Good morning Vika,

This Event Number 50587 at the Cook site is starting to disappoint me as I think more and more about it.

Did they know that an site-wide External Event disturbing the cooling water supply to the main condensers at both plants had arrived? If they did, do they pay for an Emergency Director 24 hours a day to decide on a response strategy, (such as reducing power at both units)? And, if they do, was a decision made to immediately reduce power at both plants, or wasn't a decision made?

Do their emergency power sources get cooling water from the Screen House forebay?

Was any of that secret b5b equipment pulled out and hooked up, just in case?

Was any of the very well-publicized FLEX equipment hooked up and ready to go?

At 3 ½ years after Fukushima, why should this event not worry me about the typical nuclear industry response to site-wide External Events?
