CHAIR HANSON: Good morning. Before we begin today's meeting with the Advisory Committee on the Medical Uses of Isotopes, I call to order a Commission affirmation session. Joining me are the other currently serving members of the Commission, including Commissioner Crowell who is participating remotely.

Madam Secretary, I believe we have one item for the Commission to affirm today. Would you please lead us through?

CARRIE M. SAFFORD: Yes, Chair. Today's item is SECY-24-0010 – Motion to Quash Subpoena in Missouri State Emergency Management Agency Investigation.

The Commission is being asked to act on a Memorandum and Order addressing a motion submitted by the Missouri Department of Public Safety (DPS) to quash or modify a subpoena issued by the NRC's Office of Investigations. DPS raises various objections to the subpoena's requests, including that they are overbroad, overly burdensome, not relevant, not within the NRC's regulatory authority, and barred from disclosure under Missouri law

The Commission has voted to approve a Memorandum and Order that denies DPS's motion to quash or modify the subpoena. Would you please affirm your votes after I call your name?
