On March 2, 2017, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed a security inspection at your Seabrook Station and the NRC inspectors discussed the inspection results with Mr. Eric McCartney, Site Vice-President, and other members of your staff. The results of this inspection are documented in the enclosed report.

The NRC inspectors documented one finding of very low security significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. The NRC is treating this violation as non-cited violation (NCV) consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest this violation or the significance, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC 20555-0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region I; the Director, Office of Enforcement, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555 0001; the Director, Office of Security and Incident Response; and the NRC resident inspector at the Seabrook Station.

One cross-cutting aspect was assigned to a finding in the area of Human Performance, Avoid Complacency. Specifically, Seabrook Station personnel did not recognize and plan for the possibility of mistakes, even while expecting successful outcomes, and ensure individuals implement appropriate error reduction tools [H.12]. If you disagree with the cross-cutting aspect assignment in this report, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your disagreement, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC 20555-0001; the Regional Administrator, Region I; and the NRC resident inspector at the Seabrook Station.
