Dear Mr. Eck:

On July 30, 2015, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed a security baseline inspection at your Turkey Point Nuclear Station. The inspection covered one or more of the key attributes of the Security cornerstone of the NRC's Reactor Oversight Process. The enclosed inspection report (IR) documents the inspection results that were discussed on July 30, 2015, with Mr. Tom Summers, Site Vice President, and other members of your staff.

The inspection examined activities conducted under your license as they related to security and compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations, and with the conditions of your license. The inspectors reviewed selected procedures and records, observed activities, and interviewed personnel. Portions of this inspection were completed at your Corporate Support Facility during the week of July 13 – 16, 2015. The NRC inspectors documented one finding of very low safety-significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. The NRC is treating this violation as a non-cited violation (NCV), consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest this violation or significance of the NCV, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this IR with the basis of your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC 20555-0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region II; the Director, Office of Enforcement, United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555-0001; and the NRC Resident Inspector at the Turkey Point Nuclear Plant.

Enclosure transmitted herewith contain SUNSI. When separated from enclosure, this transmittal document is decontrolled.
