SUBJECT: AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE U.S. NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION AND THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY RELATED TO THE GASEOUS DIFFUSION PLANTS

Dear Mr. Perkins:

This is in response to your letter dated October 10, 2014, regarding the conduct of activities relative to gaseous diffusion operations under the following agreements and memoranda of understanding (MOU) between the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC):

- 1. "Joint Statement of Understanding Between the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the Department of Energy on Implementing the Energy Policy Act Provisions on the Regulation of Gaseous Diffusion Uranium Enrichment Plants," dated December 1993;
- "Agreement Defining Security Responsibilities at the Paducah and Portsmouth Gaseous Diffusion Plants Between the Department of Energy's Office of Safeguards and Security and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Division of Security," dated March 1995;
- "Memorandum of Understanding Between the Department of Energy and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission - Cooperation Regarding the Gaseous Diffusion Plants," dated October 1997; and
- 4. "Joint Procedure Between the U.S. Department of Energy and the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Response to Emergencies in the Leased Areas at the Gaseous Diffusion Plants." dated February 2001.

The NRC staff has reviewed these documents and agrees that with the delease of the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant (PGDP) facilities by the United States Enrichment Corporation (USEC) on October 21, 2014, and the termination of USEC's Certificate of Compliance (CoC) for operation of the gaseous diffusion plants (GDPs) to be completed later this year, there will be no further NRC activities relative to the gaseous diffusion process and operations at the GDPs under the above-listed documents.

However, the NRC staff notes that all provisions within these documents relative to the NRC regulatory oversight of USEC's (now Centrus Energy Corp.'s) subsidiary American Centrifuge Operating, LLC (ACO), as the licensee for the American Centrifuge Lead Cascade (Lead Cascade) and the future commercial facility the American Centrifuge Plant (ACP) at the

Portsmouth GDP site in Piketon, Ohio, should remain in effect until the Lead Cascade and the ACP licenses are terminated by the NRC.

We would also like to take this opportunity to inform you that, as a result of the approval and issuance of the 2013 "Report to Congress on the Health, Safety, and Environmental Conditions at the Gaseous Diffusion Plants Located Near Paducah, Kentucky and Portsmouth, Ohio" in January 2014, the Commission directed the staff to provide a final summary report to Congress of NRC's oversight of the PGDP from October 1, 2013, through termination of the PGDP's CoC. Therefore, the NRC staff will be contacting DOE, as required by the Atomic Energy Act, to coordinate the preparation of this final report.
