Dear Mr. Koehl:

On October 21, 2014, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission completed a security inspection at the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station. Nuclear Regulatory Commission inspectors discussed the results of this inspection with Mr. T. Frawley, Manager, Plant Protection and Emergency Response, and other members of your staff. The inspectors documented the results of this inspection in the enclosed inspection report.

Nuclear Regulatory Commission inspectors documented one finding of very low security significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of Nuclear Regulatory Commission requirements. Further, inspectors documented two licensee-identified violations which were determined to be of very low security significance in this report. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission is treating these violations as non-cited violations consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest the violations or the significance of these non-cited violations, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555-0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region IV; the Director, Office of Enforcement, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555-0001; and the NRC resident inspector at the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station.

If you disagree with a cross-cutting aspect assignment in this report, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your disagreement, to the Regional Administrator, Region IV, and the NRC resident inspector at the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station.
