Joint FEMA/NRC Partnership

- NRC is responsible for regulating Nuclear Power Plant (onsite) emergency preparedness
- FEMA is responsible for providing guidance and ensuring emergency preparedness of offsite response organizations
- FEMA and NRC maintain a strong rulemaking and guidance partnership ensuring maximum alignment between agencies during the planning, development, and implementation of enhanced radiological emergency preparedness efforts.



Process and Timeline

- Initial Phase: FEMA's proposed offsite guidance was closely coordinated with the NRC's rulemaking – from the drafting all the way to collection of public comments and organization of public meetings.
- Current and Future Phases: FEMA and the NRC continue to collaborate on cross-cutting issues including joint adjudication of public comments, timelines, policy alignment, final publication, and long-term implementation plans.




Summary of Proposed FEMA Guidance

In strong partnership and alignment with the NRC's rulemaking, FEMA published the following proposed guidance for public comment (Regulations.gov Docket #: FEMA-2008-0022):

 Criteria for Preparation and Evaluation of Radiological Emergency Response Plans and Preparedness in Support of Nuclear Power Plants




Proposed REP Program Manual



- Consolidated Implementation Guidance: Provide comprehensive FEMA policy and interpretation of regulations and guidance based on 44 CFR 350 and NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, Rev. 1
- Alignment with National Preparedness Initiatives: Satisfy the need for aligning REP with the National Incident Management System (NIMS), National Response Framework (NRF), and Homeland Security Exercise Evaluation Program (HSEEP)
- Enhance REP Exercise Activities: Ensure more challenging drills and exercises to enhance exercise activities
 - Alignment with NRC's Regulations: Align FEMA guidance with NRC regulations in 10 CFR Part 50 and NRC's proposed rulemaking activities



Proposed Supplement 4



Provides additional guidance for:

- Hostile Action Based Events: Preparing for and responding to hostile action-based (HAB) events at Nuclear Power Plants
- National Preparedness Initiatives: Aligning with NIMS, NRF, and HSEEP
- Enhanced Exercise Activities: Enhancing scenario realism, ensuring challenging exercises, and reducing negative training
- Alert & Notification: Ensuring backup means for Alert & Notification System





Representative Themes from Inputs

- NUREG 0654 Should be updated before RPM
- Integration of on and off site security and emergency response plans
- The need to require utilities to adopt and implement NIMS
- HSEEP integration
- Incorporation of Hostile Action Based scenarios
- Requirement for secondary back-up alert and warning systems
- A second opportunity for review and comment (RPM)
- Request for more active participation (by S/L) in process

- Continued Coordination with NRC on Cross-cutting Issues
- States have identified a desire to have a second review of the RPM and Supplement 4 after the adjudication and before the document is finalized
