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Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) Items of Interest Week Ending February 27, 2009

Monthly National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 805 Frequently Asked Questions Meeting

On February 19, 2009, the staff participated in a monthly NFPA 805 Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) Meeting (Category 2) with representatives from Nuclear Energy Institute NFPA 805 Task Force, other stakeholders, and the public, to discuss the FAQs related to the adoption of NFPA 805. The staff began holding these monthly public meetings in July 2006, and expects to continue holding them throughout the transition period to the new licensing basis.

<u>Public Meetings to Solicit Comments on the Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact</u>
Statement (DSEIS) for the License Renewal of Three Mile Island Nuclear Station, Unit 1 (TMI-1)

On February 24, 2009, the staff conducted two meetings in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, to solicit comments from the public on the DSEIS, regarding the TMI-1 license renewal review. The Draft Supplement 37, issued December 2, 2008, is a site-specific supplement to the Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants (NUREG-1437). Approximately 50 people attended the meetings, including members of the public and representatives of the NRC staff, Exelon Generation Company, LLC, State environmental agencies, local citizen organizations, and local news media. Public comments and questions focused on spent fuel storage and disposal, radiation health, design basis accidents and aircraft impacts, climate change, water use, plant refurbishment, and environmental justice.

As part of the public outreach effort the staff held an open house for one hour prior to the start of each meeting. The open house provided members of the public with an opportunity to talk informally with NRC staff and view informational displays and brochures.

The public comment period ends on March 4, 2009. At the conclusion of the comment period, the staff will evaluate the comments received and revise the DSEIS if appropriate. The final supplemental environmental impact statement is scheduled to be published in July, 2009.

<u>Public Availability of NUREG-1814, Revision 2 "Status of Decommissioning Program – 2008 Annual Report"</u>

On February 25, 2009, NUREG-1814, Revision 2, "Status of Decommissioning Program – 2008 Annual Report," became available to the public via the NRC public website. The report provides a comprehensive overview of the NRC's decommissioning program. The report provides a stand-alone reference document that describes the decommissioning process and summarizes the current status of all decommissioning activities, including the decommissioning of complex decommissioning sites, commercial reactors, research and test reactors, uranium mill tailings facilities, and fuel cycle facilities.

Meeting with the Center for Chemical Process Safety (CCPS) of the American Institute for Chemical Engineers (AIChE) on Data Collection for Human Reliability Analysis (HRA)

On February 20, 2009, staff met with AIChE/CCPS at the NRC Church Street building to exchange information about the potential collaboration on HRA data collection and exchange. The CCPS is interested in using NRC's Human Event Repository and Analysis system for its member plants to report the human performance information of their events to support the CCPS' efforts on quantitative risk assessment. The information that CCPS staff gathered will be reported back to CCPS board members for further decisions.

Protection of Safeguards Information; Correction (10 CFR Part 30, RIN 3150-AH57)

On February 20, 2009, the NRC published a document (74 FR 7785) in the *Federal Register* that corrected the final rule amending the regulations for the protection of Safeguards Information. The amendment was necessary to correct a situation where amendatory instructions in two separate actions affecting the same provision would have resulted in codified text being removed unintentionally.
