On February 1, 2018, contract number 31310018D0004 was awarded to CGI Federal, Inc., in Fairfax, VA. The purpose of this contract is to provide CGI Momentum software licenses, hosting, operations and maintenance, and help desk support for the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) financial system – Financial Accounting and Integrated Management Information System. The period of performance of this contract is from February 1, 2018, through January 31, 2023, with no option periods. The total potential value over the life of the contract is \$31,225,760.

Regulatory Improvements for Power Reactors Transitioning to Decommissioning:

Regulatory Analysis; Availability; Parts 20, 26, 50, 51, 52, 72, 73 and 140 of Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations (Regulation Identifier Number 3150-AJ59; NRC-2015-0070)

On February 7, 2018, the NRC published in the *Federal Register* (83 FR 5373) a regulatory analysis to support the regulatory basis for a rulemaking to amend the NRC's regulations for the decommissioning of nuclear power reactors. This regulatory analysis is based on receipt of public comments for the preliminary draft regulatory analysis, which was issued in the *Federal Register* on May 9, 2017. The NRC is making the regulatory analysis available for public information. The regulatory analysis was available February 7, 2018.

Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) Items of Interest February 9, 2018

Teleconference on Key Challenges in Crediting FLEX in Regulatory Applications

On February 6, 2018, the staff held a Category 2 public teleconference with the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI), the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI), and a number of utilities to discuss the status of key challenges in crediting FLEX in regulatory applications. During the meeting, industry representatives and staff from NEI, EPRI, the office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, and the Office of Nuclear Regulatory Research discussed progress made in two key challenge areas (staff's need to access operational experience of FLEX equipment and the need to refine Human Reliability Analysis methods to address unique characteristics of some FLEX actions). At the conclusion, the staff and industry representatives reached alignment on their respective next steps and opportunities for future engagement on these key challenges.
