclear plants to a radius of 50-miles.

The Japanese government has told people to evacuate to at least 20 kilometers (12 miles) away from the damaged reactors.

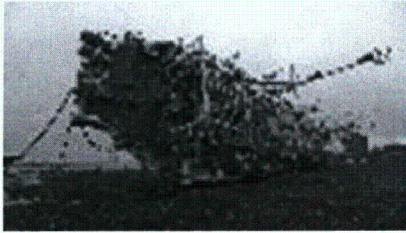
"The State Department has authorized the voluntary departure from Japan of eligible family members of U.S. government personnel assigned to the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo, the U.S. Consulate in Nagoya, and the Foreign Service Institute Field School in Yokohama," the announcement said.

"U.S. citizens should defer all travel to the evacuation zone around Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant, areas affected by the earthquake and tsunami, and tourism and nonessential travel to the rest of Japan at this time," the announcement said.

The State Department said it's exploring ways to assist with the departure of American citizens, including the possibility of chartering aircraft.


And the Pentagon announced late Wednesday that it also would assist in the departure of dependents of its military and Defense Department personnel from crisis areas in Japan.

"U.S. forces remain in Japan and the U.S. has full capability to fulfill our alliance commitments to defend Japan and maintain peace and security in the region," a statement from Pentagon spokesman, Col. Dave Lapan said.

"The Department of Defense will implement the Dept of State-approved voluntary departure for eligible DoD dependents."

The U.S. military has about 43,000 family members in Japan, but it is unclear how many are in the affected areas, Lapan said.
