Commissioner Svinicki's Comments on COMSECY-16-0006 Revision to the Agency's Long-Term Research Program and Related Reporting to the Commission

I approve the staff's proposal to re-examine how long-term research at the NRC can be performed more effectively and efficiently. I note the staff's admission that in preparing SECY-16-0009, "Recommendations Resulting from the Integrated Prioritization and Re-Baselining of Agency Activities." the staff considered including the Long-Term Research Program (LTRP) as an item to be shed. However, after examining the annual status update of the LTRP projects. provided as an enclosure to this paper, I arrived at a similar conclusion to that of the staff. At bottom, the topic areas appear to have varying degrees of connection to the NRC's regulatory program of work, but in every case the LTRP projects appear to be planned and executed on a pace and in a manner disjointed from the associated work in the corresponding inspection and licensing programs. For example, the project entitled, "Strategic Approach for Obtaining Material and Component Aging Information from Decommissioning Nuclear Power Plants" is intended to result in data to "support the evaluation of aging management programs for potential subsequent license renewal applications," but the project itself - which develops only a roadmap for the collection of such data - does not end until FY 2017. This timing does not appear to align with the agency's planned completion of updated guidance on this topic (a draft of which is already released for public comment) or the receipt of a possible first subsequent license renewal application in 2018. Clearly, a relook at this and the other LTRP projects is needed.

The staff's reassessment of the LTRP should begin with a review of past LTRP projects, to include an assessment of the practical effects of the results of past projects on the regulatory framework and the role and impact of these past projects on regulatory outcomes. If the staff recommends continuing the LTRP, the staff should also develop objective measures of efficiency for LTRP projects and establish methods to tie interim milestones and schedules more directly to user needs in the licensing and oversight programs. In examining the value of the LTRP, the staff should examine similarities and overlap between the LTRP and the generic issues program, including an assessment of how integration between the two programs could be beneficial and whether the two programs could be blended to accomplish the objectives of both in a more efficient manner.

At the time of Commission action on COMDEK-06-001, the agency was facing the prospect of a national nuclear renaissance and the need for a strong anticipatory research program at the NRC was more readily apparent. I appreciate the staff's recognition that circumstances are clearly different ten years later. In light of this, a fundamental reconsideration of the LTRP is appropriate at this time.
