Access authorization to the protected area was suspended until he had an Employee Assistance Program evaluation and an evaluation as it related to access authorization by Baltimore Gas and Electric Company's psychologist and Employee Assistance Counselor. He is attending an inpatient treatment and education program, and will have weekly follow-up appointments with the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company psychologist, and will be placed in an accelerated testing program that mirrors the follow-up testing for individuals with a second drug positive in 10 CFR 26.27(b)(4).

The individual is cooperating with all aspects of the treatment plan. His access will remain suspended until certification of completion of initial treatment.
