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## Atomic Safety and Licensing Board to Take Public Comment, Hold Hearing Aug. 24 on Crow Butte Uranium Recovery Facility

A Nuclear Regulatory Commission Atomic Safety and Licensing Board will hold a hearing beginning Aug. 24 in Crawford, Neb., on challenges to the license renewal for Crow Butte Energy Resources Inc.'s uranium recovery facility near Crawford. The board is the independent body within the NRC that conducts adjudicatory hearings and renders decisions on legal challenges to licensing actions. The NRC renewed the facility license in 2014, with an expiration date of Nov. 5, 2024.

Evidence to be presented in the hearing will address nine contentions filed by several local residents and the Western Nebraska Resources Council, known as consolidated intervenors, and the Oglala Sioux Tribe. The board will hear arguments on four technical contentions and five related to the environmental review. The contentions challenge the adequacy of the evaluation and protection of historical resources at the site, and the NRC's analysis of the facility's impacts on surface water, groundwater, and the ecosystem.

The hearing will run 9:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Crawford Community Center, 1005 1<sup>st</sup> St., in Crawford, from Aug. 24 until all evidence has been heard. Members of the public and media are welcome to observe the evidentiary hearing, but participation will be limited to the parties, lawyers and witnesses. Those planning to attend should arrive at least 15 minutes early to allow time for security screening, including possible pat-downs and searches of hand-carried items such as briefcases or backpacks. No signs or weapons will be permitted in the building.

The board is also asking for written comments from interested members of the public. These statements are not testimony or evidence, but may aid the board and the parties in considering the issues in the hearing. Written statements should be submitted by Aug. 28.
