Gentlemen:

This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. Devlin of this office on March 18-19, 1974 at Three Mile Island of activities authorized by AEC License No. SNM-1313 and to the discussions of our findings held by Mr. Devlin with Messrs. Herbein, Thomas, Reppert, Rice, Levin and Von Eschen of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The area examined during this inspection included a review of the physical protection program as outlined in your Industrial Security Plan for the Three Mile Island Nuclear Station submitted by you as Revision 3, dated February 12, 1973 and Revision 4, dated January 7, 1974. Within this area, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures, observations of the various new security equipment and interviews with plant personnel.

During this inspection it was found that certain provisions of the security prógram were incomplete or were found to be different from the approved proposals set forth in the Industrial Security Plan, Revision 3 and Revision 4. The items and references to the pertinent requirements are listed in the enclosure to this letter. This letter constitutes a notice sent to you pursuant to the provisions of Section 2.201 of the AEC's "Rules of Practice", Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations. Section 2.201 requires you to submit to this office within 20 days of your receipt of this notice, a written statement of explanation in reply, including: (1) steps which have been or will be taken by you to correct the violation, and the results achieved; (2) steps which will be taken to avoid further violations; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved.

In accordance with Section 2.790(d) of the AEC's "Rules of Practice", Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, documentation of findings of your control and accounting procedures for safeguarding special nuclear materials and your facility security procedures are exempt from disclosure; therefore, the enclosure to this letter, the inspection report, and your response to this letter will not be

This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. Partlow of this office on March 20-21, 1974 at Three Mile Island I of activities authorized by AEC License No. SNM-1313 and to the discussions of our findings held by Mr. Partlow with Mr. Herbein of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The area examined during this inspection was limited to an initial review of the program for control of special nuclear material. Within this area, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector.

Within the scope of this inspection, no violations or program weaknesses were observed.
