

AFFIDAVIT OF FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

I [Signature] under the commandments of the Christian faith do solemnly testify to the following conditions of financial hardship under the protection of the United States of America Nuclear Regulatory Commission subpoena identified with the listed DOCKET NO. (s) 50-498 and 50-499 in behalf of John A. Corder re. the "SECRET Agreement" obtained by Bechtel from the United States Department of Labor Administrative Law Judge pursuant to Case No. 88-ERA-9, CORDER vs. BECHTEL, whereas:

I am not employed at this time

I have only received wages for approximately four (4) weeks since November in the year of 1986

My State of Texas Unemployment Compensation is defunct

I have seriously damaged my household financial condition to date, because of expenses related to my efforts trying to identify and correct errors at the South Texas Nuclear Project

The economic recession has continued to critically deteriorate my remaining funds daily

Including myself, I am the head of the household for my family of three (3)

My United States Department of Labor case is being investigated due to judicial error

I am not receiving any financial support from others

I have no long term solution to my financial status because the company termination prematurely stopped my income/career

I have always performed my duties and responsibilities as a loyal employee and United States citizen and now, due to my financial hardship, I pray that the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission shall expeditiously provide me the funds necessary for the investigation and correction of the errors at the South Texas Nuclear Project. Further, for just and reasonable cause I pray that the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission will modify the subpoena for me and my attorney(s) as the need arises, so that we may all conclude the matter of plant safety.
