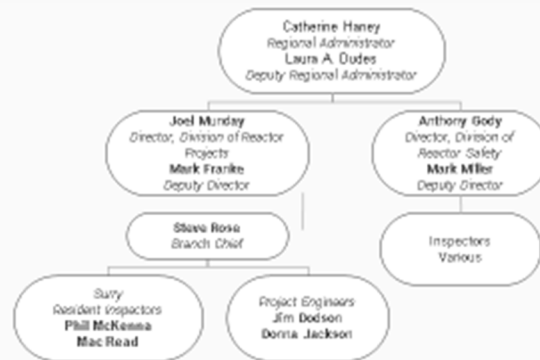


Meeting's Purpose

- Public forum to address Surry Power Station, Units 1 and 2 performance in 2017
- Provide an overview on NRC inspection activities
- NRC Resident Inspectors and Representatives are available for individual discussion; questions and answers



Region II Organization



Resident Inspector Program

- Inspectors live in the community and work at Surry Power Station, Units 1 and 2
- Provide daily coverage and oversight of plant activity



Resident Inspector Program

- Daily visits to Control Room and meetings with plant managers
- Prioritize inspections based on important plant activity



Resident Inspector Program

- Observe emergency exercises and provide support for any real emergencies or urgent issues



Resident Inspector Program

- Support NRC allegation process for plant employees and the public
- Routinely discuss safety concerns with plant management and operators



NRC Inspection Activities in 2017

- 5104 hours of inspection and related activities
- 2 resident inspectors on site
- 38 regional inspectors
- 4 major team inspections: Biennial Problem Identification and Resolution, Triennial Design Basis Assurance, Triennial Heat Sink, and Emergency Planning Exercise
- Unit 2 outage inspections, Initial License Exams, and TI-191 Inspection of Mitigating Strategies and Fuel Pool Instrumentation Orders



NRC Annual Assessment Summary Surry Power Station, Units 1 and 2

- Surry Power Station, Units 1 and 2 operated safely and in a manner that preserved the public health and safety and protected the environment
- All inspection findings identified were of very low safety significance (Green)



Surry Power Station, Units 1 and 2 PIs and Findings

- All Green Performance Indicators
- 6 Green Non-Cited Violation (NCV) inspection findings
- No White inspection findings
- No Yellow inspection findings
- No Red inspection findings
