On October 14, 2016, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed a security inspection at the Cooper Nuclear Station and the NRC inspector discussed the results of this inspection with you and other members of your staff. The inspector documented the results of this inspection in the enclosed inspection report.

The NRC inspectors documented one finding of very low security significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. The NRC is treating this violation as a non-cited violation consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest the violation or significance of the non-cited violation, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC, 20555-0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region IV; the Director, Office of Enforcement; Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response; and the NRC resident inspector at the Cooper Nuclear Station.

If you disagree with a cross-cutting aspect assignment in this report, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your disagreement, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk,

A cross-cutting aspect was assigned to the finding in the area of human performance. Specifically, Cooper Nuclear Station failed to ensure individuals used a consistent, systematic approach to make decisions on equipment required to be considered target set components, and failed to ensure risk insights were incorporated as appropriate [H.13].
