Dear Ms. McNamara:

It has come to my attention that you, and representatives from Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) headquarters in Washington D.C., recently briefed Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) staff, including Jeffrey Semancik, State Liaison Officer and Director of DEEP's Radiation Division, concerning three apparent violations occurring at Millstone Power Station in Waterford, Connecticut. In this briefing and in your letter (EA-13-188 dated April 29, 2015) to the licensee, Dominion Nuclear Connecticut (DNC), the NRC indicated that two of these apparent violations are being considered for escalated enforcement action based, in part, on the fact that DNC "failed to notify the [NRC] of information having significant implications for public health and safety."

Recognizing the authority of the NRC to regulate of nuclear power facilities, and in light of (1) the potential significant public health and safety implications of these recently revealed violations at DNC, (2) other recent regulatory performance issues at DNC highlighted by the NRC,¹ and (3) public inquiries to the state, I hereby formally request that NRC staff conduct a "government to government" meeting in Hartford, Connecticut to brief the Governor's Office and members of DEEP's Commissioner's Office in order to address our serious concerns related to the continued safe operation of Millstone.
