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# Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) Items of Interest Week Ending SEPTEMBER 25, 2020

## <u>Staff Hosted Public Meeting Regarding Comments Received on Draft Guidance on</u> Volcanic Hazards Assessment for Proposed Nuclear Power Reactor Sites

On September 22, 2020, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) held a public meeting with representatives from the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI) (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML20265A360), to discuss comments received on Draft Guide 4028, "Volcanic Hazards Assessment for Proposed Nuclear Power Reactor Sites" (ADAMS Accession No. ML20213A749). The staff will consider the feedback and comments from this meeting as they revise the draft guide. The staff is also considering additional public interactions before finalizing and issuing the regulatory guide.

# <u>Staff Issued Memorandum Regarding Status of Inspections, Tests, Analyses, and Acceptance Criteria at Vogtle Electric Generating Plant, Unit 3</u>

On September 24, 2020, the NRC staff issued a memorandum to the Commission (ADAMS Accession No. ML20183A090) describing activities related to Vogtle Electric Generating Plant, Unit 3 closure of inspections, tests, analyses, and acceptance criteria (ITAAC), inspections related to ITAAC and operational programs, current licensing activities, and any possible impact these activities might have on the timing of the staff's finding under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* 52.103(g) that all ITAAC acceptance criteria are met. The licensee cannot operate the facility until this finding has been made.

## <u>Staff Hosted Public Meeting Regarding Regulatory Improvements to Support the Licensing of Advanced Reactors</u>

On September 24, 2020, the staff held a public meeting with representatives from the NEI (ADAMS Accession No. ML20258A181) to discuss comments on draft Branch Technical Position (BTP) 7-19, Revision 8, regarding guidance for evaluating potential common cause failures in digital safety systems (ADAMS Accession No. ML20237F570). NEI's comments (ADAMS Accession No. ML20262H182) were provided following the staff's public meeting with the NRC's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards Digital Instrumentation and Controls Subcommittee on September 8, 2020 (ADAMS Accession No. ML20237F497). The staff plans to finalize BTP 7-19 in preparation for the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards Full Committee meeting in November, and to submit BTP 7-19, Revision 8 to The Office of Management and Budget for clearance in December.

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# <u>Staff Approved Licensing Requests for Regulatory Relief Related to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency</u>

The NRC staff has reviewed and approved several licensing requests seeking temporary flexibilities to maintain the safe and secure operation of the U.S. nuclear fleet during the pandemic. A summary of approved licensing actions provided during this reporting period are summarized below. # Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards (NMSS) Items of Interest Week Ending SEPTEMBER 25, 2020

<u>List of Approved Spent Fuel Storage Casks: NAC International, Inc. MAGNASTOR®</u>
<u>Storage System, Certificate of Compliance No. 1031, Amendment No. 9: Direct Final Rule; Part 72 of Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations (Regulatory Identifier Number 3250-AK50; NRC-2020-0166)</u>

On September 22, 2020, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) published a notice in the *Federal Register* (85 FR 59396) amending its spent fuel storage regulations by revising the NAC International, Inc. MAGNASTOR® Storage System listing within the "List of approved spent fuel storage casks" to include Amendment No. 9 to Certificate of Compliance No. 1031. The companion proposed rule was also published in the *Federal Register* on September 22, 2020, (85 FR 59447). This direct final rule is effective December 7, 2020.

### NMSS Grants Exemption to the Certification Board of Nuclear Cardiology

On September 17, 2020, NMSS granted a temporary exemption (ML20252A174) to the Certification Board of Nuclear Cardiology. The exemption provides relief from the NRC recognized medical specialty board work experience requirement in 10 CFR 35.290(c)(1)(ii)(G). The exemption is related to COVID-19. The staff determined that the exemption is authorized by law, will not endanger life or property or the common defense and security, and is otherwise in the public interest.

### NMSS Staff make Presentation to National Academies of Sciences

On September 22, 2020, NMSS staff made a presentation to the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine committee that has been tasked to study: (1) the merits and viability of different nuclear fuel cycles and technology options and (2) the waste aspects of advanced nuclear reactors. Staff's presentation included an overview of the NRC's regulatory framework for the fresh and spent fuel portions of the nuclear fuel cycle, fuel cycle licensing and oversight experience, and the preparatory activities for the advanced reactor fuel cycle. The staff addressed questions from the committee on disposal, material control and accounting, and the staff's communications and engagement with industry and agency counterparts.

#### NMSS Staff Participate in Workshop on Uranium Recovery Facilities

On September 22 through 24, 2020, staff from NMSS, Region IV, U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), and five Agreement States (Colorado, Texas, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming) participated in a workshop to discuss the Completion Review Report (CRR) process for the termination of Agreement State uranium recovery facilities. The workshop included presentations by each Agreement State, DOE, and NMSS. NMSS staff presented on their current CRR activities and on the proposed revision to SA-900, "Termination of Uranium Milling Licenses in Agreement States." In addition, the NRC staff also discussed their streamlined review process for new uranium recovery applications.
